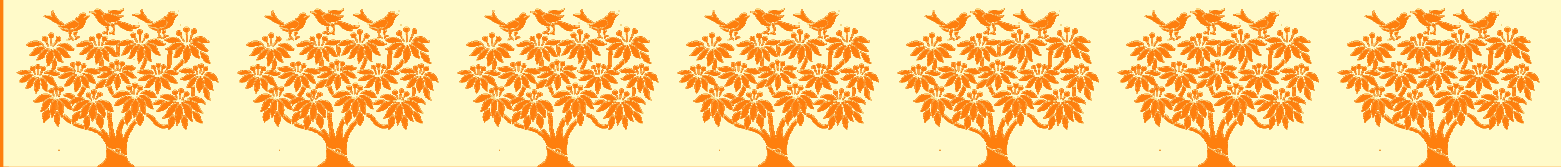

Introduction



National Bal Bhavan, is an autonomous body under the Department of Elementary Education and Literacy, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India. This institution is a non-formal education center for children between the age group of 5 to 16 years. It was established in 1956, keeping in mind the dream of unmasking learning through the thinking, imagination, creative and entertaining activities for the children, the foundation was laid by the first Prime Minister

of India. Bal Bhavan has taken the form of a movement with 142 affiliated Bal Bhavans and Bal Kendras across the country. Apart from this, a rural Jawahar Bal Bhavan in Mandi village, Delhi and other 49 Bal kendras are also working in Delhi. National Bal Bhavan provides children with different activities and opportunities in accordance with their age, efficiency and strength, to develop children's creativity and skill. This institution provides children a stress free and fear free environment with a great scope of possibilities. National Bal Bhavan and its affiliated institutions run regular programs for children especially for the lower strata of society.

The objective of this organization is to develop the child's creative ability by working on a common platform through various activities, opportunities, deliberations and experiences. Bal Bhavan provides an opportunity to every child and the freedom to fabricate innovative creations by learning through play way method, furthermore it helps to develop their creative potential through activities like dance, drama, music, creative arts, photography, computer etc. National Bal Bhavan, has emerged as a centre where children get their overall personality development at one place through various activities as well as strengthening the spirit of unity.

Every year thousands of children become members of National Bal Bhavan. The institute has started working in 1956 with meager 300 member children but over the years it has increased its membership strength and now lakhs of children are taking advantages of its various facilities. To reach the children of different areas, 49 Bal Kendras were established in many areas of Delhi State. These Bal Kendras fulfill the needs of all the children coming from different strata of society. Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi is a rural unit of National Bal Bhavan, which is working under NBB and provides parallel services to the rural population of surrounding villages. State Bal Bhavans and Bal Kendras have been opened in all parts of the country and remote tribal areas and they are providing similar services everywhere.

Among all activities of NBB, Bal Shree honour is one of the very prestigious scheme to identify and nurture creative children. This scheme was initiated in the year 1995 and further revised in the year 2015. Since its inception it is honouring creative children under four main streams i.e. Creative Arts, Creative Scientific Innovation, Creative Performance and Creative Writing and up to 31st March 2019, total 745 creative children from across the country have been selected for Bal Shree Honour.

Our Vision

To provide opportunities that ignite curiosity and celebrate possibilities through immersive dynamic experiences in visual arts, scientific activities and physical activities. To foster values that mold self confidence, holistic and responsible citizen of the world.





Objectives

The objectives of National Bal Bhavan are :

To inculcate faith, self-reliance, sovereignty and moral values among children and make our Nation strong and prosperous. Likewise, providing opportunities for developing creativity among them through creative art, creative writing, creative performing arts, physical education, scientific experiments, photography, and housekeeping via informal education system. Workshops, training programmes are conducted to attain this very philosophy and search talent of children and nurturing them for the purpose.

1. To provide opportunities to children for education and creativity.
2. To provide the children with experiences and activities not otherwise available to them.
3. To offer certain educational services to the local schools in order to enrich their curricular and extracurricular activities.
4. To provide leadership and guidance to teachers towards fostering a creative approach in teaching of art and science.
5. To provide training facilities for recreational workers, and Children's Museum personnel.
6. To offer the Nation a prototype comprehensive children's institution, i.e. to establish an Ideal Bal Bhavan.
7. To develop personality and talents of children through recreation and physical activities.
8. To promote social and cultural contacts amongst the children of all classes and communities.
9. To inculcate such values as would help to develop modern Indian personality with a scientific temper.
10. To promote the above mentioned activities as a movement.

Membership Profile 2018-19

Children take Annual Membership of National Bal Bhavan, Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi and 49 Bal kendras affiliated with National Bal Bhavan. This year 5177 children (including 1453 free membership, 56 online membership) obtained membership of National Bal Bhavan and 1028 children at Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi and 8427 children at 49 Bal Kendras running in Delhi.

National Bal Bhavan aims for creative development of children in all areas. Children are free to participate in various activities of National Bal Bhavan and these activities have been planned/ designed to ensure overall development of children and enhance their skill and creativity.

Activities at a Glance

CREATIVE ART

Creative Art activities are aimed to provide an opportunity to children for their self expression and development of aesthetic sensitivity of children and also to encourage the talent hidden in their personality. These are various activities in creative art, which have been divided under sub-heads which are as follows:-

Integrated Activities

Integrated Activities Section attracts children of all age groups. Children especially of small age group generally take interest in Traditional Arts. Being a multimedia section, children can easily shift from one medium to other media. Creative and value-based games are also developed in this section. Traditional Folk Art created with sticks (instead of brush) and use of natural colours is an added attraction of this section. Children also learn to make toys with papier machie and do paper craft in this section. This section creates awareness about Mehndi art, Warli, Madhubani etc.



Painting



Children in this section express their creativity by drawing and painting with crayons, Water colours, Oil colours, pencil and Charcoal. This activity is equally popular with senior children as well as younger ones. Younger children make drawings as per their imagination whereas senior ones enjoy drawing portraits, sketches, natural scenery and do theme based drawings. Children are also taught Batik, Tie and Dye, Block printing techniques.

Handicraft

Activities in this section are special as children make objects with waste materials such as old newspapers, old magazines, card board boxes, used boxes, bulbs, buttons, embossed papers, thermocol, clippings, seeds, wire, leaves, scrap of trees etc. Children are free to make objects with the help of these items. Creation of beautiful art work & products with waste materials depict the imagination and creativity of children.





Weaving

Weaving activity is an activity where children learn making various artistic items such as wall hangings, Lamp shades, Tapestry, scenery etc. through techniques of weaving. They are motivated to create beautiful objects. They learn different types of knots and weaving patterns and make mats, sceneries and small carpets of their own.



Needle Craft



Toy making, puppet making, macrame, crochet work etc are attractions of stitching & embroidery section. Children learn basics of cutting and stitching of clothes and also different type of designing, patch work and creative embroidery. Toy making with cotton fill is also a popular activity of this section. Children learn making wall hangings, different types of stitches which help in developing creativity among children.

Clay Work

Activities in this section are helpful in establishing co-ordination between mind, heart and hands in children. Here children learn making animals, human faces and shapes, sceneries and designs with the help of mould by using paper mache, plaster of Paris and clay. This section provides an opportunity to involve children by using new innovative and creative ideas while giving shape to clay. Potter's Wheel is also used at times for children to learn pottery.



Book Binding



Activities in binding section are also very popular, as children learn how to keep their books safe, and beautiful. In addition they learn technique of binding and making beautiful objects with cardboard, which includes cutting card board, painting, joining etc. Children are also taught how to prepare other items such as candle stand, pen stand, small diary, file covers and many other items.

Woodcraft

Children are acquainted with different techniques used while making various wooden objects. Children also learn how to examine the durability of a particular wood for making various items from wood. Children are also acquainted with making mural through wood cutting on wooden frames and creating drawings with saw-dust is also taught. Children also learn making pen stand, pen holder, small box, toys, pot cover etc. They are also taught to carve wood and making beautiful object from it. They also learn art of making beautiful things from wood dust.



SCIENCE ACTIVITIES

Aim of Science Education is to develop “Scientific” attitude among the children. Science Section is not merely a subject of class laboratory but a part of biggest laboratory that is nature through which children enhance their knowledge about day to day happenings and linking them with scientific principles. National Bal Bhavan believes in adopting various interesting activities for making children understand the basic principles of science. An important aspect of science teaching system of National Bal Bhavan is “Integrated approach” in which other activities becomes an integral part of learning. This section is having different Sub-sections which help children to learn Scientific laws and principles. The children are also taught Physics and Natural Science along with use of science in everyday life. Activities in this section include Radio Electronics, Aero-Modelling, Machine Modelling, Astronomy, Computers, Aquarium and Animal Corner, How and Why club and Environment. All activities section use practical approach to generate interest in science and life related issues.

For children taking part in science activities, it is not necessary for them to have science as a subject in their syllabus, what is important here is that they must have curiosity and desire for learning “Why” and “How”. Film shows and camps are also organized by this section from time to time.

Science section has following sub sections :

Physical & Natural Sciences (How and Why Club)

Children opt for projects under this section, and satiate their curiosity of “How” and “Why” exponentiation through this club. Making creative scientific models, Educational Tour, Science Quizzes etc are some of the activities which invariably enhance knowledge of children and encourage them to learn something new. The workshops are also conducted. Children are also provided laboratory equipments for experiments and scientific games etc.



Inventors Club

Children are encouraged to conduct experiments and learn innovative techniques in this section. As they learn the concept of Machine Modelling and thereafter Designing it, thereby understanding different aspects connected with their project. Children understand how machines are designed using cardboard as base material.

Radio and Electronics club

Children from 10 to 16 years of age are given membership of Radio & Electronics club. Basic Principles of Electronics, wiring, repair of domestic equipment, new experiments in circuits, radio, connecting T.V. parts are various activities undertaken by this club. Children are imparted training in Digital projects, new source of energy such as solar energy models etc. More and more children are having membership of “HAM Radio Club”. Keeping in view of ever rising means of developed communication, Ham Amateurs club has also been launched in National Bal Bhavan for Radio listeners





to enable member children to establish “HAM Station” at their home and establish contact with their dear ones.

Aero Modelling

An expensive hobby such as Aero Modelling is made accessible and easy by National Bal Bhavan to its member children. Children learn the basic principles of wind power and making models of different aircrafts. In addition, they enjoy flying models made by them. Main aim of this activity is to acquaint children with Aviation and related Science and develop interest in this discipline. Children also try experimenting with various designs of aeroplanes, parachutes etc to understand the flying mechanics. Model rocketry workshops are also organised by this section.



Computer



Computer is a very popular activity which attracts children in large number. Children learn basics of computer language and also learn to do programming. Children are provided with software along with computer games. This activity is supplementary to their school education. Internet knowledge is also given by National Bal Bhavan to the children so that they may be well versed with latest system. A number of useful workshops and seminars are also conducted on new systems and procedures. Children learn

photoshop and digital printing techniques. Cyber Security awareness is spread for safety of children and is a regular feature of the section.

Environment

Harit Vahini campaign was started on 19 November, 1986 to indulge children into the mainstream environmental consciousness and activism. Environment Section was created for the implementation of this campaign. This section has grown over the years by expanding the scope of awareness about the most important issues of environment. The section through its hands on activities, field work and project work creates interest in environment amongst children. Ample importance is given to Environment Science and Nature for preservation of natural resources along with preservation of culture, art & craft, folk art and literature, historical monuments etc. Rain Water Harvesting and solar power related projects are given special attention. In addition to it many projects related to Environment are undertaken and children are taught through field visits, surveys, waste recycling etc. To reach out to maximum member of children and create maximum awareness, a National Conference of Young Environmentalist” is being organized since 1990. Children from different parts of the country participate in this meet and interact on various aspects of environment and discuss the social, emotional and cultural part of this.





Astronomy

The Sky above holds unknown milky ways having various unsolved mysteries. People are striving to solve these mysteries from time immemorial. A lowcost astronomical unit has been established in Bal Bhavan. Children enjoy activities in this section. They remain curious to have more and more information about stars and sky above. In the past years Astronomy Section conducted Telescope making workshops for Delhi school children and at an International level for SAARC countries.

Aquarium and activities related to animal corner

Children get basic information about zoology and animals in this section. This section organises workshops related to “Make your own aquarium” and provide information about animals. Children get information regarding the concepts of adaptations, viscosity, marine life, aquatic plants, etc. and learn morphology, food habits and habitations etc. of pet animals.

LIBRARY ACTIVITIES

National Bal Bhavan has a library with a large number of interesting books for children. These books are on Art, Craft, culture, Science, Mathematics, Mass media, computers, stories, fiction and poetry etc., along with a reference section. Books in Hindi, English, Urdu, Tamil and Bangla languages are also in the library. Various journals, magazines are also available in the library. Apart from reading activity this section also organises activities on creative writing for children.



PHOTOGRAPHY

In National Bal Bhavan children are acquainted with various aspects of photography such as history of photography, basics of camera, digital camera and technique of handling a digital camera for clicking photos of various themes like nature, portrait, model, project, Industry etc. Importance of light, natural light and time of clicking photos is an integral part of teaching photography. Children take photo of people, animal, birds, their habits, various movements, people living in different habitats and their life styles. Children are learning to make Coffee Table book using Photoshop techniques.



Videography classes and workshops are also conducted by this section. Where children prepare video programmes. Team of Children perform activities such as script writing, camera handling, dialogue, and voice recording to film production under the supervision of their Instructor. Photography section also organises exhibition of the photos on various themes covered by children to motivate them. The section also organises specific photography courses for adults.

Main attractions of this section are:

- Digital Photography
- Photoshop techniques for digital enhancement.
- Field visits and heritage walks to take pictures of nature, monuments etc. and making a photo journal.
- Photo exhibition and display is also done towards the end of a training programme
- Photography training programme is also organised for adults.

PERFORMING ARTS

Performing Art provides opportunity to children to develop their imagination with the help of various activities and translate it into action to recognize their talent. Children learn Dance, Drama, Music, Instrumental Music, Vocal music etc. Children also acquaint with traditional folk music and dance of different cultures.

Performing Art Section consists of the following Sub-sections:

- Vocal Music (classical & folk)
- Instrumental Music (percussion and string instruments of Indian origin)
- Classical Dance (Kathak, Bharatnatyam)
- Folk Dance
- Drama



PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Sports and physical activities are favourite of children of all age groups. National Bal Bhavan provides various type of sports activities to children such as: Table Tennis, Badminton, Football, Cricket, Basket Ball, Judo and Skating etc. It has its own Gymnasium for exercise. Children not only get information related to these sports but are also encouraged to develop their own creative and interesting games.

Judo has added many proud moments for this institution. National Bal Bhavan has had the privilege to train such children who have proved themselves not only at National, but international level also. Physical Education Section conducts inter school tournament in which children of various schools and institutions actively participate and enjoy.



Skating is also very popular among children and perhaps National Bal Bhavan has one of the best skating rinks in Delhi. Physical Education Section also organize inter school cricket and Foot Ball competitions in Bal Bhavan and children of various schools participate in competitions and enjoy it. National Bal Bhavan's play ground and Physical Education Section are also made available to member schools of National Bal Bhavan. This section also arrange adventures camps, trekking and other field trips as well. Creative games are also organised for children from time to time.

HOME MANAGEMENT

Children are acquainted with good and smooth home management by this section. In this section children try their hand on varieties of dishes. They learn cooking of nutritious and healthy foods so that they may be self reliant. Children are taught how to prepare budget of kitchen and estimation. Regular discussions are held with children about Health & Hygiene and Cleanliness which is useful for them. Various workshops are organized like Flower Arrangement (Ikebana), Bakery products etc.

MUSEUM TECHNIQUES

National Children Museum of National Bal Bhavan organises theme based exhibition on various occasions and enhances knowledge of children. This is a unique Children's Museum in India. It has permanent exhibition galleries and thousands of children visit the same and these exhibitions supplement and complement the school education curriculum. Another activity of National Children Museum is "Museum Technique Club" which demonstrate techniques of preparing Clay and "Cast" replica from plaster of Paris and children are taught from simple techniques to specific work such as "Piece Mould". In this section children are also taught mounting, script writing and technique for arranging exhibitions etc. Children undergo experience which enhances their knowledge about nature, history, culture, science and technology. Children are educated about our ancient civilization, our history, its ancient heritage and culture as well. Children visit excavation sites to have direct and first hand experience. Special workshops are conducted for children and their visits are also arranged to various historical monuments.

PUBLICATION RELATED ACTIVITIES

Publication related activities are conducted during Summer Fiesta. This is a unique programme conducted to enlighten children through publication related activities and by publishing of a Magazine, Newsletter and a special News paper 'Akkad-Bakkar Times' involving children in its editing, sketching and production. In this activity children not only bring out newspaper and journals but also acquaint themselves with various techniques which inculcate creativity and self reliance. Children are taken to

various Publication Groups and News Channel Offices. In addition, this section organizes workshops on various subjects such as Sketching of Books, Book Production, Preparation of an Advertisement and Designs etc so that they may have knowledge of various aspects of publication.



National Children's Museum

National Children Museum is an integral part of National Bal Bhavan which has been designed in line with the psychology of growing children and their curiosity of viewing and looking at the world around them. Museum has a rich collection of precious objects which include Toys from other countries, Stone & Metal objects/items, traditional ornaments, pots and utensils, art and craft items, Instrument, turbans/headgears, aircraft, satellite and information related to historical monuments. National Children Museum is the only institution which enjoys the status of being a National Level Children Museum. National Children Museum advocates this fact that children's museum is an important source for developing the knowledge of children.

Various exhibitions are arranged in different galleries of this museum, first permanent exhibition and other one is temporary exhibition. One of the galleries of the museum is reserved for temporary exhibition, where exhibitions are organised on a special subjects and special themes.

Permanent exhibition in the museum has a special attraction "Hamara Bharat" is a prominent one (spread over in 8500 sq.ft.) and it displays lifestyle of Indian people, their live culture, rich art and craft, diversity of religion and costumes, progress in science and technology which draws the attention of the viewers and visitors, Gaurav Gatha (spread over in 1855 sq. ft. area) depicts the era of golden past, its culture, wars etc. which has been arranged in chronological order. Surya Gallery (spread over in more than 8000 sq.ft. area) in which importance of "Surya" is outlined along with civilization of Egypt Mesopotamia, China, Greek etc and place and importance of Surya in their civilization is depicted. Origin of surya i.e. the planet and Earth etc. is also shown here, in the other words: presentation of Surya is depicted from both mythological and scientific point of view. Traditional Art and Craft gallery: Treasure for the future generation (spread over in 1700 sq.ft. area) exhibition displays art work of renowned artists. All these exhibition are open for the public.

National Training Resource Centre

Aims and objective of NTRC is to provide integrated training to teachers and adults by Creative methodology and participation in Creative Art, Performing Art and Science activities. Proposals for Training in Physical Education, sports, Library activities are also under consideration. It has been felt that the work and performance of children be given recognition and this can be achieved by training teachers in creativity.

With the help of various media and creative methods, National Bal Bhavan encourages teachers to recognize the sustained imagination and thought process of children, their creative expression, innovation and capacity of originality and thereby enhancing their capability. Talks and demonstration are arranged for rural, semi rural and urban teachers/instructors to make the art as a powerful medium of expression and imparting education.

Special Achievements

Summer Fiesta was organised from 22nd May to 22nd June 2018. Around 4887 children got registered at main centre of NBB this year in summer fiesta. Special activities viz “Fun for - Little Ones” were organized for children in the age group of 5 to 10 years in which around 300 children participated every day.

This year’s special activities were following :

- This year’s three days activities were organized for govt. school children in which around 20514 children participated.
- A two day national Bal Shree Camp was organized on 22 and 23 April 2018 at National Bal Bhavan for national level selection of winners of state level camp. In this camp 350 children participated from all over India. Children participated in 16 sub streams of 4 Main streams i.e. Creative Art, Creative Performance, Creative Writing and Creative Scientific Innovation.
- First automatic engine was “Fairy Queen” which is also known as “EIR - 22”. The revamped steam locomotive engine of National Bal Bhavan was flagged off by Steam Man of India, Mr. Ashwani Lohani, Chairman Railway Board and Mr. Vishwesh Chaubey, General Manager of Northern Railway at National Bal Bhavan on 15th June 2018.
- To inculcate other special interest in children during summer session 2018, Experts like Mrs. Rajiya Malik – Kantha, Crochet, Mr. Raj Kumar – Pottery, Mr. Ram Kishan – Bamboo work, Mrs. Ramwati – Papier Maché were invited to train children.
- On July 7, 2018, the Second Annual Conference of Alumni of National Bal Bhavan was organized. Nearly 200 alumni attended alumni meet. Former students, employees, officers and instructors of National Bal Bhavan joined in the meet. In this meet the participants discussed about the contribution of National Bal Bhavan in their life and utility of National Bal Bhavan.
- On August 15, 2018, “71st Independence Day and 76th Anniversary of Quit India Movement” was organized in which about 1000 participants (staff, members, children and guests) participated. The 105 feet high flag in the open ground of National Bal Bhavan was hosted followed by National Anthem. Its aim was to inculcate the feeling of nationalism in every person.
- A computer workshop was organized for special children (Divyangjan) from 25th September to 28th September, 2018. In this workshop information about computer were shared with children along with practical knowledge.
- Three day National Children Assembly and Integration Camp 2018 was organized from 14th November to 16th November, 2018 in the premises of National Bal Bhavan. Theme of this camp was “Creative India”, and the purpose was to help the children to understand and appreciate the diverse culture of the country. In this program children from across




the country took part in various activities and workshop at National Bal Bhavan, that is children from 42 affiliated Bal Bhavans from 17 states, members children and their escorts from Bal Bhavan Kendras, member children of National Bal Bhavan, Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi and students of various Delhi school, around 3000 children attended on the first day and 400 – 500 children attended the program on the remaining days.

- The First Art Festival was organized in 2015 in the National Bal Bhavan. This year, third Art Festival was held in the premises of National Bal Bhavan by the National Council of Educational Research and Training from December 12, 2018 to December 15, 2018. About 400 children and their escorts participated in this program.
- With the efforts and funding of Chairperson of National Bal Bhavan, Mrs. Shallu Jindal, Minister of Human Resource Development Sh. Prakash Javdekar inaugurated Sports Department after renovation on 12th January, 2019. For children, a new Shooting Activity has been included in sports activity. Apart from this, the internal and external Gymnasium and Carrom Board corner etc. were also inaugurated.
- On 28th January 2019, a program “Pariksha Pe Charcha” under “Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat” was organized at National Bal Bhavan. In this program about 400 children from different states of India stayed in the hostel of National Bal Bhavan from 26th to 31st January 2019. On 28th January 2019, 1000 Children participated in all the activities like painting, collage, Proverbs in local language, poem, book mark, slogan writing, integrated activity, Sui Dhaga craft, handicraft, games, radio and electronics, aero modelling, mehendi, madhubani painting, bamboo craft, papier maché, music, kathputli show, story telling, mime show, warli painting, pottery, graffiti, selfie corner, collage of happy faces of children etc. On January, 29 at Talkatora Stadium, these 1000 children participated in “Pariksha Pe Charcha” program organized by Prime Minister’s Office in which a performance by children of NBB kept the audience spell bound.
- Many programs were organized on the occasion of 150th birth anniversary of Gandhi Ji. An exhibition was displayed in the museum on the stories of Panchatantra. Children were taught Gandhi ji Song “Vaishav Jan ko” etc. Program “Gandhi Rang Putul Sang” was organized with Sahitya Natak Akademi from 3rd October and 4th October 2018 in which member children of National Bal Bhavan and teachers sang songs and performed the Puppet Show. On 19th January 2019, 50 member children and 6 teachers visited Rajghat and Gandhi Museum where they got to learn a lot about Gandhi ji and his philosophy of life. “Swachhta Pakhwara” was also organized from 15th September to 2nd October 2018. Number of activities were also organized on Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat. Many similar programs were organized in affiliated Bal Bhavans and Bal Kendras all over India.

COLLABORATIVE PROGRAMMES

- Earth Day was organised on April 20, 2018. In this program 120 children from about 6 schools took part with their teachers. In this program two guests were invited, one Mr. Anil Arora from EARTH DAY NETWORK and Mr Gaurav Mishra from DANA PANI. These institutions work for environment conservation.
- On 25th, 26th and 31st May 2018, Painting, Collage and Writing competition was organized for children by Maulana Azad Medical College on the occasion of World No Tobacco Day.
- On 31st May 2018, World No Tobacco Day program was organized in National Bal Bhavan. On this occasion, a daylong dental camp was organised in collaboration with



Maulana Azad Dental College, where member children and staff of National Bal Bhavan got their teeth checked by Doctors and learnt about the side effect of cigarettes and tobacco.

- On 7 June 2018, 07 staff of Indian Air Force organised workshop for children in age between 11 to 16 years and gave them information about how they can make career in Indian Air Force.
- On June 12, 2018, a story telling workshop was organized for children. 10 different stories were narrated by Storytelling expert Mrs. Usha Chhabra after which children also narrated their favourite stories.
- On 19th June 2018, drawing competition was organised by Bonn Company for children on “Swachhata”.
- On 18th July, 2018, a Painting competition was organized on “Drug Prevention Awareness” by Ministry of social justice and empowerment for National Bal Bhavan member children and different schools children in National Bal Bhavan in which around 200 children from different school and National Bal Bhavan member children participated.
- On 18th August 2018 ‘World Photography Day’ was celebrated in National Bal Bhavan. In this program about 100 participants took part (new and old students). Shri Surender Oasan; senior photography officer of CCRT, Mr Anil Sharma; famous filmmaker, Mr. Ahmed Suleman and senior artist and filmmaker Mr Palyji. The subject of this program was “Contribution of Photography in today’s world”.
- Video Production workshop was organized from 9th February 2019 to 25th February 2019 at National Bal Bhavan. 20 participants attended the workshop. Participants were given information about different dimensions of video production. Film maker and artist, Mr. Satan Solan gave brief about Film and Video editing.
- From April 4, 2018 to September 2018 on every Wednesday and Friday, staff of National Bal Bhavan organised activities for the children of Rashtrapati Bhavan.

PROGRAMME FOR STAFF MEMBERS

- On June 21, 2018 Yoga Day was celebrated. On this occasion, Yog Mudras were taught to children and employees by an invited expert.
- On June 29, 2018 at 10:00 am, Hindi Workshop organized on Noting Drafting, correspondence and for the maintenance of files for the staff of National Bal Bhavan. In this workshop, two officers and 25 employees took part.
- A meeting of “Official Language Implementation Committee” was held on 29th June 2018 at 3.30pm. Efforts to improve compliance in Hindi correspondence in the annual programs were discussed. Two officers and 7 employees participated in this workshop.
- On 15 August 2018 the 71th Independence Day and 76th anniversary of Quit India Movement were organized in which around 1000 children and employees participated.
- “Swachhta Pakhwara” program was organized from 15th September 2018 to 2nd October 2018, on the occasion of 150th Birth Anniversary of our Nation Father, Mahatma Gandhi ji. In this program all the employees participated in the cleanliness drive on 15th September 2018 at National Bal Bhavan.

Detailed Report

WORKSHOP AT RASHTRAPATI BHAVAN

Every Wednesday and Friday starting from April 4, 2018, the staff of National Bal Bhavan - Mr. Natthi Lal Yadav - Folk song Activity, Mr. Vasudev - Integrated Activities, Mohammad Anirul Islam - Painting Activity, Mrs. Usha Rani - Handicraft Activity, organized workshops for the children of Rashtrapati Bhavan at Rashtrapati Bhavan. About 19 - 20 children attended this workshop every Wednesday and Friday.

AERO MODELLING WORKSHOP

A nine days workshop on Aero Modelling was organized at National Bal Bhavan from April 10 to April 20, 2018. Aero modelling is also an important activity for children. A total of 30 children participated in this workshop. In this workshop, the class was started with the introduction of Aero modelling, the principles of flight and the history of Aero modelling and aircraft. Children were taught about Hunter model glider & Yellow bird glider model in this workshop. Children then prepared a model of Hunter Model Glider along with the demonstration.

EARTH DAY CELEBRATION

“Earth Day” was organized by National Bal Bhavan on April 20, 2018. This year its theme was “Beat Plastic Pollution”. 120 children from about 6 schools participated in this program along with their teachers. In this program Mr. Anil Arora from Earth Day Network & Mr. Gaurav Mishra from Dana Pani were invited. These two organizations work for the protection of the environment. The program started with discussion on two important facts “Mother Earth” & Behaviour toward our Mother Earth”. During the program, children were shown a short film on “Plastic Pollution”, the story of the film revolved around that how the plastic is made and harmful effects of plastic on environment, marine creatures and on other animals. After this, Assistant Director (Science) discussed with children about nature of plastic, its harmful effects and how it has become involved in human’s life. . The children were shown a power point





presentation based on the history of the Earth. . Mr. Anil Arora addressed the children regarding plastic waste. He explained through a video to children about the harmful effects of plastic on large creatures such as “whale fish”. He also discussed the problems being faced with plastics through a power-point presentation. Mr. Gaurav Mishra from Dana-Pani organisation discussed about importance of food and water for a small bird like Goriya (Sparrow) and the changes in the weather. He also sang a song with children on Goriya Bachao (save sparrow).

During this workshop children were taught to make bags from recycled paper and also discussed the reuse of plastic - bottles. In the end, refreshment and participation certificates were distributed to all the participants.

NATIONAL BAL SHREE CAMP - 2016

Bal Shree Scheme was started by National Bal Bhavan in 1995 to recognize highly talented and creative children in the fields of art, performance, writing and scientific innovation. The idea behind this was to recognize and nurture the qualities of originality and creativity in children from childhood so that they can become future citizens, pioneers of social change and support the progress of society and nation.



After the state level selection the two-days National Bal Shree Camp was organised on 22nd -23rd April 2018. Around 350 children from all over India participated in this camp. The children participated in the 16 sub-streams of the four main streams by showcasing their creative potential to the fullest. In the end participants were provided participation certificates.

PAPER BAG MAKING WORKSHOP

On April 28, 2018, a workshop on paper bag making was organized. The workshop began with a brief discussion on the use of paper bags with children. In the past the types of paper used to manufacture paper bags were made by hand. During the workshop the need for use of paper bags, why is it beneficial for the environment and the side effects of plastic bags were



also discussed. In the workshop children were given step by step instructions to make paper bags, after that they made neat and colourful bags from recycled papers. In this workshop 20 children from Baburam Public school, chawri bazaar, New Delhi participated with their instructor. At the end the children were given refreshments.



INTERNATIONAL MUSEUM DAY

On 10 May 2018, 42 children of the National Museum of Natural History celebrated International Museum Day at the National Bal Bhavan with their escort. At the beginning of this workshop, the Curator Museum addressed the children through PPT followed by discussion. On this occasion, children practiced some special activities based on general science and related to daily life. This workshop was an enlightening workshop for the children to discuss various types of materials prepared from waste management and reuse of items such as: - news papers, plastic bottles etc.

SUMMER FIESTA

Summer fiesta is an annual program of National Bal Bhavan. This time summer fiesta was celebrated from May 22nd to June 22nd 2018. Around 4887 children registered during this summer festival. A special Children's Assembly was organized for these children in an open air theatre every Saturday in which around 3000 children participated every Saturday. During the summer vacation children learnt many new, creative and environment friendly things. On May 22,



2018, Chief Guest - Mr. Upendra Kushwaha, Minister of State, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Mr. Shashank Shekhar - Joint Secretary, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Mrs. Reena Ray - Special Secretary, Ministry of Human Resource Development and Secretary - Mr. Anil Swarup, Human Resource development and Director National Bal Bhavan inaugurated the program by lighting a lamp amidst chanting of Swasti Vachan.



The chief guests were then welcomed by giving some artwork made by the children. On this occasion, 50 children of Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi also gave their performance. Experts - Ms. Razia Malik - Kantha & Crochet, Mr. Rajkumar - Pottery, Mr. Kishan - Bamboo work, Mrs. Ramvati - Papier Maché etc. were made available to arouse other special interests in children. During the summer festival, about 3000 children participated in 40 activities in the National Bal Bhavan every day like science activities, crafts and art, painting, handicraft, weaving, sewing - embroidery, wood art, clay work, book binding, tie and dye, physical and Natural Sciences (How and Why Clubs), Inventor Club, Radio & Electronics Club, Aero Modelling, Computer, Environment, Astronomy, Aquarium, Animal corner and Science Park etc. Supporting organisations were Radio Mirchi, Bonn Company,



Maulana Azad Dental College and Lok Nayak Jai Prakash Hospital etc. Throughout the summer fiesta National Bal Bhavan is transformed into a hub of training for all children. Special arrangements of transportation and refreshment were also done for children.



During this period, special activities for children in the age group of 5-10 years were organized called "Fun for little ones". Special activities related to environment awareness By Play & Singing: showing the duty of environment protection such as: Name discovery through trees, animals and birds painting, making various birds, fish and animals by paper, Fables & Colors: aquatic animal colouring, Drawing eye masks & masks of your favourite animals, birds, cats etc. Cartoon creation and aerobics : illustration through story, paper craft, fan fold; Yoga Singing, Painting by the Thumb, Mosaic Art, Through Painting: what do you want to be through illustration, Animated Movie, , Pot painting, Paper craft, puppet making, your name exploration by painting, storytelling workshop, Painting : creating table mats and greeting cards with drip techniques, Animated movie: Hotel Transylvania, reuse of cartons, Painting competition etc. was conducted in which around 450 children participated daily.

Souvenir shop is a centre in which children get chance to purchase their art works at very minimal price, which they had prepared under the special guidance of their instructors. Historical memories for children - Inauguration of steam engine, small book store by A to Z publication, career counselling workshop by Indian Air Force were the special attraction in summer fiesta.

During this period NBB got free services of CAT ambulance, first aid centre by Lok Nayak Jai Prakash Hospital and free dental checking and hygiene tips from Maulana Azad Dental hospital. This time in summer session, 50 children from Bal Bhavan Kendra - Dev Samaj, Okhla, 50 children from Adarsh Nagar, 50 children from Deputy Ganj and 50 children from Wazirpur participated in many activities and also took a ride on toy train. Maulana Azad Medical College organised many activities like Painting, collage making and slogan writing competition on the occasion of World No Tobacco Day on 25th & 26th May, 2018 and children participated in these competitions with great enthusiasm. On the occasion of World No Tobacco Day some members' children of NBB presented a puppet show namely "Tobacco and its Social Combat".

On June 5, 2018, World Environment Day was celebrated. On this occasion some children presented play on the main theme i.e. "Remove plastic pollution from the roots". Children were also shown a film to end pollution and took the oath.

On 7th June 2018, seven employees of the Indian Air Force conducted a workshop for children in the age group of 11 to 16 years and also gave motivational speech along with information that how they can join the Indian Air Force. At the end of workshop they distributed notepads and posters etc. to all the children.

On June 12, 2018 a storytelling workshop was organised for children in which ten different stories were narrated by storyteller Mrs. Usha Chhabra and she also gave an opportunity to children for performance on a story.

On June 14, 2018 some member children of environment section visited New Paryavaran Bhavan under the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate change. It is also called Green Building. Children were given information that the basic design of this building is based on Net



Zero Energy consumption and many energy conservation measures have been adopted like regenerative lifts, robotic parking etc. Children were also informed that how industrial development can keep our environment greener in a better way.

On June 15, 2018 on the occasion of the inauguration of the refurbished steam locomotive engine, a traditional welcome was given to guests. On this occasion, some member children presented cultural programs on the arrival of guests. The revamped steam railway engine was inaugurated by the Indian Steam man Shri Ashwini Lohani, Chairman Railway Board and Sh. Vishwesh Chaubey, General Manager.

On June 19, 2018, the Bonn Company officials organized a painting competition for children based on "cleanliness", Bonn biscuits were also distributed to the children after the competition.

Yoga Day was celebrated on 21st June 2018. The guests of the program received traditional welcome by the children and momento were also presented to the guests. During this occasion, artworks related to yoga were displayed and the members' children of the performing arts section of NBB presented a program based on yoga postures. Some yoga postures and their benefits were taught to children and staff.

On 22nd June 2018 all invited dignitaries Sh. Anil Swarup, Secretary, SE&L department, MHRD; Sh. V. Shashank Shekhar, Joint Secretary; Sh. Ajay Tirkey, Joint Secretary; Group Captain Manish Sabharwal, India Air force; Wing Commander Ms. Sangeeta Kathait, Indian Air Force, graced the closing ceremony of summer fiesta and were given a traditional welcome by children. All the notable persons visited the exhibition of artefacts made by children during the summer session, this exhibition was organised in the NTRC Hall (National Training Resource Centre) area. On this juncture, about 70 children of instrumental music section performed orchestra program and many cultural programs were also presented by the children.



The special achievement of this summer session was that 80 workshops were organised for the member children along with many other activities. Apart from the member children of NBB, these workshops were also attended by the children of Arya Orphanage and government school children on daily basis. Refreshments were distributed to about 3000 children every day.

WORKSHOP ON THE THEME "LET'S PRESERVE OUR MONUMENTS"

Two days workshop on 2nd & 3rd May 2018 was organised by National children Museum of NBB in commemoration of World Heritage Day on the theme "Lets preserve our monuments". The main objective of this workshop was to make the children aware of the precious heritage of their own country so that the children can preserve the special and precious monuments and cities of their India and understand the glorious past / history. This workshop was inaugurated by - Smt Indrani Chaudhary - Deputy Director (Program). A total of 29 children (2 NBB children and 27 children from Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi) aged 10 - 16 year participated in the program. On 2nd May 2018, children were shown the power point presentation through which



they were informed about their heritage and types, basically there are two types of heritage : Tangible and intangible heritage under UNESCO, ICOMOS, ASI and on the basis of past history, Delhi had seven cities. The children were then taken to Humayun's Tomb, which is currently a World Heritage Site.

Children were also informed that for the first time in the construction of this heritage site, red sand stone and white marbles have been used in considerable quantity as well as children gained knowledge about the shape used in the architecture of the monument. After that all the children were taken to the old fort which is located in the sixth city (as was it called in past) of Delhi, children were shown light and sound program there.

On May 3, 2018 children were taken to Red Fort, which is located in the seventh city of Delhi "Shahjahanbad" (according to history) and is also included in the list of World Heritage Sites. Children got information about the bizarre - door - work which is a special feature of Indo-Islamic architecture and this art form has also been used in Red Fort. Children also got information about Lahori Gate, Meena Bazar, Naubat Khana, Diwan-i-Aam, Nahr-i-Bihisht, Diwan-i-Khas, Rang Mahal, Sawan Mandap, Bhadon mandap, Mumtaz Mahal, Baoli and Hamam. Children also visited Moti Masjid made by Aurangzed, this mosque was made of white marble. Children also visited war museum located in Red Fort. After returning from Red Fort children were divided into Team A and Team B and quiz was organized for them. Team B children emerged as a winner by giving the correct answers. Assistant Director (Science) & In charge Program, gave chocolate to each child of winning team as a prize. . In the end, the children were made aware that it is the responsibility of every Indian to preserve the heritage of the nation, because this precious heritage is the identity and pride of our India.

WORLD NO-TOBACCO DAY PROGRAM

The World No Tobacco Day program was held on 31st May 2018 at National Bal Bhavan. On this occasion a one day dental check up camp was organized in collaboration with Maulana Azad Medical College in which member children and employees of National Bal Bhavan got their teeth examined by the doctors. They also get to know how they can keep their teeth healthy.



They mentioned the proper method of brushing the teeth to children and advised them to eat right food and drink so that the teeth that are used for healthy life can be saved from disease and damage. They also talked about exercises for gums and teeth, which can strengthen them. Some children of National Bal Bhavan performed Nukkad Natak on the theme of "Tobacco and its social side effects" Around 800 children participated in this program.

TEACH FOR GREEN WORKSHOP

The workshop was organized by the Environment section and Radio Electronic section together with the help of organization "Teach for Green" at National Bal Bhavan on 6th and 7th June 2018. This workshop was based on making solar lamps and solar torches using waste material like plastic bottles and boxes. This workshop was attended by 144 children on the first day and 45 children on the second day. These children were divided into two parts. Both groups made 15 models. On this occasion two experts were present who explained the theory to the children and also did practical sessions with the children. These 15 models were displayed in the Radio Electronic section. Children received information related to solar energy and its concept. Finally, refreshments were distributed to all participants.



INAUGURATION OF STEAM LOCOMOTIVE ENGINE:

The first steam-powered automatic engine was the “Fairy Queen” also known as “EIR-22”. The revamped steam railway engine of National Bal Bhavan was inaugurated on 15th June 2018 by the Indian Steam man Shri Ashwini Lohani, Chairman Railway Board and Shri Vishwesh Chaubey, General Manager. Mr. Ashwini Lohani is a famous Steam Engine enthusiastic and has written a book called “Smoking Beauty: Steam Engine of the World”. The memories of yesterday revived in adults who enjoyed riding a small steam engine in their childhood. School children and the member children also enjoyed riding this engine.

QUARTERLY HINDI WORKSHOP:

On June 29, 2018 at 10.00 am a Hindi workshop on drafting and correspondence, noting, maintenance of files was organized for the staff of National Bal Bhavan. Mr. B.B. Sharma, Consultant Administration gave information about the subject. He said that the page number should be written in the files and an effort should be made not to have more than 150-175 a page in a file so that office work can be done smoothly, files should be handled through “movement register” so that information about the file can be easily obtained. In noting drafting, the language of the noting should be simple and concise so that the other person can understand it easily and in correspondence many times semi official letters are very effective as per requirement. If no action is being taken on a letter related to the particular subject for a long time then semi-official letters are very effective in that situation. Employees present in the workshop got the solution by asking questions related to the topic. The invited guest asked the staff to prepare an experimental noting on any subject. Two officers and 25 employees participated in this workshop. Refreshments were distributed to all employees at the end of the workshop.

QUARTERLY HINDI MEETING:

A meeting was held on June 29, 2018 at 3.30 pm for “Official Language Implementation”. A discussion was held in the meeting and it was informed that there is an increase in numbers of letters sent in Hindi by this office. Apart from this, notes written in Hindi in the files during the quarter were discussed in which it was stated that noting in Hindi has increased in this quarter as compared to the previous quarters. Also in part -11 of Performa were discussed and it was conveyed that some employees are going to be sent for Hindi training and one employee was going to take the exam in July 2018. Thereafter the next action plan was also discussed such as “Hindi Pakhwara” program, scheduled to be organised in September in which apart from employees, member children of NBB, Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi and children from Bal Kendras and member school will participate in competitions and eminent experts will be invited to prepare the result. A letter will also be sent to all state bal bhavans regarding Hindi Pakhwara so that they can organize this program also in their respective bal bhavans and bal kendras to encourage employees and children to do maximum work in official language ‘Hindi’. Along with this in the view of the fact that children read Hindi Comics in the library with great interest more Hindi comics should be made available for children in library. The Deputy Director Administration suggested that poetry, story writing program should also be organized for all the employees participating in the workshop held very quarter and the best creator should be given prize in the next workshop in order to increase the number of participation in the workshop.



In the end all employees got refreshments. Two officers and 7 employees were present in this meeting.

ALUMNI – SECOND ANNUAL CONFERENCE

On 7th July 2018, second annual conference of former members of National Bal Bhavan was organized, in which around 200 former member children along with former employees of NBB and instructors participated. In this conference, participants discussed about the contribution of National Bal Bhavan in their lives and also discussed why National Bal Bhavan is necessary in today's society. Former Director of National Bal Bhavan Mrs. Madhu Pant addressed the participants. Mr. Yatindra Nath Gaur – Ex Librarian recited poetry



on Bal Bhavan which aroused enthusiasm in all the participants and all the alumni shared about their achievements. Assistant Director Science & In-charge Program and Deputy Director Administration addressed the gathering. The alumni presented the souvenir works to the National Bal Bhavan and the Deputy Director - Administration thanked all the participants wholeheartedly. Finally, refreshments were distributed to all participants.

AEROMODELING WORKSHOP

13 day workshop on Aeromodeling was organized from 12 July 2018 to 24 July 2018 at National Bal Bhavan. Aeromodeling is also an important activity for children. A total of 40 children participated in this workshop. In this workshop, the class was started with the introduction of Aeromodeling, the principles of flight and the history of Aeromodeling and Aircrafts. Training was given for Hunter model glider and yellow bird glider. After that children made a model of the Hunter Model Glider. Hunter model glider flying demonstration was given in the premises of National Bal Bhavan.

PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOP

A photography workshop was held on a fee basis for persons aged 16 + on every Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday from July 17, 2018 to September 29, 2018. The theme of this workshop was "History of Photography, Types of Cameras". During this workshop the participants were also taken to Khajuraho temple where they did monument photography, village life and natural scenery photography. On September 29, 2018 i.e last day of workshop, a photo story from the photos that was clicked by participants were made and exhibited after that best photographs were awarded by Deputy Director Administration and Assistant Director (Science). Certificates were distributed to all the 41 participants who attended the workshop.

COMPETITION ON "CLEANLINESS"

On July 18, 2018 a painting competition was organized by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the theme of "Drug Prevention Awareness" at National Bal Bhavan. Around 200 children from schools and NBB participated in competition. Out of all the paintings, some paintings were selected by National Bal Bhavan artists for the award. National Bal Bhavan Science section instructor Ms. Seema guided all children on the importance of Cleanliness. Cash prizes were also distributed to the winning children by National Institute of Social Defence (NISD).



THE 71ST INDEPENDENCE DAY AND 76TH ANNIVERSARY PROGRAM OF QUIT INDIA MOVEMENT

On 15th August 2018 “71st Independence Day and 76th anniversary of Quit India Movement” program was organized in which around 1000 children, guests and employees participated. Chief guests of this program were Mr Chaudhary Birender Singh – Steel Minister, Mr. Naveen Jindal – Indian Flag Institute, Mrs. Shalu Jindal – Chairperson of National Bal Bhavan and apart from this 50 guests and families of chairperson were invited. During this program some member children of performing art section traditionally welcomed the guests. All the guests also visited exhibition of artefacts made by the children near reception hall. After that the 105’ feet National Flag was hoisted by Mr. Chaudhary Birender Singh followed by National Anthem at open ground of National Bal Bhavan. Thereafter, in the open ground some member children sang welcome and patriotic songs for the chief guests. On this occasion Union Steel Minister – Mr Chaudhary Birender Singh in his speech emphasized on increasing the feeling of nationalism and Chairperson of National Bal Bhavan Mrs. Shalu Jindal said that establishment of National Flag (Tricolour) at NBB premises will help to enhance a sense of patriotism among children. Now any citizen of the country can hoist the tricolour in his house or office with full respect for 365 days of the year. This tricolour flag gives us all the inspiration that many Indians sacrificed their lives to get freedom, so we all should live together in this free country. This tricolor reminds us of our duties that all of us should be dutiful and honest towards our country, we are all one, we are all Indians. In the end, the staff of National Bal Bhavan, member children and guest families along with the chief guests enjoyed Hi-Tea.

WORLD PHOTOGRAPHY DAY

World Photography Day was celebrated on August 18, 2018. On this occasion a seminar was organized which was anchored by Mr. Chandarmani – Performing Arts Manager. Around 100 new and old member children participated in this program. The experts invited for the program were Mr. Surender Osan - Senior Photographer of CCRT, Mr. Anil Sharma - Famous Filmmaker, Mr. Ahmed Suleman and Senior Artist and Filmmaker, Mr. Pali. The theme of this program was - “Photography’s contribution to today’s society”. A photo exhibition was also organized on the occasion in which old and new students put up their photography pictures. Awards were also given to selected photographers. In the end all participants were given snacks which were arranged by alumni.

HINDI PAKHWARA

“Hindi Pakhwara” was organized from 1st September 2018 to 15th September 2018. The purpose of this program was to promote the official language “Hindi” and to encourage the official work in maximum Hindi by all employees. During Hindi Pakhwara 08 competitions were held for the staff such as Short play writing, noting drafting, creating a story by seeing a picture and giving title to story. Two activities viz dictation and writing correct word were kept for MTS staff exclusively out of the all the available activities. These competitions were also organized for member school children, Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi and Bal Kendras children. The sole



purpose of this event was to inculcate affection towards Hindi from a very young age and motivate them to use the official language of the country and their mother tongue. In the same context on 5th September 2018 children of two age group (10 to 12 year and 13 to 16 years) was asked to write Contemporary Poetry followed by Presentation, Writing paragraphs based on given lines, making poster and slogan writing, writing sentences in correct form. The final result of Hindi Pakhwara was prepared by Mr. Ved Prakash – Director, Ministry of Culture, New Delhi.

On 20th November 2018, prize distribution program of Hindi Pakhwara was organized. First, second, third and two consolation prizes were kept in each competition.

On this occasion Mr Mukesh Gupta – Deputy Director (Administration), Mrs. Indrani Chaudhary – Deputy Director, PC&R and Mrs. Asha Bhattacharjee - Assistant Director (Science & In - Charge program) gave prize to winning contestants. School children were provided certificates, useful books and painting material as prize and staff of NBB was given certificate and cash prize. After that Mr. Mukesh Gupta – Deputy Director (Administration) congratulated the children and employees on receiving the award and explained that our official language Hindi is very simple and easy and there should not be any kind of hesitation in using it in official and practical use. We need to change our mind set only then the official language will be successful in reaching the masses.

AEROMODELLING WORKSHOP

Four day workshop on Aeromodelling training control line model and flying was organized from 11 September to 14th September 2018 at National Bal Bhavan. Aeromodelling is also an important activity for children. This workshop was designed to meet the growing curiosities among the children. Total 70 children participated in this workshop. In this workshop the class was started with the introduction of Aeromodelling, the principles of flight and the history of Aeromodelling and aircrafts. Training was given for Hunter model glider and yellow bird glider. Children then made a model of the Hunter model glider and were also given technical training to make another model i.e. yellow bird glider.

CLEANLINESS PAKHWARA

On the auspicious occasion of our Rashtrapita Mahatma Gandhiji 150th Birth Anniversary, cleanliness Pakhwara was organised from 15th September 2018 to 2nd October, 2018. All the employees of National Bal Bhavan very enthusiastically participated in the programme on 15th September, 2018 the Vocal Artist, Mrs. Neha Vats sang a beautiful song “Ek Sapna Sanjoya Babu Ne, Ho Swatchh Hindustan Mera” and revitalized everyone’s responsibility towards cleanliness . The Deputy Director (Admin) briefly shared thoughts about the cleanliness and said that we will also be healthy if our environment will be neat and clean. In order to make premises clean and green, all the employees involved in this campaign did *shramdaan*. COMPUTER WORKSHOP

The computer workshop was organized from 25th to 28th September 2018 for the special children with disabilities. In this workshop children were provided with several information’s related to the computer.

25th September, 2018: Children were first told about the different parts of the computers, like mouse, keyboard, CPU etc. and they were also told about the importance of computer in our lives in today's world.

How to play games with the help of computer along with the basic knowledge of computer was also provided to them through multimedia presentations, visuals and animation.

26th September, 2018. Children were given replies to questions like, what is digital? Why digital is important in now a days? How everyone can really talk with the help of video and multimedia presentation? Children were made aware of the use of the paint brush and multimedia software the kid pix.

27th September, 2018: Children were informed about the internet like – how the works are been done online, how can we do our daily routine work in better way with the help of internet, website, URL etc.

28th September, 2018: Children were taught the process transferring the photos from mobile to computer and were informed about the using of adobe Photoshop and editing work in small scale Photoshop.

HINDI QUARTERLY MEETING

On 28th September, 2018 the implementation of Rajbhasha committee meeting was organised in National Bal Bhavan. In quarterly meeting it was mentioned that this time the speciality of Hindi Pakhwara from 01 - 15th September, 2018 was that this programme was organized in several State Bal Bhavans too located in different parts of the country of which the remarkable reports had also been received. Seeing the interest of children towards comic reading, 6 comic books in Hindi and 2 comic books in English were ordered for the library of National Bal Bhavan. Then the last quarterly progress report was read out where it had been mentioned that according to this the office should try to reply all English letters in Hindi. The Deputy Director (Admin) told that the medium of training in all the sections of National Bal Bhavan is "Hindi". The programme coordinator suggested that the official language Hindi can be promoted through educational sections like sports section where children were be motivated to play games for learning Hindi. There was another suggestion that activities related to official language Hindi should be conducted in library section regularly so that children might become aware by acquiring knowledge in Hindi language. The Deputy Director (Admin) suggested that the part time teachers of the Bal Kendra's of Delhi under National Bal Bhavan should make a report of those particularly working in official language Hindi so that in can also be included in the quarterly progress report. Finally it was also discussed in the meeting that along with the winners of the Hindi Pakhwara, all the participants should be given participation certificate to encourage more participation in this program.



VIGILANCE AND INTEGRITY OATH

The program Vigilance and integrity oath was organised in the open air theatre of National Bal Bhavan on 30th October 2018. The subject of this program was "Lets eradicate corruption, create a new India."



All the employees of the National Bal Bhavan gathered in the open air theatre and took the Oath of vigilance and integrity and thus ensured that each of them would present themselves as an examples by their own actions by establishing and safeguard integrity and policy code through their sincere effort and responsibility for the progress of economical, political and social change of the country. About 55 employees participated in this program.

Discussions with children were done by staff in the activity sections to understand the meaning of Unity and Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel's role in Unifying India.

National Children's Assembly and Integration Camp is the main annual programme of National Bal Bhavan. Every year children from various affiliated State Bal Bhavans and Bal Kendras gather in National Bal Bhavan to participate in cultural activities and workshops. 14th of November is also Children's day and the founder's day of National Bal Bhavan. The main objective of this programme is to make children understand and appreciate the diverse culture of the country. About 3000 children participated in this annual programme starting from 14.11.2018 till 16.11.2018. 42 State Bal Bhavan teams from across the country participated in this programme. Member children of National Bal Bhavan, Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi and Bal Bhavan Kendras and children from local schools also participated in this programme. This year creative workshops viz. Calligraphy, Pottery & Clay, Mehandi, Paper Machie, Bamboo Art, Charkha, Madhubani, Sanjhi Art & Box Making, Pupperty, Painting, Environment, Radio & Electronics, Photography, Aero Modelling, Funny Games, Weaving, Book



Binding, Wood Craft, Stitchery, Tie & Dye etc. were organised during three days event.

Day 1 - Wednesday, 14th November 2018

- Chief Guest Smt. Rina Ray, Secretary, Department of School Education and Literacy, MHRD and other dignitaries took a round of the exhibition on the theme depicting children's creative works followed by a round of creativity fair stalls and a view of the short presentation on the central stage by all State Bal Bhavan children in their traditional costumes.
- Formal inauguration of National Children's Assembly was done by Smt. Rina Ray in the Open Air Theatre by lighting a lamp. Smt. Rina Ray encouraged all the children by involving them in on the spot "Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat" activities like making children speak common sentences in regional languages of theirs. - Creative workshops in the ground for children were organised.
- Food Festival: Traditional Food festival was organised in the lawns of National Bal Bhavan in front of Hostel. Foods of various states of India marked the occasion. Children of one State got to taste the traditional foods of other states. - Simultaneously children of West Zone and South Zone-I showcased their performances and children also participated in creative workshops.
- National Bal Bhavan's radio electronics instructor organized HAM Radio lecture-demonstration and computer instructor showed youtube clippings on Creative India in Mekhla Jha Auditorium.
- Bonfire was organized in open grounds in late evening.

Day 3 - Friday, 16th November 2018

- Valedictory Programme started amidst welcome of chief guest and other dignitaries while children sang the song *Dangal Dangal*.....
- Ms. Babita Kumar Phogat, the Olympian, Arjuna Awardee, Common wealth gold medallist and world champion Indian wrestler was the chief guest during valedictory programme. Children were very very happy to be with the great personality. Many children interacted with Ms Babita Phogat by asking questions about her childhood, her challenges, her struggles etc. Children also sought her blessings. In her address Ms. Babita said that she herself has become a small kid with children. On performances by children she commented that this was her first chance to see such kind of live performances which were so beautiful. She encouraged children to strive hard for fulfilment of their ambitions. She told children to adopt discipline in life to become successful. Mr. Gulab, an ex-member of NBB who is a winner of gold medal (1st position in -60 kg category) in Commonwealth Judo championship was also felicitated by Ms. Geeta Phogat. A small skit on the theme of film *Dangal* was also presented by member children.
- Best entries of participants in song, dance, skit, drama, etc. were showcased. A puppet show for children also organised. Children shared their experiences. Certificates were distributed.

AEROMODELING WORKSHOP

A 12-day workshop on Aero model training on control line model and flying was organized from 4 December 2018 to 15 December 2018 at National Bal Bhavan. Aero modeling is also an important activity for children. This workshop was designed to meet the growing curiosities among the children. A total of 40 children participated in this workshop. In this workshop, classes were started with introduction of Aero model, theory of flight and history of Aero model and aircrafts. In this workshop training regarding Hunter Model Glider and Yellow Bird Glider model was imparted children made a model of hunter glider and the other model i.e. yellow bird gliders.

KALA UTSAV

The first Kala Utsav was held in 2015 at the National Bal Bhavan. The third Kala Utsav program was organized from 12 to 15 December, 2018 by the National Council of Educational Research and Training in the premises of the National Bal Bhavan. The Chief Guest in this program were: Honourable HRD Minister - Shri Prakash Javadekar, Smt. Honorable Minister participated in the shooting activities and said that activities like Shooting, Carrom, Chess, Open Gym, Indoor Gymnasium, Badminton, Tennis, Cricket, Skating, Basketball, Judo, football will make the future of children bright.



The Chief Guest at the inauguration ceremony of Kala Utsav program - were Honorable Ministers Mr. Prakash Javadekar, Mrs. Reena Ray, Secretary, Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Mr. R.C. Meena - Joint Secretary, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Mr. Harushikesh Senapati, Chairman - CBSE, Chairperson of National Bal Bhavan - Mrs. Shalu Jindal, Director of National Bal Bhavan - Mrs. Rashi Sharma. The program was inaugurated by lighting the lamp along with chanting of the *Swasti Vachan*. After that, some members of National Bal Bhavan and children from different states presented cultural programs in their costumes on the Open Air Stage. The Honorable Minister appreciated the cultural program very much and said that the lovely presentation of children from various provinces has fascinated me. Satisfying presentation by the children depicts unity in diversity that represents "*Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat*". He also said that Kala Utsav is a platform in which children from different states exchange their culture and he congratulated the State winners, who have reached national level after visual arts, dance, vocals and instrumental music competitions. Thereafter, Mr. R.C. Meena also blessed all the participants. About 400 children and escorts participated in this program.

AMOD DIVAS

On the occasion of new year the Amod Divas was organized with great fanfare on 1st January 2019 at National Bal Bhavan. During this almost all the children and staff joyfully participated in fun games, musical chairs, tug of war shooting, running, etc. As on the day, there was also

the farewell ceremony of National Bal Bhavan' Chairperson Smt. Shallu Jindal who had completed her 5 years (chairperson's) tenure in National Bal Bhavan. In this ceremony the other Board members - Smt. Lata Vaidyanathan, Mrs. Saira Verghese and Shri R. Govinda were also present. On this occasion the Director of National Bal Bhavan welcomed the Chairperson and the Board members by giving them gifts as an honour. Some member children and staff performed the cultural program. AERO MODELLING WORKSHOP

An 11 day workshop on Aero Modelling training control line model and flying was organized from 5th January 2019 to 15th January 2019. Aero modelling is also an important activity for children the main objective of this workshop was to satisfy the curiosities of the children .Total 47 children participated in this workshop. During this workshop the classes started with the introduction of aero modelling, principles of flight and history of aero modelling and air craft. Children were given training of hunter model glider and yellow bird glider model in his workshop. The children then prepared a model of the hunter model glider and were given the technical training to make another model like the yellow Bird Glider model.

150TH BIRTH CENTENARY OF FATHER OF THE NATION

Many programs were organized throughout the year to commemorate the 150th birth centenary of Gandhi Ji. An exhibition was organized in the museum on the stories of Panchatantra. The children were taught the songs on Gandhi Ji, *Vaishnav Jan Ko* etc. Gandhi Rang-Putul Sang program was organized with Sahitya Akademi from 3 to 4 October, 2018 in which children and teachers, members of Bal Bhavan, sang songs and performed a puppet show. On 19 January, 2019, 50 member children and 6 teachers visited Rajghat and also visited the Gandhi Museum, which made the children to learn a lot from Gandhi's philosophy and life. In the same series Drama on the theme and Swachhata Pakhwara was also organized from 15 September to 2 October, 2018. A number of activities were also organized on "Ek Bharat-Shrestha Bharat" Various programs related to this were also organized in all over India through NBB affiliated centres. Refreshments were distributed to all the participants.



"PARIKSHA PE CHARCHA 2.0 UNDER EK BHARAT SHRESTHA BHARAT"

The Program Pariksha Pe Charcha 2.0 was organised under "Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat" program on 28th January 2019. During this program from 26th - 28th January, 2019 around 350 children

from various States of India participated in this programme and stayed in the hostel of National Bal Bhavan. On 28th January 2019, 1000 Children participated in several activities like Painting, Translation in Regional Language, Bookmark Making, Slogan Writing, Papier-maché, Integrated Activity, Pottery, Vocal music, Folk dance, Drama, Instrumental, Photoshop techniques, Aero modelling, Mehndi, Madhubani, Bamboo Art, etc. As well as these 1000 children also participated in the next days program which was conducted in Talkatora stadium on 29th January 2019 where our Prime Minister Sh. Narendra Modi was the central figure who interacted with the children and encouraged them to create a new India through their toil. Finally our Prime Minister really appreciated those member children of National Bal Bhavan who performed some of the cultural programs very beautifully in that stadium.



VIDEO PRODUCTION WORKSHOP

The Video Production Workshop was organized at National Bal Bhavan from 5 February 2019 to 9 February 2019. The workshop was attended by 20 participants. The participants were given information about various dimensions of video production such as: - film, History of Cinema, Story Thinking and Writing, Screenwriting, Storyboarding, Composition, Video Shooting etc. Keeping in mind while shooting the video; principles, video editing, sound contribution to video, methods of using various video and sound devices were taught. In the workshop, participants were divided into 4 groups, each group created their own story, scripted it, prepared the story board, shot it accordingly. Editing the RAF footage was taught by Mr. Manish Rawat, a former alumni of National Bal Bhavan. He gave information about video equipment and explained the method of using it.

Shri Satan Solan - Film Maker and Artist, introduced the participants to the nuances of video editing and film editing. These participants prepared 4 short films which were shown on 16 February 2019. Finally certificates were distributed to all participants.

AERO-MODELING WORKSHOP

An 11-day workshop on Aero Modeling Training (Paper Cut Aero Modeling) was organized from 5 February 2019 to 15 February 2019 at National Bal Bhavan. Aero modeling is also an important activity for children. This workshop was designed to meet the growing curiosities among the children. A total of 48 children participated in this workshop. In this workshop, classes were started with introduction of Aero model, theory of flight and history of Aero model and aircraft. In this workshop children were taught to make models from thermocoal cutting, preparation of Aero model by waste paper, making parachutes etc. Afterward children also showed the models by flying them.

MATA SARASWATI JI WORSHIP

Mata Saraswati (Goddess Saraswati) was worshipped on 9 February, 2019 at the National Bal Bhavan to celebrate *Basant Panchami*. During this period some children of the Performing Art



Section also sang the *Saraswati Vandana* song and Mr. Mukesh Gupta, Deputy Director (Administration) offered garlands to the mother and offered flowers. After that, all the participants offered flowers to mother statue and sought her blessings. About 50 children and 25 employees and visiting children along with their parents participated in the event. In the end, sweets were distributed to all the participants.

PUPPET MAKING WORKSHOP

From 20 February 2019 to 22 February 2019 at the National Bal Bhavan, the museum department organized the puppet making workshops in which children were given information about different types of puppets and techniques for making puppets, through short stories of Panchatantra etc. They were also told about keeping this art alive. The types of puppets, the areas known for the puppets, information about their local languages and shapes and the names of the different types of shapes were told. The characters of the puppets were brought alive through stories. Children were motivated. About 35 children participated in this workshop. Finally, Certificates were distributed to all children.

27TH NATIONAL YOUNG ENVIRONMENTALISTS CONFERENCE

National Bal Bhavan organised its 27th National Conference of Young Environmentalists in Bengaluru from 25th to 27th February 2019. The venue was one of its affiliated Bal Bhavans at Bengaluru- Bal Bhavan Society, at Cubbon Park. The theme of the Conference was **ART WITH A PURPOSE - Creating Awareness about the Sustainable Development Goals**.

Objective

SDGs also known as Global Goals are a universal call to action to end poverty, protect the planet and ensure that all people enjoy peace and prosperity. SDGs are part of a UN resolution "Transforming our World: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development" set by the UN General Assembly in 2015. Collection of 17 global goals and 169 targets. Goals are broad and interdependent, yet each has a separate list of targets to achieve. SDGs cover social and economic development issues including poverty, hunger, health, education, global warming, gender equality, water, sanitation, energy, urbanization, environment and social justice.

Ms. Sukhpreet Kaur was the Environment expert who interacted with the children and resource persons on all days to integrate art with the SDG's.

It is one the important global educational task to familiarize children with these goals since these are all life related goals. Therefore National Bal Bhavan has taken this responsibility to take forward this message to children through its National Young Environmentalists Conference.

Brief of the Programme

Age group of children was 10 to 16 years. Children from various affiliated state Bal Bhavans and Bal Kendras (120) including local students (75) attended the conference. Children with special needs participated in the Art with a purpose activity on 27th of February 2019. An exhibition of posters, models and Art related to Sustainable local activities was also put up in the premises of Bal Bhavan Society, Cubbon Park.





The first day i.e., 25th February 2019 started with Shri Mukesh Gupta, Deputy Director (Admin) singing the Bal Bhavan song to engage the children in Mass singing activity while they waited for the Chief Guest's arrival. It was a pleasant surprise in the programme. The conference was inaugurated by Dr. Jaimala, Minister of Women and Child Development, Empowerment of Differently abled and Senior Citizens, Government of Karnataka and Chairman of Bal Bhavan Society. Dr. Indumathi Rao, Vice Chairperson, National Bal Bhavan was the Guest of Honour. Dr. Indumathi Rao gave the presidential address. She gave a brief history of National Bal Bhavan and its activities to the Minister and then she spoke about the importance of the theme and why it has been integrated with Arts. She emphasised that Arts can bring about major changes in a positive way in the behaviour of children especially the children with special needs. She praised such efforts of National Bal Bhavan in taking this forward. She also reiterated that National Bal Bhavan and its affiliated Bal Bhavans have a greater role to play in teaching non-formal education through its learning by doing activities.



The three days consisted of introduction, division of participants into groups, understanding the theme, group participation in the activities consisting of dance, puppetry, story telling, waste reuse through art, Art and craft, painting, tie and dye and creative writing. Ms. Sukhpreet Kaur was the Environmental expert, who through a power point presentation gave a detailed presentation of the sustainable development goals. Children were explained about the objectives of the programme. They were divided into groups to attend the sessions with the various experts. The Experts for the activities were Ms. Anupama Hoskere, Maithili and Varsha for puppetry and theatre. Ms. Sneha Kepanna for story telling, Mr. Natwar Surela for Waste reuse through Art, Mr. Sumit Patil for Art and craft, Mr. Sanjay Manna for painting activity. The state escorts were of great support. Dr. Ramesh of Cha Cha Bal Bhavan, Srikakulam took over as dance expert to conduct the activity since the local Resource Person could not come. Dr. Dinesh Trivedi, Deputy Director, Girdhar Bhai Bal Bhavan, Amreli did tie and dye activity with all the participants and teachers and gave the product made by each as memento on behalf of National Bal Bhavan. Other escorts helped in other activities with the resource persons and also in distribution of materials, food and during the field visits. Dr. Chotani of Hissar Bal Bhavan conducted Yoga activities with the children. Shri Guatam Limbadia anchored the stage programmes and coordinated the skits on environment prepared by various participants.

On 26th February children did Yoga and then they went to see the Aquarium near the Bal Bhavan. Later in the day they took part in the activities they had been given to participate. In the evening various participant groups presented a play on environmental issues.



On 27th February, early in the morning, children were taken for a bird watching session through the Cubbon Park with Mr. Sapta Girish a naturalist from the City. Mr. Sapta Girish gave an insight into the world of birds and how they interact with their environment.

On the same day a special programme for differently abled children of local schools was organised to include the special children in this programme. The school children and the special children participated in various activities of Art and dance together. Dance therapists, music experts and other experts on movement and music therapy were invited by Dr. Indumathi Rao. The Art experts also did interesting activities with the special children. They all were very happy to make a tie and dye handkerchief themselves. Shri Natwer Surela and the school children prepared special cards for all the special children and teachers to express their gratitude for participating in this programme.

Shri. V S Basavaraju, Commissioner of Disabilities was the Chief Guest in the valedictory programme on 27th February 2019. The outcome of the workshops was showcased through an exhibition and in the Valedictory programme on 27th February 2019. The children in Puppetry activity put up small act on Plastic monster, Five children presented their stories made on SD goals. Children in the dance activity presented a dance on forests. Art prepared on the given themes of SDG in the Art and craft activity was also presented to the audience.

All children were given Certificates by Shri. V S Basavaraju, the Chief Guest and Dr. Indumathi Rao, Vice Chairman, National Bal Bhavan. Shri Basavaraju expressed his happiness to be a part of this conference. He blessed all the children and praised the work done during the programme.

NATIONAL SCIENCE DAY

National Science Day was organized on 28 February, 2019 at National Bal Bhavan. The theme of this program was - "Science for people and people for Science". 167 children of 'Itihas Foundation, participated in this program along with their teachers and 16 employees of National Bal Bhavan also participated in this program. The need of science and technology in our life was discussed in which children were informed about the importance of science and techniques by presenting a power point. The children were then shown a short film in which a puppet made of waste material showed the importance of science. The environment teacher told the children to understand the structure of the puppet used in the film and the teachings given by it. The children then played various games based on various scientific principles in which they enjoyed a lot.

HOLI FESTIVAL

Holi Utsav was organized on 21 March 2019 for member children and staff at the National Bal Bhavan, which was attended by 30 children and 20 parents and 150 employees. On this occasion, a colorful program was organized by the performing arts section in the open stage of National Bal Bhavan, where music and dance programs were presented and all the people present played Holi with joy.

Mrs. Rashi Sharma-Director and Mr. Mukesh Gupta-Deputy Director (Administration), in their addresses, wished Holi to all the attendees to mark the festival of Holi. All the children and staff played with colors, abir and gulal. They greeted each other and spread the message of love and harmony in the society. On this occasion Gujia, Samosa and tea were distributed to all the participants in snacks. All were inspired by the spirit of this unique festival and were filled with gaiety.

JUDO CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENT

The Judo Championship competition was organized from 27 March to 29 March 2019 at National Bal Bhavan. Guests at the event were: - Shri Mahasimha Rao; Dronacharya Award-Wrestling, Mr. Gurcharan Singh Gogi; Dronacharya Award-Judo, Mr. Rajeev Tomar; Arjuna Award-Wrestling-Former Bharat Kesari, Mr. Prabhu Dayal Sharma; Wrestling Dalapati-Ganesh Dal, Mr. Akram Shah; Arjuna Awardee Judo-Olympian, Former Bal Bhavan Member, Mr. Devendra Singh; Former Judo Players and Formers Members etc. The experts were welcomed by Mr. Mukesh Gupta-Deputy Director-Administration. Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi

A scheme for establishment of Jawahar Bal Bhavan was launched in the mid of sixth decade and it was termed that these Bal Bhavan will be Nodal Agencies for more Bal Bhavans in the states, in this manner number of Bal Bhavans were established in various states of the country. Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi was an extension of this very scheme, which was financed by Nehru Memorial Fund in the initial stage. Rural Bal Bhavan, Mandi started its functioning from the "Chaupal" of Mandi Village.

At present, Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi is established on 3.75 acres of land provided by Gram Panchayat, Mandi and this Rural Unit was inaugurated by Smt. Indira Gandhi on 3rd Feb, 1973. This Rural Centre caters to the needs of children of Manglapuri, Gwal Pahari, Mehrauli, Jaunapur, Gadaipur, Sultanpur, Bandhwadi, Asoula, Aya Nagar, Ghitorni, Chhattarpur, Maidangarhi, Rajpur, Satbari, Chandhaua, Fatehpur Beri, Dera, Bhati Mines and Neb Sarai Villages.

Physical Education, Art & Craft, Stitching, Wood Craft and Clay works, Percussion, Dance are included in the activities of Jawahar Bal Bhavan. Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi has created thrust amongst children from rural areas and on demand photography and computer activities have also been included.

1028 children were registered in 2018-19 session. Hundreds of children took part in its activities and thousands visited Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi. Summer Fiesta Programme was organized and following are the main attractions/achievements.

JBB MANDI CHILDREN PARTICIPATE IN DANCE KE SHAHZADEY

The programme ended with the distribution of refreshment arranged by Inner Wheel Club, Rotary Club and Jawahar Bal Bhavan.

WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY

The "World Environment Day" is observed every year in Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi. This year it was organized around the theme "Beat Plastic Pollution" that focused attention on a very pressing environment concern. The theme of 2018, "Beat Plastic Pollution" is a call for action by all of us, to come together to combat one of the greatest environment challenges of our times.



To observe "World Environment Day" on 5th June 2018 Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi once again made a traditional "Palki" i.e. a "Palanquin" and kept plants inside symbolizing the



protection of flora and fauna, it was decorated with garland and beautiful crafts items. This has been the tradition of Bal Bhavan for a long time.

On 5th June 2018, hundreds of children (around 300) marched along the outer boundary wall of Jawahar Bal Bhavan. The march was headed by the palanquin carrying plants which was carried by children and staff. Prior to the march children spoke about the significance of environment day and also why plastic is harmful. Member children were also given directions to how to make the environment we live in better by small environment friendly deeds by each of us. Gaurav .DD (P C & R) sang the popular children's song "Nani Teri Morni Ko Mor Le Gaye Baki Jo Bacha tha Kale Chor Le Gaye" along with over 250 member children. The children presented the song along with actions to celebrate world Music Day.

Everyone enjoyed this day and the programme ended with distribution of refreshment to each child.



SUMMER FIESTA -2018 VALEDICTORY FUNCTION

Summer Fiesta - 2018 which commenced from 22nd May 2018 concluded on 22nd June 2018, All programmes of Bal Bhavan reaches its zenith during the summer session when large number of children participate in various activities and programme.

During this year's Fiesta too different kind of activities were organized and refreshment distributed daily to children. Health Check up was also conducted on daily basis

Dr. Madhu Pant, Former Director, NBB was the Chief guest of the Valedictory Function. On her arrival she was accorded a traditional welcome. The programme started with a swagat geet "Aap Aaye Dwar mere Aaj hain Anand Chaya" by children's choir.

The check up was followed by distribution of oral care kit for each and every child (i.e. 180 children) The kit contained a small brush and toothpaste.

CREATIVE WRITING WORKSHOP AND PRESENTATION AT PUBLICATION DIVISION

A "creative writing workshop" was organized by the Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mani in collaboration with Publication Division, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, Govt. of India on 24th July 2018 on the theme "Azadi Meri, Nazar Me". CULTURE CRAFT CONVENTION : NAKKARA MAKING WORKSHOP

Nakkara is a traditional instrument which may soon fade into oblivion in the absence of promotional avenues . Bal Bhavan has always believed in the conservation of culture and craft. The children of Mandi have been learning the technique of playing the Nakkara from Instructor (Instrumental Music) Sh. Jamil Khan on his personal Nakkara and have enthralled the audience



by their performance at National Bal Bhavan, JBB Mandi and on invitation on other platforms too.

As JBB Mandi did not have its own Nakkara , a workshop was planned to impart training in making of Nakkara so as to ensure that this heritage is passed on to the next generation. The workshop would also ensure that the children would make for JBB Mandi its own Nakkaras.



The **Nakkara Making Workshop** was conducted during this period by Sh. Jamil Khan, a traditional artiste who is presently an Instructor at JBB Mandi. The basic materials for making Nakkara (Nakkara frame; leather) are only available in specific places and thus they were procured for the workshop from Kanpur and Aligarh respectively.

The workshop is being conducted in two batches. During the first batch of the workshop one group of children made two Nakkaras and learnt the technique of making various parts of the Nakkara such as : Puri-Tikki, Duwal, Ghar, Pendi(Idli), Zanzeeri (Singaar), Kamal Dwal, Ghundi. It was a lecture cum demonstration session during which Sh.Jamil Khan not only demonstrated how a Nakkara Is made but also taught the process to the children by giving them a practical experience of the same. The Children were very excited when they made their own Nakkaras : 2 pairs of it. The next batch will be working on the remaining two Nakkara very soon.

SPECIAL TRAINING FOR CHILDREN OF MEMBER SCHOOL FOR ZONAL COMPETITIONS

Children of member school , including member children participated in activities of Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi and learnt dance (classical and folk) music (vocal and instrumental) and art (paper mashie) for inter zone competitions of Delhi Govt. schools and won many accolades.

CREATIVE WRITING WORKSHOP

A Creative Writing Workshop was organized from 10th Jan to 15th January 2019. The former Director of NBB and an eminent child litterateur was the resource person. It is Dr. Pant who in the year 2017 introduced creative writing to the rural children during a programme “*Meri Nazar me Aazadi*” in association with Publication Division, Ministry of I&B, when the children discovered the poet and writer within them.



On the first day the 25 children who registered delved into the subject and form of writing that would be taken up. Subsequently other children were also drawn towards the workshop seeing the excitement of the participating children.

Altogether 30 children participated in the workshop. Each participant countenance was writ with excitement as they wished to become writers. This workshop was giving them this very opportunity to understand what is article and story writing, the difference between poetry and prose, what is rhyming and how to rhyme, and how climax is important for a story or else it remains only an incident.

The content of the workshop was such that there would at least be 30 literary creations so that a booklet could be published comprising of all these writings, the final result was the “JaduiKalam” which was published and released during Mandi Divas comprising of poems, stories, articles, song, play and riddles. The concept of the illustrations of each writing for booklet production was also by children

The first session was a group activity to compose the song of Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi with input from each participant. The output was the song “Bal Bhavan Mandi hain apna sapno bhara pitara”, which was staged on Mandi Divas. This group activity generated self confidence and also help them understand the precautions that need to be taken while writing poems and songs.

On the third Day of Creative writing workshop the enthusiastic children wrote their own poems and presented it to Dr. Pant, who guided them how to improve upon it.

The special highlight of the workshop was the play where all animals of the forest jointly celebrate the birthday of a tree. Each child contributed in this giving ideas and writing dialogues as per the jungle character in the play. The masks were made by the children and it was also preliminarily staged. The final production was staged on Mandi Divas.

On the concluding day of the workshop the children presented on stage their final writing output. A member child presented the vote of thanks during which a memento made by children was also presented.

MANDI DIVAS

The Foundation Day of Jawahar Bal BhavanMandi.e. 3rd February is observed as Mandi Divas. Jawahar Bal BhavanMandi was founded by Bal Bhavan’s first Chairperson Smt. Indira Gandhi on 3rd February 1972.

This year Mandi Divas was celebrated over a period of three days, 5th& 7th February were the days of preliminary rounds of competitions : art and craft, Dance, instrumental and vocal music and heats of sports events.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Accounts

- a. The Financial Statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention and generally on the accrual method of accounting unless otherwise stated.
- b. Separate set of accounts are maintained by the National Bal Bhavan in respect of Main A/c, GPF & NPS activities and Internally Generated Funds.
- c. All Receipts on account of fees/subscription and refund of unspent grants are accounted on receipts basis.

2. Grants-in-Aid

Grants are recognized on receipt basis & taken to credit of Income & Expenditure account except to the extent of expenditure of capital nature incurred (which amount is credited directly to the capital fund).

3. Fixed assets and Depreciations

- a. Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition less depreciation. Fixed assets received as Gifts by the National Bal Bhavan has been merged with the Fixed Assets of the Society. Books received as Gifts are valued at selling price.
- b. Receipts, if any, on the sale of obsolete/unserviceable assets is taken as income under the head 'Misc Receipts'.

4. Depreciation

- 4.1 During this year depreciation has been charged on Straight line method at the prescribed rate as provided in new format for standardization of accounts issued by MHRD.
- 4.2 In respect of additions to fixed assets during the year, depreciation is provided for full year and in respect of deductions from the fixed assets, no depreciation is charged.

5. Specific Expenses/ Payments

a. Printing & Stationery

The amount spent for printing & stationery, is treated as expenditure as and when incurred. No adjustments are made in accounts for the closing stocks, as the value is not determinable.

b. Telephone Deposit

Deposit for telephone and allied facilities is written off during the year of installation/ commissioning and charges/ expenditure bills are accounted for at the net value.



6. Interest on All Deposits / Investments is accounted for on accrual basis.

7. Employees Salaries / Benefits

- a. Central Government Employees service rules are by and large, made applicable to the employees of the National Bal Bhavan.
- b. Retirement benefits are accounted for on the basis of Actuarial Valuation done by approved valuer as per Accounting Standard 15.
- c. The NBB maintains a separate Notified Provident Fund account for its employees.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

1. Grant received from Government, based on budget approved by the Parliament, constitute main source of receipts of the NBB. Though the grants received (after the adjustment of expenditure of capital nature) are taken to income and expenditure account, the effective income of the NBB is nil in the light of restrictions that without sanction of Government, the unspent balance of Grants cannot be carried over from one financial year to another. Thus this does not attract any Income tax liability.
2. Expenditure on Establishment, Printing and Stationery and Telephone deposits have been given the accounting treatment as per accounting policy.
3. An amount of Rs 93.38 lakhs has been shown as Assistance to State in Schedule-8 (Loans, Advances & Deposits) which were outstanding as on 31.03.2019 due to Non receipt of Utilization Certificates from the State Bal Bhavans.
4. An advance of Rs. 1.60 lakhs has been shown as recoverable from DTC (previous year Rs 1.60 lakhs). Out of total advance of Rs 40.80 Lakhs given to DTC, an amount of Rs 39.20 Lakhs has already been settled with them in the previous years. As informed to us, the balance amount of Rs 1.60 Lakhs is not recoverable, so we suggest that the same should be written off in the Books of Accounts.
5. An advance of Rs 535.71 lakhs has been paid to CPWD as per Schedule-8 (Loans, Advances & Deposits) upto 31.03.2019 (previous year Rs 454.95 lakhs).
6. During the current year, Prior period Income of Rs Nil & Prior Period expenses of Rs 10,70,586/- has been booked.
7. NBB has received funds from MSJE in previous years for special project. Unspent balance amounting to Rs 45,83,283/- (Previous Year is Rs 44,26,363/-) along with interest up to 31.03.2019 is lying with NBB's Canara Bank Account for this Project.
8. An amount of Rs 8,759 is shown as balance lying with Jammu & Kashmir Bank since long. As informed to us, the Bank Branch was in Kashmir & now it is not traceable. It is suggested to write off the same.
9. Sundry Debtors of Rs 3,77,805/- (Schedule-7) remained unrealized and since the balances are outstanding for more than 5 years, it is suggested to write off the balance, in case the same are not recoverable.
10. An amount of Rs 1,14,82,041/- has been shown as BBK Project Expenses along with an amount of Rs 38,54,208/- as BBK Expenses under Administrative Expenses (Schedule-17) which relates to Advances given to State Bal Bhavans in earlier years.
11. Advances made and shown as recoverable are adjusted to final head of account/recovered on receipt of final bill/ receipt from the concerned party/department.
12. In the opinion of the Management of NBB, Current Assets Loans and Advances shall have a value on realization in ordinary course of business, at least equal to the amount at which they are stated in the Balance Sheet. Provision has been made for all known liabilities.



13. The income of the Institution is exempt from Income Tax under Section 10(23c) of Income Tax Act. No provision for tax is therefore made in the accounts.
14. The provisions of TDS on GST are applicable w.e.f. 01.10.2018 vide Notification No. 50/2018-Central Tax Dated 13th Sept,2018.
NBB has taken the GST registration on 20.12.2018 and TDS was deducted w.e.f. the date of registration.
15. An amount of Rs 24,05,362/- has been shows as opening unspent balance of Grant in Schedule-10 (NER General Rs 11,55,362/- & NER Capital Rs 12,50,000/-) and the same has been adjusted from the Corpus Fund (Schedule-1) to rectify the Audit objection raised by CAG as per Audit Report dated 24.08.2018.
16. Opening Balances have been verified by the Management and relied on by us.
17. Previous year figures have been regrouped wherever considered necessary.
18. Figures in the final accounts have been rounded to the nearest rupee.

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of National Bal Bhavan for the year ended 31st March 2019

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of National Bal Bhavan (NBB) as at 31st March, 2019 and Income & Expenditure Account/Receipts & Payments Accounts for the year ended on that date under Section 20(1) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971. The audit has been entrusted for the period up to 2022-23. These financial statements are the responsibility of the National Bal Bhavan's Management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller of Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Report/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
4. Based on our audit, we report that :
 - (i) We have obtained all the information and explanation, except as stated in the report, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
 - (ii) The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account/ Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format prescribed by the Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development.
 - (iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the National Bal Bhavan, except as stated in the report, in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
 - (iv) We further report that :
 - A. **Balance Sheet**
 - A.1 **Liabilities**
 - A.1.1 **Current Liabilities & Provisions (Schedule 3) - Rs. 86.75 crore**
 - (i) NBB received grant-in-aid of Rs. 53 lakh from Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment during 2011-12 for nationwide drive against Alcoholism Substance (drugs) Abuse & Illicit Trafficking and has utilized Rs. 19.25 lakh. The unutilized grant-in-aid of Rs. 45.83 lakh (inclusive of interest income of Rs. 11.99 lakh) as on 31.03.2019 has not been shown under Current Liabilities resulting in understatement of Current Liabilities & Provision and overstatement of Capital Fund by Rs.45.83 lakh. This was pointed in the previous year report but remedial action has not been taken.

(ii) The above includes unutilized grant-in-aid of Rs. 56.30 lakh whereas the unutilized grant-in-aid as on 31 March 2019 is Rs 64.78 lakh. This has resulted in understatement of Current Liabilities and Provision and overstatement of Capital Fund by Rs. 8.48 lakh.

A.2 Assets

A.2.1 Fixed Assets (Schedule 4) – Rs. 5.37 crore

(i) The above does not include Capital work-in-progress amounting to Rs. 56.75 lakh for various works undertaken by CPWD. This has resulted in understatement of Capital work-in-progress (Fixed Assets) and overstatement of Loans and Advances by Rs. 56.75 lakh.

(ii) The Land and Building should be depicted in the Balance Sheet/ Schedule as two separate heads of account. This is being pointed out since 2012-13 but rectification has not been done. This has resulted in incorrect charging of depreciation on land since 2014-15 with consequent understatement of Fixed Assets and Capital Fund (Amount not quantifiable).

The Assets register should also show the area of each land separately as freehold and lease hold.

A.2.2 Loans, Advances & Deposits (Schedule 8) – Rs. 7.20 crore

The above includes advances of Rs. 5.36 crore given to CPWD for various purpose during the period from March 2008 to March 2019. Out of these works for advances amounting to Rs. 3.98 crore has been completed but the adjustment has not been done for want of completion certificate/ Account statement. This has resulted in overstatement of Loans, Advances & Deposits and understatement of expenditure by Rs. 3.98 crore.

B. Internal Receipt Account

Capital Fund (Rs. 386.67 lakh), Current Liabilities (Rs. 00.88 lakh), Fixed Assets (Rs. 31.38 lakh) and Current Assets (Rs. 356.16 lakh including Rs. 183.47 lakh as Bank Balances in saving bank account no. 0158101118475 of Canara Bank and investment of Rs. 144.91 lakh) have been kept outside the main account of National Bal Bhavan. This had been shown separately as accounts of internally Generated Funds.

The Accounts of Internally generated funds (Internal Receipt Accounts) are an integral part of the Accounts of NBB and a consolidated account should be prepared as a whole for the organization to give a complete, true and fair picture of the financial position of NBB. This is being pointed out since 2015-16 but no remedial action has been taken.

C. General

C.1 Investment of Rs. 2.13 lakh made in the Government Securities out of GPF pertaining to the period 1980-83 has been shown in the account. Their related records were not made available to audit. Similarly, the records of Rs.16,759 lying at GPO New Delhi has also not been furnished to audit. This is being pointed out since 2011-12.

NBB replied that the investment was kept in the safe custody of bank. The matter was taken up with the bank and the bank has informed that they have not traced the record of this investment & as per instructions of RBI, bank cannot keep records of more than 10 years in their branch. NBB needs to take decision in this matter.

C.2 NBB Notes to the Account (Schedule 24) indicates that the following amounts are required to be written off:

- An amount of Rs. 1.60 lakh not recoverable from DTC.
- An amount of Rs. 8,759 as balance lying with J&K bank not traceable and

- Sundry Debtors of Rs. 3.78 lakh (Schedule 7) remained unrealized for more than five years.

However, NBB has not written off the above amount from the accounts. This was pointed out in the previous year report but action has not been taken.

D. Grants-in-aid

National Bal Bhavan received Grant-in-aid of Rs. 1875.16 lakh (Grant for creation of Capital Assets: Rs. 84.27 lakh and Recurring Grant: Rs. 1790.89 lakh) from Ministry of Human Resource Development during 2018-19. It had unspent balance of previous year amounting to Rs. 200.68 lakh (Grant for creation of Capital Assets: Rs. 12.50 lakh and Recurring Grant: Rs. 188.18 lakh). Out of the total funds of Rs. 2075.84 lakh, National Bal Bhavan utilized Rs. 2011.06 lakh (Grant for creation of Capital Assets: Rs. 84.21 lakh and Recurring Grant: Rs. 1926.85 lakh) leaving a balance of Rs. 64.78 lakh (Grant for creation of Capital Assets: Rs. 12.56 lakh Recurring Grant: Rs. 52.22 lakh).

E. Management Letter :

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Director NBB through a Management Letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

- v Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of account.
- vi In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanation given to us, the said financial statements, read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the **observation No. B** and other significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report, give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India:
 - a. in so far as they relate to the Balance Sheet on the state of affairs of the National Bal Bhawan, Delhi as at 31 March 2019; and
 - b. in so far as they relate to the Income and Expenditure Account of the deficit for the year ended on that date.

Annexure I to Audit Report

1. Adequacy of Internal Audit System

- The NBB has no internal audit section/Department of its own. It has also no audit manual.

2. Adequacy of Internal Control System.

The internal control of National Bal Bhavan is inadequate due to:

- Non obtaining of utilisation certificates from State Bal Bhavans/Bal Kendras in respect of advances given to them.
- Non adjustment of advances given to CPWD since 2007-08.
- 45 external audit paras were outstanding as on 31.3.2019.
- Non maintenance of accounting manual.
- Non-confirmation of debtors/ loans & advances.

3. System of physical verification of Fixed Assets.

- Physical verification of fixed assets i.e. Furniture and Fixture, Vehicles, Plant & Machinery, Computer and accessories was conducted upto March 2019.
- Physical verification of Books & Publication was conducted upto March 2019.

4. System of physical verification of inventory.

- Physical verification of inventory like stationery and other consumable items was conducted upto March 2019.

5. Regularity in payment of dues.

- As per Accounts, no payment over six months in respect of statutory dues was outstanding as on 31.03.2019.
