In order to provide cross-cultural exposure to our children, every year NBB organizes National children Assembly & Integration camp. This year the theme was 'Sanskriti Sangam: 'Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat' and the aim of theme was to make children understand and generate a sense of unity in diversity.

National Bal Bhavan assisted the Ministry of Human Resource Development in its major programs like Band Competition and Examination Discussion. The programs of our rural unit at Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi, encouraged children to develop self-respect and confidence. During the centenary celebrations of Jallianwala Bagh, the children of Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi participated in poetry, essay writing and other competitions at the Indira Gandhi National Center for Arts and received praise. Under the 'Samagra Siksha', the visit of thousands of children from 2905 government schools brightened the area of National Bal Bhavan.

On the one-year 70th Indian Constitution Day, several programs were organized. Painting as well as poetry and essay writing competition on Biography of Dr. Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar was also organized. The children presented a play called 'Saheb Mere Bhimrao', which depicted the biography of Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar and his principles in a very interesting way and gave a lively depiction of the life history of Babasaheb from childhood to adulthood through various scenes, inspiring everyone from his life.



NBB's aim is to encourage children to learn about themselves and their constantly changing environment, hence, we strive to travel beyond the boundaries of mere books while preserving our core Indian values. This year NBB has added unforgettable historical memories in its good book with the establishment of Air Force Pavilion at by the Indian Air Force.

Introduction



National Bal Bhavan, is an autonomous body under the Department of Elementary Education and Literacy, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India. This institution is a non-formal education center for children between the age group of 5 to 16 years. It was established in 1956, keeping in mind the dream of unmasking learning through the thinking, imagination, creative and entertaining activities for the children, the foundation was laid by the first Prime Minister

of India. Bal Bhavan has taken the form of a movement with 142 affiliated Bal Bhavans and Bal Kendras across the country. Apart from this, a rural Jawahar Bal Bhavan in Mandi village, Delhi and other 49 Bal kendras are also working in Delhi. National Bal Bhavan provides children with different activities and opportunities in accordance with their age, efficiency and strength, to develop children's creativity and skill. This institution provides children a stress free and fear free environment with a great scope of possibilities. National Bal Bhavan and its affiliated institutions run regular programs for children especially for the lower strata of society.

The objective of this organization is to develop the child's creative ability by working on a common platform through various activities, opportunities, deliberations and experiences. Bal Bhavan provides an opportunity to every child and the freedom to fabricate innovative creations by learning through play way method, furthermore it helps to develop their creative potential through activities like dance, drama, music, creative arts, photography, computer etc. National Bal Bhavan, has emerged as a centre where children get their overall personality development at one place through various activities as well as strengthening the spirit of unity.

Every year thousands of children become members of National Bal Bhavan. The institute has started working in 1956 with meager 300 member children but over the years it has increased its membership strength and now lakhs of children are taking advantages of its various facilities. To reach the children of different areas, 49 Bal Kendras were established in many areas of Delhi State. These Bal Kendras fulfill the needs of all the children coming from different strata of society. Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi is a rural unit of National Bal Bhavan, which is working under NBB and provides parallel services to the rural population of surrounding villages. State Bal Bhavans and Bal Kendras have been opened in all parts of the country and remote tribal areas and they are providing similar services everywhere.

Among all activities of NBB, Bal Shree honour is one of the very prestigious scheme to identify and nurture creative children. This scheme was initiated in the year 1995 and further revised in the year 2015. Since its inception it is honouring creative children under four main streams i.e. Creative Arts, Creative Scientific Innovation, Creative Performance and Creative Writing and up to 31st March 2019, total 745 creative children from across the country have been selected for Bal Shree Honour.

Objectives

The objectives of National Bal Bhavan are :

To inculcate faith, self-reliance, sovereignty and moral values among children and make our Nation strong and prosperous. Likewise, providing opportunities for developing creativity among them through creative art, creative writing, creative performing arts, physical education, scientific experiments, photography, and housekeeping via informal education system. Workshops, training programmes are conducted to attain this very philosophy and search talent of children and nurturing them for the purpose.

1. To provide opportunities to children for education and creativity.
2. To provide the children with experiences and activities not otherwise available to them.
3. To offer certain educational services to the local schools in order to enrich their curricular and extracurricular activities.
4. To provide leadership and guidance to teachers towards fostering a creative approach in teaching of art and science.
5. To provide training facilities for recreational workers, and Children's Museum personnel.
6. To offer the Nation a prototype comprehensive children's institution, i.e. to establish an Ideal Bal Bhavan.
7. To develop personality and talents of children through recreation and physical activities.
8. To promote social and cultural contacts amongst the children of all classes and communities.
9. To inculcate such values as would help to develop modern Indian personality with a scientific temper.
10. To promote the above mentioned activities as a movement.

Membership Profile 2019-20

Children take Annual Membership of National Bal Bhavan, Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi and 49 Bal kendras affiliated with National Bal Bhavan. This year 2255 children (including 720 free membership, 16 online membership) obtained membership of National Bal Bhavan and 878 children at Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi and 7856 children at 49 Bal Kendras running in Delhi.

National Bal Bhavan aims for creative development of children in all areas. Children are free to participate in various activities of National Bal Bhavan and these activities have been planned/ designed to ensure overall development of children and enhance their skill and creativity.

In addition to individual membership to children, all Govt. Schools are provided institutional membership free of cost. 21 Public Schools & one orphanage institute obtained free Membership Private School and NGO's can get membership of National Bal Bhavan for a nominal fee.

Activities at a Glance

CREATIVE ART

Creative Art activities are aimed to provide an opportunity to children for their self expression and development of aesthetic sensitivity of children and also to encourage the talent hidden in their personality. These are various activities in creative art, which have been divided under sub-heads which are as follows:-

Integrated Activities

Integrated Activities Section attracts children of all age groups. Children especially of small age group generally take interest in Traditional Arts. Being a multimedia section, children can easily shift from one medium to other media. Creative and value-based games are also developed in this section. Traditional Folk Art created with sticks (instead of brush) and use of natural colours is an added attraction of this section. Children also learn to make toys with papier mache and do paper craft in this section. This section creates awareness about Mehndi art, Warli, Madhubani etc.



Painting



Children in this section express their creativity by drawing and painting with crayons, Water colours, Oil colours, pencil and Charcoal. This activity is equally popular with senior children as well as younger ones. Younger children make drawings as per their imagination whereas senior ones enjoy drawing portraits, sketches, natural scenery and do theme based drawings. Children are also taught Batik, Tie and Dye, Block printing techniques.

Handicraft

Activities in this section are special as children make objects with waste materials such as old newspapers, old magazines, card board boxes, used boxes, bulbs, buttons, embossed papers, thermocol, clippings, seeds, wire, leaves, scrap of trees etc. Children are free to make objects with the help of these items. Creation of beautiful art work & products with waste materials depict the imagination and creativity of children.





Weaving

Weaving activity is an activity where children learn making various artistic items such as wall hangings, Lamp shades, Tapestry, scenery etc. through techniques of weaving. They are motivated to create beautiful objects. They learn different types of knots and weaving patterns and make mats, sceneries and small carpets of their own.



Needle Craft



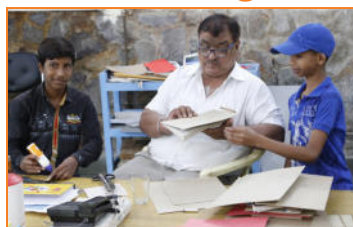
Toy making, puppet making, macrame, crochet work etc are attractions of stitching & embroidery section. Children learn basics of cutting and stitching of clothes and also different type of designing, patch work and creative embroidery. Toy making with cotton fill is also a popular activity of this section. Children learn making wall hangings, different types of stitches which help in developing creativity among children.

Clay Work

Activities in this section are helpful in establishing co-ordination between mind, heart and hands in children. Here children learn making animals, human faces and shapes, sceneries and designs with the help of mould by using paper mache, plaster of Paris and clay. This section provides an opportunity to involve children by using new innovative and creative ideas while giving shape to clay. Potter's Wheel is also used at times for children to learn pottery.



Book Binding



Activities in binding section are also very popular, as children learn how to keep their books safe, and beautiful. In addition they learn technique of binding and making beautiful objects with cardboard, which includes cutting card board, painting, joining etc. Children are also taught how to prepare other items such as candle stand, pen stand, small diary, file covers and many other items.

Woodcraft

Children are acquainted with different techniques used while making various wooden objects. Children also learn how to examine the durability of a particular wood for making various items from wood. Children are also acquainted with making mural through wood cutting on wooden frames and creating drawings with saw-dust is also taught. Children also learn making pen stand, pen holder, small box, toys, pot cover etc. They are also taught to carve wood and making beautiful object from it. They also learn art of making beautiful things from wood dust.





SCIENCE ACTIVITIES

Aim of Science Education is to develop “Scientific” attitude among the children. Science Section is not merely a subject of class laboratory but a part of biggest laboratory that is nature through which children enhance their knowledge about day to day happenings and linking them with scientific principles. National Bal Bhavan believes in adopting various interesting activities for making children understand the basic principles of science. An important aspect of science teaching system of National Bal Bhavan is “Integrated approach” in which other activities becomes an integral part of learning. This section is having different Sub-sections which help children to learn Scientific laws and principles. The children are also taught Physics and Natural Science along with use of science in everyday life. Activities in this section include Radio Electronics, Aero-Modelling, Machine Modelling, Astronomy, Computers, Aquarium and Animal Corner, How and Why club and Environment. All activities section use practical approach to generate interest in science and life related issues.

For children taking part in science activities, it is not necessary for them to have science as a subject in their syllabus, what is important here is that they must have curiosity and desire for learning “Why” and “How”. Film shows and camps are also organized by this section from time to time.

Science section has following sub sections :

Physical & Natural Sciences (How and Why Club)

Children opt for projects under this section, and satiate their curiosity of “How” and “Why” exponentiation through this club. Making creative scientific models, Educational Tour, Science Quizzes etc are some of the activities which invariably enhance knowledge of children and encourage them to learn something new. The workshops are also conducted. Children are also provided laboratory equipments for experiments and scientific games etc.



Inventors Club

Children are encouraged to conduct experiments and learn innovative techniques in this section. As they learn the concept of Machine Modelling and thereafter Designing it, thereby understanding different aspects connected with their project. Children understand how machines are designed using cardboard as base material.

Radio and Electronics club

Children from 10 to 16 years of age are given membership of Radio & Electronics club. Basic Principles of Electronics, wiring, repair of domestic equipment, new experiments in circuits, radio, connecting T.V. parts are various activities undertaken by this club. Children are imparted training in Digital projects, new source of energy such as solar energy models etc. More and more children are having membership of “HAM Radio Club”. Keeping in view of ever rising means of developed communication, Ham Amateurs club has also been launched in National Bal Bhavan for Radio listeners





to enable member children to establish “HAM Station” at their home and establish contact with their dear ones.

Aero Modelling

An expensive hobby such as Aero Modelling is made accessible and easy by National Bal Bhavan to its member children. Children learn the basic principles of wind power and making models of different aircrafts. In addition, they enjoy flying models made by them. Main aim of this activity is to acquaint children with Aviation and related Science and develop interest in this discipline. Children also try experimenting with various designs of aeroplanes, parachutes etc to understand the flying mechanics. Model rocketry workshops are also organised by this section.



Computer



Computer is a very popular activity which attracts children in large number. Children learn basics of computer language and also learn to do programming. Children are provided with software along with computer games. This activity is supplementary to their school education. Internet knowledge is also given by National Bal Bhavan to the children so that they may be well versed with latest system. A number of useful workshops and seminars are also conducted on new systems and procedures. Children learn

photoshop and digital printing techniques. Cyber Security awareness is spread for safety of children and is a regular feature of the section.

Environment

Harit Vahini campaign was started on 19 November, 1986 to indulge children into the mainstream environmental consciousness and activism. Environment Section was created for the implementation of this campaign. This section has grown over the years by expanding the scope of awareness about the most important issues of environment. The section through its hands on activities, field work and project work creates interest in environment amongst children. Ample importance is given to Environment Science and Nature for preservation of natural resources along with preservation of culture, art & craft, folk art and literature, historical monuments etc. Rain Water Harvesting and solar power related projects are given special attention. In addition to it many projects related to Environment are undertaken and children are taught through field visits, surveys, waste recycling etc. To reach out to maximum member of children and create maximum awareness, a National Conference of Young Environmentalist” is being organized since 1990. Children from different parts of the country participate in this meet and interact on various aspects of environment and discuss the social, emotional and cultural part of this.





Astronomy

The Sky above holds unknown milky ways having various unsolved mysteries. People are striving to solve these mysteries from time immemorial. A lowcost astronomical unit has been established in Bal Bhavan. Children enjoy activities in this section. They remain curious to have more and more information about stars and sky above. In the past years Astronomy Section conducted Telescope making workshops for Delhi school children and at an International level for SAARC countries.

Aquarium and activities related to animal corner

Children get basic information about zoology and animals in this section. This section organises workshops related to “Make your own aquarium” and provide information about animals. Children get information regarding the concepts of adaptations, viscosity, marine life, aquatic plants, etc. and learn morphology, food habits and habitations etc. of pet animals.

LIBRARY ACTIVITIES

National Bal Bhavan has a library with a large number of interesting books for children. These books are on Art, Craft, culture, Science, Mathematics, Mass media, computers, stories, fiction and poetry etc., along with a reference section. Books in Hindi, English, Urdu, Tamil and Bangla languages are also in the library. Various journals, magazines are also available in the library. Apart from reading activity this section also organises activities on creative writing for children.



PHOTOGRAPHY

In National Bal Bhavan children are acquainted with various aspects of photography such as history of photography, basics of camera, digital camera and technique of handling a digital camera for clicking photos of various themes like nature, portrait, model, project, Industry etc. Importance of light, natural light and time of clicking photos is an integral part of teaching photography. Children take photo of people, animal, birds, their habits, various movements, people living in different habitats and their life styles. Children are learning to make Coffee Table book using Photoshop techniques.





Videography classes and workshops are also conducted by this section. Where children prepare video programmes. Team of Children perform activities such as script writing, camera handling, dialogue, and voice recording to film production under the supervision of their Instructor. Photography section also organises exhibition of the photos on various themes covered by children to motivate them. The section also organises specific photography courses for adults.

Main attractions of this section are:

- Digital Photography
- Photoshop techniques for digital enhancement.
- Field visits and heritage walks to take pictures of nature, monuments etc. and making a photo journal.
- Photo exhibition and display is also done towards the end of a training programme
- Photography training programme is also organised for adults.

PERFORMING ARTS

Performing Art provides opportunity to children to develop their imagination with the help of various activities and translate it into action to recognize their talent. Children learn Dance, Drama, Music, Instrumental Music, Vocal music etc. Children also acquaint with traditional folk music and dance of different cultures.

Performing Art Section consists of the following Sub-sections:

- Vocal Music (classical & folk)
- Instrumental Music (percussion and string instruments of Indian origin)
- Classical Dance (Kathak, Bharatnatyam)
- Folk Dance
- Drama





PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Sports and physical activities are favourite of children of all age groups. National Bal Bhavan provides various type of sports activities to children such as: Table Tennis, Badminton, Football, Cricket, Basket Ball, Judo and Skating etc. It has its own Gymnasium for exercise. Children not only get information related to these sports but are also encouraged to develop their own creative and interesting games.

Judo has added many proud moments for this institution. National Bal Bhavan has had the privilege to train such children who have proved themselves not only at National, but international level also. Physical Education Section conducts inter school tournament in which children of various schools and institutions actively participate and enjoy.



Skating is also very popular among children and perhaps National Bal Bhavan has one of the best skating rinks in Delhi. Physical Education Section also organize inter school cricket and Foot Ball competitions in Bal Bhavan and children of various schools participate in competitions and enjoy it. National Bal Bhavan's play ground and Physical Education Section are also made available to member schools of National Bal Bhavan. This section also arrange adventures camps, trekking and other field trips as well. Creative games are also organised for children from time to time.

Main attractions of this section are as under:

- Indoor & Outdoor sports
(Table Tennis, Badminton, Cricket, Basket Ball)
- Judo
- Skating
- Gymnasium (Indoor, Outdoor)
- Carom Board
- Shooting



HOME MANAGEMENT

Children are acquainted with good and smooth home management by this section. In this section children try their hand on varieties of dishes. They learn cooking of nutritious and healthy foods so that they may be self reliant. Children are taught how to prepare budget of kitchen and estimation. Regular discussions are held with children about Health & Hygiene and Cleanliness which is useful for them. Various workshops are organized like Flower Arrangement (Ikebana), Bakery products etc.



Main attraction of this section are as under :

- Home Management, Table layout etc
- Cooking and Baking
- Food Preservation
- Flowers Arrangement

MUSEUM TECHNIQUES

National Children Museum of National Bal Bhavan organises theme based exhibition on various occasions and enhances knowledge of children. This is a unique Children's Museum in India. It has permanent exhibition galleries and thousands of children visit the same and these exhibitions supplement and complement the school education curriculum. Another activity of National Children Museum is "Museum Technique Club" which demonstrate techniques of preparing Clay and "Cast" replica from plaster of Paris and children are taught from simple techniques to specific work such as "Piece Mould". In this section children are also taught mounting, script writing and technique for arranging exhibitions etc. Children undergo experience which enhances their knowledge about nature, history, culture, science and technology. Children are educated about our ancient civilization, our history, its ancient heritage and culture as well. Children visit excavation sites to have direct and first hand experience. Special workshops are conducted for children and their visits are also arranged to various historical monuments.





Main attraction of this section are as under :

- Moulding and casting
- Designing Exhibitions
- Historical and Cultural Interactions.
- Preservation and conservation of Museum objects.

PUBLICATION RELATED ACTIVITIES

Publication related activities are conducted during Summer Fiesta. This is a unique programme conducted to enlighten children through publication related activities and by publishing of a Magazine, Newsletter and a special News paper 'Akkad-Bakkar Times' involving children in its editing, sketching and production. In this activity children not only bring out newspaper and journals but also acquaint themselves with various techniques which inculcate creativity and self reliance. Children are taken to various Publication Groups and News Channel Offices. In addition, this section organizes workshops on various subjects such as Sketching of Books, Book Production, Preparation of an Advertisement and Designs etc so that they may have knowledge of various aspects of publication.





National Children’s Museum

National Children Museum is an integral part of National Bal Bhavan which has been designed in line with the psychology of growing children and their curiosity of viewing and looking at the world around them. Museum has a rich collection of precious objects which include Toys from other countries, Stone & Metal objects/items, traditional ornaments, pots and utensils, art and craft items, Instrument, turbans/headgears, aircraft, satellite and information related to historical monuments. National Children Museum is the only institution which enjoys the status of being a National Level Children Museum. National Children Museum advocates this fact that children’s museum is an important source for developing the knowledge of children.

Various exhibitions are arranged in different galleries of this museum, first permanent exhibition and other one is temporary exhibition. One of the galleries of the museum is reserved for temporary exhibition, where exhibitions are organised on a special subjects and special themes.

Permanent exhibition in the museum has a special attraction “Hamara Bharat” is a prominent one (spread over in 8500 sq.ft.) and it displays lifestyle of Indian people, their live culture, rich art and craft, diversity of religion and costumes, progress in science and technology which draws the attention of the viewers and visitors, Gaurav Gatha (spread over in 1855 sq. ft. area) depicts the era of golden past, its culture, wars etc. which has been arranged in chronological order. Surya Gallery (spread over in more than 8000 sq.ft. area) in which importance of “Surya” is outlined along with civilization of Egypt Mesopotamia, China, Greek etc and place and importance of Surya in their civilization is depicted. Origin of surya i.e. the planet and Earth etc. is also shown here, in the other words: presentation of Surya is depicted from both mythological and scientific point of view. Traditional Art and Craft gallery: Treasure for the future generation (spread over in 1700 sq.ft. area) exhibition displays art work of renowned artists. All these exhibition are open for the public.

National Training Resource Centre

Aims and objective of NTRC is to provide integrated training to teachers and adults by Creative methodology and participation in Creative Art, Performing Art and Science activities. Proposals for Training in Physical Education, sports, Library activities are also under consideration. It has been felt that the work and performance of children be given recognition and this can be achieved by training teachers in creativity.

With the help of various media and creative methods, National Bal Bhavan encourages teachers to recognize the sustained imagination and thought process of children, their creative expression, innovation and capacity of originality and thereby enhancing their capability. Talks and demonstration are arranged for rural, semi rural and urban teachers/instructors to make the art as a powerful medium of expression and imparting education.

Integrated Training programs were conducted during the year 2019-2020 in which around 300 adults / teachers received training.





Our Programmes

Detailed Report

AERO-MODELLING WORKSHOP

A 15-day workshop on Aero Modelling was organized at National Bal Bhavan from April 1 to April 15, 2019. Aeromodelling is also an important activity at National Bal Bhavan, where children were encouraged to learn about Aerospace. 80 children from different schools participated in this particular workshop. In this workshop, children were introduced to the history of aeromodelling, principles of flight and aircraft; including various activities. These activities include Model making, Chuck Glider drawings, parachutes making from waste materials and skills of cutting thermomould for Chuck Gliders and Airplanes. Last day of activity children enjoyed flying of Chuk model glider in the premises of National Bal Bhavan.

EARTH DAY CELEBRATION

Earth Day was organized on 23 April 2019 by the National Bal Bhavan. The theme for this year was 'To Preserve its Species'. The event was organized in the Mekhala Jha Auditorium of National Bal Bhavan, with 60 member children including teachers from three schools. The program started with a general discussion on Mother Earth, emphasising our all attitude and contribution towards Mother Earth. All the participants shared their ideas and plans. Theme based presentation was shown to the participants. Children discussed various causes and dangers of extinction of organisms. They also considered the subject of how each organism depends on each other and how the ecosystem is becoming imbalanced due to its extinction. Children put their views on the open platform to solve these problems. Thereafter, by making bookmarks from recycled paper then resolved to protect the species. Subsequently, all the children participated in various activities like paper recycling, poster making and tree plantation in the premises of National Bal Bhavan. The children enjoyed a lot during the session. In the end, snacks were distributed to all participants.



SESSION CONDUCTED BY BRAHMA KUMARI'S

A motivational sermon was organized by the Brahma Kumari Institute on 23 April 2019 at National Bal Bhavan for the importance of stress-free life and adaptation of meditation in our lives. In this program, Mr B.K. Ashish of Brahma Kumari institution gave some information to have a stress-free life and how positive thinking can have a good effect on our common day-work. Brahma Kumari's Ms B.K. Kanya explained and motivated children and staffs how to meditate, by demonstrating meditation forms and made everyone's participated. The program was inaugurated by Mrs Asha Bhattacharjee- Assistant Director (Science) & Program In-charge, by welcoming all the guests. In the end, Shri Mukesh Gupta-Deputy Director (Administration) of National Bal Bhavan thanked all the guests and participants. About 50 participants attended the event.



WORLD BEE DAY

The World Bee Day celebrations were held from 21 to 22 May 2019 at the National Bal Bhavan, where children participated in various interactive workshops. The workshop began with a bee-based discussion; highlighting characteristics of bees. Within the premises of the National Bal Bhavan, children observed many bees and also identified their various parts. They also learned about the life cycle of bees, their communication skills, sexual characteristics, their hives and its structures, and the technique of beekeeping. At the ceremony, the children in depth discussed the importance of bees, special products we get from them, and their importance as pollinators, the dangers they face and their contribution to sustainable development and how they are endangered by human activities. During the ceremony, children were shown a documentary on beekeeping. The next day the children prepared several models of bees with the help of useless papers. 20 member children enthusiastically participated in this workshop.



SUMMER FESTIVAL

This is an annual event of National Bal Bhavan, this time in the premises of National Bal Bhavan, the summer festival was held from May 22 to June 21, 2019. Around 2089 children registered themselves during this summer festival.

In order to arouse other special interest in children, workshops were made available by experts like Ms Rekha for Madhubani artwork, Mr Madan for doll making, Ms Nidhi Bhatnagar for Tie & Dye. These all special workshops were conducted in Sanskriti Shilp Gram of National Bal Bhavan, where experts taught interesting things to children. Museum Technique Club also conducted special activity of moulding casting for children. In the activity, the children were informed about the museum technique club, as well as explaining the importance of the museums and its heritage. They were informed about the importance of our heritage as our identity. The pots and seals found during Indus Valley Civilization and other items found in the Earth digging provide information about the living conditions of the people during that time. Children were also taught to cast pots and seals in clay. Plaster of Paris was also used to do moulding casting. The whole process increase in the coordination of their hands, brain and eyes.

During the summer festival, around 1000 children participated in around 40 activities of National Bal Bhavan every day - crafts and art, painting, handicraft, weaving, sewing-embroidery, wood art, clay work, bookbinding, tie and dye, physical and natural sciences. (How and Why Clubs), Inventor Club, Radio and Electronics Club, Aeromodelling, Computer, Photography, Environment, Astronomy, Aquarium, Biology and Science Park Related activities and many more.





The Souvenir Shop is a centre in which children can purchase their artworks prepared by them at a very low price under the special guidance of teachers. In the summer session, the children made many of their artworks to give as gifts to their friends and brothers, sisters etc.

No Tobacco Day was also observed on 31 May 2019. On this occasion, performance section instructors taught the children a song about not consuming tobacco and a short drama related to the same subject was prepared and presented by the children. In the end, the Deputy Director of National Bal Bhavan, I/c programme administered an oath to the children 'Not to consume tobacco'.

The World Environment Day celebration was observed from 06 to 8 June 2019. On this occasion, Mrs Usha Chhabra, an expert of storyteller was invited at National Bal Bhavan and she narrated the stories for our member children. Through her stories, she encouraged children to eradicate pollution through a story 'garbage dump'. During this time, children were informed about keeping themselves and their surroundings clean so that they could get rid of diseases. On this occasion, children were taught to make paper bags by waste Material so that they could use them according to their needs. They were also taught by the West Material to build a nest, its importance and told the children that as we need a home for ourselves and our safety. Likewise, the animals and birds of our environment also needed to be safe.

On June 12, 2019, a drawing competition was organized by the Bonn Company on 'Save the Trees', in which around 1200 children participated. Packed biscuits were gifted to all children by the Bonn Company and prizes were also presented to the winning children. Also, a storytelling workshop was organized for the children, for which storytelling expert Mrs Usha Chhabra conducted an activity to create and tell a story to different groups of children and then children gave a skit performance on different stories created by them.

A painting competition was organized on the occasion of Cyber Safety Carnival at National Bal Bhavan till 14 June 2019. In which the children made posters, pictures along with various suggestions for cyber safety, an exhibition was organized in NTRC Hall. The best three paintings were selected and honoured by an expert invited from the Cyber Peace Foundation. During this programme, the students' short film 'Internet Ka Bawal' was also shown. Students reported that the online 'competition examination' website is available and they put it into practice, this response was very positive for the program. 80 children participated in this workshop.

On June 15, 2019, some officers of the Public Health Department, North Delhi Municipal Corporation, gave interactive lectures on how to avoid diseases like dengue, malaria and chikungunya to our member children and employees. He told that dengue, malaria and chikungunya spread by mosquito bites, and this mosquito originates in clean water. They gave many suggestions to avoid these diseases like -

1. Dry the coolers once a week and fill them with water again. If it is not possible to drain the water, add one tablespoon of temephos granules/ petrol/ kerosene.



2. Keep water pots/ buckets/ basins covered.
3. Do not keep the broken utensils and tyres etc. in the open. Rainwater may collect in them.
4. Keep empty pots upside down.
5. Wear clothes that cover the body completely so that mosquitoes do not bite.
6. Change the water daily of sparrows, drinking pot, the de-frost tray of fridges, moneyplants, Fengshui plants etc.

On June 19, 2019, a workshop was organized on the problems faced on the Internet and to get solutions, in which the painting competition was earlier conducted on 14 June 2019 at National Bal Bhavan on 'Cyber Safety Carnival' where children prepared internet security slogans and later for the same work exhibition was put-up at NTRC Hall. The Chief Guest of this workshop, Ms Nisha Dua and the employees of Cyber Peace Foundation spoke about the issues related to children cybersecurity. The best three paintings in the exhibition were selected and honoured.

On 20 June 2019, Dr Ramesh Pokhriyal Nishank - Union Minister, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Shri R.C. Meena - Joint Secretary, Mrs Ritu Agarwal - Director - Ministry of Human Resource Development and Deputy Secretary and Mrs Rashi Sharma -Director; National Bal Bhavan visited the activities of National Bal Bhavan.



On June 21, 2019, International Yoga Day and Summer session concluding ceremonies were held. An exhibition of artefacts made by children during the summer session was put up at reception area. On this occasion, some members of the performing arts section sang melodious songs, some children performed dances and some children presented drama on 'Cheh maha ka jhoot' (Six months Lie). Thereafter, some children of Physical Education Section performed yoga postures and skates. On this occasion, Yoga postures were practised by children by yoga expert Ms.Rajni Saxena. *Yogasanas* and yoga activities were displayed through clay mannequins. Teachers gave wings to the creative thinking of the members of the Museum Technique Club. *Yogasanas* were done by children and all staff. Refreshments were distributed to about 1500 children.

International Yoga Day was also celebrated in various child centres of Delhi and about 30 state-level Bal Bhavans.

COMPUTER AWARENESS PROGRAM

A computer awareness program was organized on 16 May and 17 May 2019 at National Bal Bhavan. On this occasion, children were told about cyber security and Digital India. During this time the internet scenario was presented using the computer, android mobile etc. In our



daily life how internet is useful, a debate program on this subject and the film 'Internet Ka Bawal' which is related to fake news/posts, was shown to children. Along with fake reviews in social network sites, children were also told about digital marriages. The children were then briefly explained about cloud computing. About 20 children participated in this program.

COLLABORATIVE PROGRAM ON INTERNATIONAL MUSEUM DAY - MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE

International Museum Day program was organized at National Bal Bhavan on May 17, 2019. The event was attended by 70 children, invited by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change. The program started with the orientation by Dr Jaya Prasun, Scientific officer NMNH. Her interaction with the children is about how they can protect their environment and help their country by adopting environmentally friendly practices in their daily lives, which can promote a good life. A PPT on Green Good Deeds was shown on the occasion which inspired the children to take a scientific approach towards judicious use of natural resources so as to improve their future and take small steps to lessen the pollution around us. All participants were sworn to keep their surroundings clean by adopting good deeds. Thereafter, National Bal Bhavan showed a PowerPoint on the importance of museums for bringing social and cultural awareness and information about various types of museums such as Open Museum etc. was shared with the participants. Children were also told about museums working in various fields like history, natural history, art and culture. After that, the making of useful items from waste paper and newspapers was also demonstrated. The participants made handmade sheets from recycled paper using natural colours such as colours extract from bougainvillea flowers, turmeric, etc. and finally a free toy train journey was given to all the participants. All participants were served lunch by the canteen of National Bal Bhavan. After the meal, participants were taken to the integrated activity section for an activity-oriented session based on arts and crafts. The children were taught the basics of *Madhubani* painting using natural colours. In the end, refreshments were distributed to everyone and a slogan book on table calendars and the environment was also given as a gift.

WORLD NO-TOBACCO DAY PROGRAM

A No-Tobacco Day program was organized at National Bal Bhavan on 31 May 2019. On this occasion, member children presented a play which depicted the bad effect of consumption of tobacco on the human body. About 299 children participated in this program.



HINDI WORKSHOP

A Hindi seminar was organized on 22 June 2019 at National Bal Bhavan. The theme of the seminar was -'How the official language Hindi can be used by following the Unicode rules for conducting classes and official work'. On this occasion, the expert gave participants information related to downloading Unicode in their mobile phones along with computers. Thereafter some written material related to the official language was distributed to the participants. This material included some important information about Official Language Rules and Acts. In this participants were told that simple





and administrative Hindi should be used in official work. The participation of the instructors related to the activities in this seminar showed their enthusiasm towards the official language Hindi as the language of training provided to the children by the trainers in the activities of National Bal Bhavan is the official language. About 1 officer and 34 employees participated in this seminar. Finally, refreshments were distributed to all participants.

VISIT BY THE HONOURABLE MINISTER OF STATE

On July 16, 2019, Shri Sanjay Shamrao Dhotre-Honourable Minister of State- Ministry of Human Resource Development along with 4-5 other officers visited various activities sections running at National Bal Bhavan. During this time, the visiting guests were presented with some artwork made by the children.

PHOTOGRAPHY COURSE

The photography course program was held three days a week i.e. 30 days from July 17, 2019, to September 2019. On the inauguration of this program, Mr Mukesh Gupta-Deputy Director (Administration) and Mrs Asha Bhattacharjee (Program In-charge) discussed about photography workshop with the participants. Subsequently, the course program was started. Expert-Mr Ratan Sonal was invited for the event. The expert told the participants about Photoshop and Photoshop tools. Senior and renowned artist Ms Latika Kat Ji was invited for the course program. She informed the participants about photography. In the course, the participants were introduced to the technique and art of photography and were detailed about various aspects of photography. A former student of NBB, Mr Ajay Chauhan also gave information about the use and possibilities of digital photography. Senior instructors took their adult students for an official visit to Jaipur and Sanganer (Rajasthan) from September 6, 2019, to September 9, 2019. About 41 students participated in this program. Finally, the participants were awarded certificates.

INDIAN AIR FORCE FACILITY CUM PUBLICITY PAVILION - INAUGURATION PROGRAM

On July 31, 2019, the inaugural function of the Facilitation cum Publicity Pavilion of the Indian Air Force was organized in the premises of the National Bal Bhavan. It was inaugurated by Honourable Union Minister Dr Ramesh Nishank Pokhriyal- Ministry of Human Resource Development and Shri B.S. Videos related to Indian Air Force exercises/operations, Indian Air Force models, Digital Flex, LED displays etc. are all placed attractively so that the facility is available to children. Through this, children will be encouraged to choose the Indian Air Force as a career option.

The guests reached the Open Air hall and lighted the lamp and welcomed more than 2500 children from different schools and their instructors. Addressing all the participants present in the programme, Hon'ble Union Minister Dr. Ramesh Pokhriyal Nishank - Ministry of Human Resource Development, was very happy to see the crowd of children and told that National Bal Bhavan is a paradise for children. This established pavilion will shape children's dreams to become pilots in the Indian Air Force. He wholeheartedly inspired the children to develop a love for the country and to make this country the best place as far as possible. He also stressed that India is a great country and the Indian Air Force is one of the best force in the world. The Union Minister also said that he would request Army Chief General Bipin Rawat to establish an army themed pavilion at the National Bal Bhavan. Finally, he requested Hon'ble Minister of State Shri Sanjay ShamraoDhotre to take the National Bal Bhavan to greater heights.

Shri B.S. Dhanoa (PVSM, AVSM, YSM, VM, ADC) Indian Air Force Chief with the assistance of the Air Force employees released their latest 3D mobile game on Single Combat First Phase (Single Player Campaign) through a mobile application. The 'Indian Air Force' mobile application will highlight the various missions and air combat scenarios carried out by the Air Force in an engaging way, which will fascinate the tech-savvy generation. A student played the game on stage after being released to inspire everyone. The Indian Air Force chief said in his address that the next level of the mobile app game will be released in October 2019. This app 'Indian Air Force - A Cut Above' will attractively highlight the various missions and air combat scenarios carried out by the Indian Air Force to immerse the player in the game. The game features a single-player offline campaign as well as a multiplayer (player vs. player) online campaign, with a total of ten operational missions, with thirty submissions with a strong and engaging storyline. The mission has various fleets of aircraft operated by the Air Force, aiming to include participants over the age of fourteen. The player will be awarded incentives in the form of playing 'Wings' of new level etc. on achieving various milestones in the game.

Some children of performing arts section presented cultural programs on the occasion. The theme of the cultural program was patriotic and included songs and dance arts from various states of India. Bookbinding workshop was organized at National Bal Bhavan from 27 August 2019 to 31 August 2019. In this workshop, the children learned to stick and stitch torn books, cut and paste cardboard, learned art of bookbinding and plastic binding, and also made note pads and sketchbooks, drawing files, diaries. 22 children participated in this workshop. Participation certificates and refreshments were distributed to children every day.

SINGLE-USE PLASTIC FREE CAMPAIGN PROGRAM

Single use plastic free India programme was organized at National Bal Bhavan from 28 August 2019, to 2 October 2019, concerning the call of Hon'ble Prime Minister. Staff and children of the National Bal Bhavan were told by the environmental trainer that single-use plastic is put on most landfill sites after use, it chokes water supply and drainage systems and its non-biodegradable, So the single-use of plastic should be avoided and the plastic items lying in the surrounding areas like crates, bottles, glasses, thermocouples, carry bags, plates etc. should be recycled in activities. Other measures to avoid the use of single-use plastic materials were also mentioned. A nationwide campaign has been launched to make India single-use plastic-free.



COMPUTER WORKSHOP FOR CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

A three-day computer workshop was organized for children with special needs from August 28, 2019, to August 30, 2019. About 22 children and 6 instructors participated in this workshop.

28.8.2019 - First day - Children were told about the computer and its parts through multimedia presentation, animation and visuals explaining the computer basics as well as to show them 'How the show mouse and play base mouse, keyboard, CPU, etc. work.

29.8.2019 - Second day - Information related to multimedia was given in which the paintbrush was taught using ID, PIX of multimedia software, then the children also practiced it on the computer.

30.8.2019 - Third day - Teacher told the children about "what is digital and online work? Why is digital needed now? How can it work for the common man?" It was also explained how to talk with the help of video and multimedia.

With this, the workshop was concluded and the Deputy Director-Administration blessed all the participants, and certificates were provided to all the participants. Finally, refreshments were distributed to all participants.



STITCHERY WORKSHOP

A three-day sewing workshop was organized from August 29, 2019 to August 31, 2019. The sewing instructor told the member children that appliqué art is a traditional art dating from the time of Mughals. Teacher gave full knowledge of the usefulness of the art, the materials used etc. to children. During the workshop, children were taught to draw different types of patterns, cutting on pattern paper, cutting pattern paper cut on cloth. Thereafter, they were taught to make stitches used in this art, with the help of which the children learned to sew the pattern onto the cloth. Children were taught to make fabric flowers, leaves, butterflies, lion patterns, gardening patterns, elephant patterns, dolls, strawberries, and cherry patterns, etc. to decorate craft products made of any kind of fabric. 35 children participated in this workshop. In the end, refreshments were distributed to the children, and certificates were provided.



HINDI PAKHWADA

'Hindi Pakhwada' was celebrated from 3 September 2019 to 17 September 2019. The purpose of this program was to promote the official language Hindi and to motivate all employees to do maximum official work in Hindi. During the 'Hindi Fortnight' 9 competitions were organized for the staff - general knowledge, poetry writing, noting-drafting/draft writing, writing articles/story based on the given picture, essay writing, competitions for school children, Hindi typing, write words in pure form, dictation, etc. Two of these competitions viz dictation and words writing in pure form, were kept for the MTS staff for these competitions were also organized for



member school children, children of Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi, and Bal Bhavan Kendras. The sole purpose of this event was to inculcate affection towards Hindi from a young age and motivate children to use the official language of the country and also their mother tongue. In the same context, on 12 September 2019, for the two age groups of children; 10 to 12 and 13 to 16 years old, 'Self created poems (Poetry Composition) and Presentation Competition', 'Writing paragraphs based on the given lines', 'Poster making and slogan writing' and writing sentences Competition were organized. The result of the Hindi fortnightly competitions was prepared by Mr. Ved Prakash Gaur - Director, Ministry of Culture, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi. Along with the Hindi fortnight, activities related to cleanliness fortnight were also conducted. All the employees carried out cleaning operations in their respective sections and took out the junk.

The award distribution program of the Hindi Fortnight program was organized on October 31, 2019. All the employees and winner children participated on the occasion. First, second, third, and two consolation prizes were placed in each competition. On this occasion, Mr. Mukesh Gupta - Deputy Director (Administration) and Assistant Director - Science / In-charge Program jointly gave away the prizes to the winning contestants. Along with certificates, useful books, materials related to painting were awarded to children and cash prizes, and certificates were awarded to employees. In the end, Mr. Mukesh Gupta-Deputy Director (Administration) congratulated the children and employees on receiving the awards and explained that Official Language, Hindi is a very simple and easy language, to use it in any kind of official work and its practical use should be encouraged. Do not hesitate; only need to change your thinking, only then the official language will be successful in reaching its zenith. Finally, refreshments were distributed to all participants.

CLEANLINESS FORTNIGHT PROGRAM

A cleanliness fortnight was organized at the National Bal Bhavan from September 3, 2019, to September 18, 2019. On this occasion, the employees of all the activity rooms took out the old junk and cleaned it to keep the area around them clean. On September 14, 2019, all staff and member children planted saplings on the premises of National Bal Bhavan. During this time, the employees of all the activity sections also carried out the recycling activity according to the time table, from which they learned to prepare various items.

TOUR PROGRAM UNDER SAMGRA SIKSHA

Tour program under Holistic Education was organized from September 4, 2019, to January 2020. Under this, 2905 children from various government schools of Delhi along with their teachers visited the National Bal Bhavan. These children got information about National Bal Bhavan and participated in many activities of National Bal Bhavan.





STITCHERY WORKSHOP

One-day programme was organized on 14 September 2019 at National Bal Bhavan. In this workshop, children were taken for visit to 'Shankar International Doll Museum' where the dolls from different countries are displayed. About 30 children participated in this workshop. Participation certificates and refreshments were distributed to children.

SEWING WORKSHOP

A sewing workshop was organized on 17 September 2019 at National Bal Bhavan. In this workshop, under the cleanliness fortnight, children were taught to cut and sew cloth bags and they were also taught to decorate the bags by embroidery on the bag, lace, and patchwork. It was recommended to use cloth bags in place of plastic bags which were intended to make children aware to keep the environment clean. 10 children participated in this workshop. Participation certificates and refreshments were distributed to children.

PAINTING WORKSHOP

A painting workshop was organized at the National Bal Bhavan from September 18, 2019 to September 20, 2019. In this workshop, Gond art, Warli art, charcoal drawing, use of watercolours, use of poster colours, mixing colour with colour, and making other colours were taught. 15 children participated in this workshop. Participation certificates and refreshments were distributed to children every day.



HANDICRAFT WORKSHOP

The handicraft workshop was organized at National Bal Bhavan from 24 September 2019 to 26 September 2019. In this workshop, children were taught how to make Gandhi Ji's picture by crafting and sticking wool on the outline (around the picture) and fill the space with collage materials like newspaper, cardboard, and foil paper. 30 children participated in this workshop. Participation certificates and snacks were distributed to children every day.



WORKSHOP ON THE SUBSTITUTES OF PLASTICS

From 24 September, 2019 to 4 October, 2019, a workshop on 'Plastic Substitutes' was organized under the *Swachh* Bharat Mission on the occasion of 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi at the National Bal Bhavan. 107 participants participated in this workshop. The participants watched documentary on Gandhi Ji's and understood the power of non-violence, honesty and truth, and also about the various movements and struggles of our country which led us to freedom, as well as about importance of cleanliness in our lives. Children watched documentaries related to plastic pollution and its impact on our environment. Children also discussed plastic pollution and the alternatives to plastic that can replace the use of plastic in our daily life. The children recycled waste paper and made files and envelopes from it. In addition, the children also learned the technique of making paper bags and also made envelopes from newspapers. Finally, all the participants also carried out tree plantation activity on the campus. After that, certificates were given to all the participants.





BOOKBINDING WORKSHOP

The binding workshop was organized at National Bal Bhavan from 25 September, 2019 to 27 September, 2019. In this workshop, children were taught simple binding techniques, note pads making, etc. About 22 children participated in this workshop. Participation certificates and refreshments were distributed to children every day.

HINDI WORKSHOP

Hindi workshop was organized at the National Bal Bhavan on 27 September 2019 for the quarter of July to September 2019. Mr. Shyam Sundar Kathuria, Joint Director (Official Language), from Employees State Insurance Corporation, New Delhi was invited as expert in this workshop. The theme of the workshop was - Discussion/solution to the questions asked in the competition papers setup under the 'Hindi *Pakhwara*' (3-17 September 2019) program.

An expert said that every participant in Hindi competitions writes well according to his/her discretion and intelligence, but after receiving the prize, there is always doubt in their mind that they wrote good but accordingly did not get the prize. We often make minor mistakes without our knowledge which also have an impact on the result of the competitions. If these mistakes are taken care of and rectified in time, then along with excelling competitions, we may be able to implement Hindi in the office work smoothly. After this, the discussion on question papers started. Discussion first started on the noting-drafting competition. According to the questions asked in this competition i.e., official language policy, classification of states in terms of an official language, Hindi conversion of official words used, writing of marks in *Devanagari* script, noting, tender, idioms and phrases, pure form of impure words were explained very finely. Apart from noting-drafting, information related to writing was also given on other topics of competitions. 20 employees attended this workshop. Finally, refreshments were distributed to all participants.

PEACE AND EQUALITY PROGRAM '150TH BIRTH ANNIVERSARY OF MAHATMA GANDHI'

From September 27, 2019 to October 1, 2019, the 'Peace and Equality' program was organized on the occasion of the 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi at National Bal Bhavan. In this event, on September 27, 2019, all the employees performed *Pranayam* for inner peace. An exhibition by the photography section was put up. Along with the Deputy Director-Administration of National Bal Bhavan, staff and member children offered *Shramdaan* and did *Shanti* march and planted trees in the premises of National Bal Bhavan by planting about 200 saplings.

On September 28, 2019, all employees performed *Pranayam* for inner peace. The children of vocal section performed music performance on peace and equality and the children of the Drama





section presented a play on cleanliness on theme 'Gandhi Ji Ek Soch'. In this drama, along with Gandhi's biography, how Gandhi Ji had abandoned British clothing and adopted *Khadi*, and things related to adopting cleanliness were also shown.

On September 29, 2019, all the employees performed *Pranayam* for inner peace. Some of the member children participated in the creative writing and extempore speech program. Thereafter, the children were taken for a visit to the Wonder Park made from waste materials in which around 100 children participated. Finally, refreshments were served to the children.



BOOKBINDING – WORKSHOP

A two-day binding workshop was organized at the National Bal Bhavan from October 9, 2019 to October 11, 2019. In this workshop, children were taught to make sketchbooks. 23 children participated in this workshop. Participation certificates and refreshments were distributed to children every day.

STITCHERY – WORKSHOP

A doll-making workshop was organized at the National Bal Bhavan from 9 October, 2019 to 10 October, 2019. The aim was to develop children's artistry and creativity. In the workshop, children were taught to make dolls using pieces of waste clothes and also to make their colourful and different types of costumes. Children learned to make different types of dolls. 30 children participated in this workshop. In the end, participation certificates and refreshments were distributed to the children.

EYE CHECK-UP CAMP BY NEERA EYE CENTER AND LASER VISION

On October 10, 2019, a camp was organized at the National Bal Bhavan by the Neera Eye Center and Laser Vision to examine the eyes of about 100 staff and member children. The staff of NeeraCenter and Vision also informed the participants about eye care.



PRIME MINISTER INNOVATIVE LEARNING PROGRAM (DHRUV)

From October 12, 2019 to October 25, 2019, under the Prime Minister's Innovation Teaching Program, a camp was organized at the National Bal Bhavan in which 60 talented children





(selected after the National Talent Search Performing Arts Competition) from different regions of India came with their 20 escorts. This program aimed to motivate the students to contribute to society. On this occasion, the National Bal Bhavan was decorated with great pomp and show. The theme of this program was 'Prime Minister's Innovative Learning Program for Dhruva Children of India'. Children living in this camp were given welcome jute bags containing items for general consumption. The welcome bag contained fruits, snacks, dry fruits, packets of biscuits, chocolate, etc. All the children went to Delhi-Darshan with Deputy Director-Administration and their escort on 13 October 2019. These children participated in the activities of the National Bal Bhavan. A food festival was also organized for these children on October 20, 2019.

DIWALI CEREMONY

A Deepawali festival program was organized on 26 October 2019 at National Bal Bhavan. About 250 children and employees participated in this program. On the occasion, performing arts section employees performed colourful cultural dances and songs on Deepawali in the village area of National Bal Bhavan and some members of National Bal Bhavan and some parents gave speeches on the importance of the holy festival of Deepawali. Deputy Director (Administration) - Shri Mukesh Gupta, wished all the participants Happy Diwali. In the end, bread-pakodas, moong dal halwa and tea were distributed to all the participants.



NATIONAL INTEGRATION DAY

National Integration Day was organized on 31 October 2019 at National Bal Bhavan. About 100 children and employees participated in this event. The participants took the oath of unity in the open-air theatre and the instructors from all the activity sections explained the meaning of unity to the member children present in their respective sections and explained about Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel's contribution to a unified India. All participants took out a rally on unity around the open ground of National Bal Bhavan. Finally, refreshments were distributed to the participating children.





VIGILANCE AWARENESS WEEK

A program on Vigilance Awareness Day was organized at National Bal Bhavan from October 28, 2019 to November 2, 2019. During the event, all the employees took oath against corruption on October 31, 2019 and took out a walking tour, raising slogans to remove corruption with placards and banners around the premises of National Bal Bhavan.



STITCHERY - WORKSHOP

A two-day sewing workshop was organized at National Bal Bhavan on November 5, 2019 and November 6, 2019. In this workshop, the children were taught to make Mr. Potali Toy, in which small potlies or bundles were made and joined together to make dolls and soft toys. Through this workshop, creativity, and artistry developed in children. About 25 children participated in this workshop. Participation certificates and refreshments were distributed to these children.



NATIONAL CHILDREN ASSEMBLY AND INTEGRATION CAMP

The three-day National **Children Assembly** and Integration Camp 2019, with the theme - "Sanskriti Sangam: 'Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat'", was organized from 14 November to 16 November 2019. The purpose of this camp was to help children to understand and appreciate the diverse culture of the country. In this program, children and member children of 37 Bal Bhavans and Bal Bhavan Kendra's, from 17 states all over the country, members of National Bal Bhavan, members of Mandi, Jawahar Bal Bhavan and children of some government schools in Delhi participated. 2500 children participated on 14 November and 500 children participated on 15, 16 November, 2019. This year too creative workshops for children by external experts and internal trainers such as - Calligraphy, Pottery, *Madhubani*, *Shajhi* Art, and Box Making, Puppetry, Batik, Storytelling, Painting, Environment, Radio & Electronics, photography, Aero Modelling, Fun Games, weaving, binding, wood art, needle craft, tie and dye, etc. were held for three days.

On November 14, 2019, Chief Guests of National Bal Sabha were Mr. Amit Khare-Secretary, Ministry of Human Resource Development and Mr. R.C. Meena-Joint Secretary, Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Human Resource Development (Chairman - National Bal Bhavan). They visited the grand exhibition and 18 stalls and cultural fairs organized in the





premises. For the inaugural program in the Open Air stage. Chief Guest -, Mr. Amit Khare - Secretary, Ministry of Human Resource Development and Mr. R.C. Meena - Joint Secretary, Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Human Resource Development (Chairman - National Bal Bhavan), Director - Smt. Rashi Sharma lighted the lamp. Children sang 'Swasti Vachan'. Thereafter, children performed traditional dances like *Dashavatar*, 'Tehratali' Rajasthani folk songs, etc. on the stage. At 5:00 pm, the drama instructor, Shri Mukesh Kumar Bairwa presented a street play by children. The name of the play was – the effect of using plastic. This play showed how plastic is harmful to us. In the evening, drama experts Mr. Imran Khan (National Bal Bhavan's alumni) and Mrs. Surgana Chatterjee Khan of 'Pitara' presented play on the Chinese culture by telling stories of Chinese Zodiac signs, where they interacted with the children by telling their Chinese zodiac signs and values by their birth year. This programme was not only enjoyed by the children but escorts too, as well as staff of NBB.

On the second day of this camp, on November 15, 2019, at 7:00 am, children and the instructors under the guidance of Dr. Surendra Agrawal, Vivek Bhai Ji, sister B.K. Babitji, Ghanshyambhaiji of Brahm Kumari Institute, did *yoga* and *pranayama*, so that everyone can stay healthy and away from stress. The children of the State Bal Bhavan's of Eastern Region and Southern Region, where 11 teams participated in dance and music performance in the Open Air theatre around 10:00 am. The lecture program was presented by the Indian Air Force from 2:00 pm. Wing Commander Ms. Sneha Singh and Wing Commander Mr. Abhinandan from Air Force Head Quarter motivated the children to join the Indian Air Force. At 4:30 pm the drama instructor Shri Mukesh Kumar Bairwa of NBB presented a play by children. The name of the play was Tullupur Ka Maharaj. In this drama, by showing the cultural meeting of the fair, the children of knowledge about knowing and recognizing their culture was promoted. At 6:30 pm, the principal *Bharatanatyam* dancer of Kala Sangam, New Delhi, Smt. Rukmani Devi Arundel, along with her group of dance, performances performed on classical dances of *Bharatanatyam*. The bonfire was also organized for children in the open ground of National Bal Bhavan at 8:30 pm. During this time all the participants have distributed peanuts, Revdis, Ghazal. Children performed a lot of fun dances.

On November 16, 2019, *Yoga* and *Pranayam* were conducted by Brahm Kumari Sansthan for children and their instructors at 7:00 am to encourage all people to be healthy and stress-free. On the occasion of the closing ceremony, many of the best performances by children such as songs, dances, plays, etc. were presented in front of the Chief Guest - Director-Mrs. Rashi Sharma. Director applauded the program wholeheartedly. In this program, all the children shared their experiences. In the end, participation certificates were distributed to all the participants.



DE-STRESSING SESSION BY BRAHMA KUMARI INSTITUTE

Children and staff were guided by the staff of BrahmakumariSansthan at National Bal Bhavan on November 21, 2019. Ms. Anjali Sister, Ms. Sunita Sister, Ms. Urmila Sister, Ms. Manju Sister, Ms. Anjila Arora Sister, and Mr. Dayal Ji Bhai and Mr. Satish Bhai conducted the session. The school is a spiritual institution dedicated to the artistic development of superior deeds and thinking in human beings. This institution is associated as a non-governmental organization to the United Nations organisation. At present, Raj Yoga and spiritual education are imparted through more than 9000 service centres in more than 137 countries of the world. He also inspired people to join the Brahma Kumari Institute. About 60 children and employees participated in this program. In the end, all the participants were offered Prasad by Brahma Kumari Institute.



ASTRONOMY WORKSHOP

A five-day workshop was organized at National Bal Bhavan from 6 to 8 November 2019 and from 21 to 22 November 2019. This workshop was based on astronomy. Its purpose was to stimulate the minds of all the students by using an easy method to understand the knowledge about the universe and astronomy. In the workshop, children were given information from basic astronomy to advanced astronomy to help students to identify universal facts. The workshop gave information about the theory through video and audio from which they also learnt about satellite and basic rocket science. Children were divided into groups and they made 10 models of Chandrayaan-2. During this workshop, the children were taken for a tour of the Nehru Planetarium which featured an astronomy show under the Dome to make the children fully understand the facts of the universe. Thereafter, they visited the Museum of the Planetarium and learnt about the history of Indian politics at Teen Murti Bhavan. 30 children participated in this workshop. The children were given refreshments every day. Finally, certificates were distributed to all children.



INDIAN CONSTITUTION DAY PROGRAM

Numerous programs were organized at the National Bal Bhavan from 26 November 2019 to 26 November 2020 on the one-year 70th Indian Constitution Day. On 26th November 2019, 50 employees and children of National Bal Bhavan took the oath to make India a total dominion-rich, socialist, secular, democratic republic.

A painting/poetry writing competition was organized on Dr. Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar on November 30, 2019, in which about 100 member children of National Bal Bhavan participated.

On November 28, 2019, an essay writing competition was organized on the life of the Indian Constitution and its writer Dr. Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar in which 150 children participated.





On February 1, 2020, a program was organized to commemorate the birth anniversary of Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar at Mekhla Jha Auditorium of National Bal Bhavan which was attended by about 150 persons (children, parents, employees). On this occasion, two



songs were presented by children which were based on patriotism. Children of the drama section performed a play called 'Saheb Mere Bhimrao' which depicted the biography of Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar and his principles, which was very interesting. A live depiction of the life history of Babasaheb from childhood to adulthood was presented through various scenes. Everyone was inspired by his life. About 50 children participated in the play. The Deputy Director-Administration wholeheartedly congratulated all the participating children for their beautiful performance and boosted their morale. He also praised the drama instructor-Mr. Mukesh Bairwa and said that the way children have done the work of arranging and removing the material before and after each scene is commendable. We should teach our children to do their work together in this way. An employee of National Bal Bhavan was so impressed by the drama that he gave all the children Rs. 2100/- on his behalf.

STITCHERY - WORKSHOP

A three-day sewing workshop was organized from November 26, 2019 to November 28, 2019 at the National Bal Bhavan. In this workshop, children were taught to make tote bags with 'shoulder hangers'. They were first taught to draft bags and make paper patterns, putting a paper pattern on the cloth and making a layout, and then cut the bag on the cloth with its help. Bag sewing was taught on hand sewing machines and trade machines. About 22 children participated in this workshop. The children were finally served snacks and were given certificates.

SKATING TOURNAMENTS - EVENTS

Skating Tournament was organized on 24 November 2019 at the National Bal Bhavan, where Speed skating competition was conducted by S.S.D.C. firm. In which five children of National Bal Bhavan participated and out of these three children (Mohammad Faizan - Silver Medal, Rishabh Mehta - Bronze Medal, Aishwarya Rai - Gold Medal) received the medals. These children encouraged other children and also raised the pride of the National Bal Bhavan.

STITCHERY - WORKSHOP

A three-day sewing workshop was organized from 3 December 2019 to 5 December 2019 at National Bal Bhavan. In this workshop, children were taught to make Umbrella-cut-frock. Teacher taught the children to take all the useful body measurements for the frock, and drafting and making paper patterns according to the measurements of the frock. Finally teacher taught cutting frock with the help of paper patterns and to put 'dart' and 'pluck it' in frock choli. Piping around the neck of the frock, adding arms to the frock's choli and sewing the frock. 20 children participated in this workshop. All children were given refreshments every day and finally the certificates.



ASTRONOMY WORKSHOP

A two-day workshop was held at National Bal Bhavan from 12 to 13 December 2019. This workshop was based on astronomy. The theme of the workshop was 'the constellation of stars' and the purpose of this workshop was to stimulate the minds of children by using easy methods to understand the knowledge about stars and their constellation, so that children can be helped to recognize universal facts.



The teacher, introduced astronomy to children on the first day in which, with the help of the models of Sun, planets, asteroids, meteorites and comet projectors, the origin of the Universe, Big Bang theory and steady states, our galaxy, Solar System etc were explained. The participants learned about the constellation of stars with their zodiac sign.

On the second day, the participants were taught to make static models of different types of constellations of stars than they created their static models in the groups. 27 participants attended the workshop. Refreshments were given to the participants daily in the workshop and finally, certificates were distributed.

HANDICRAFT - WORKSHOP

A three-day handicraft workshop was organized from 17 December 2019 to 19 December 2019 at National Bal Bhavan. In this workshop, the children were taught how to make a pen stand in which they cut four boards of 4-inch x 5-inch and then paste them on a board of 4-inch x 4-inch size. The box was covered with a handmade sheet in all four directions and decorated with flowers. 15 children participated in this workshop. The children were given refreshments daily and were finally given certificates.



WOODWORK - WORKSHOP

A five-day woodwork workshop on 2D-3D artefacts was organized from 5 December 2019 to 11 December 2019 at the National Bal Bhavan. In this workshop, children were first told about the importance of wood. The children were made aware of the process of making a pen stand with wooden pieces and ice cream sticks. Then children learnt to make boats, pen stand, flowers, photo frames, etc. from ice cream sticks. The participants eventually learnt to make a painting by ice cream sticks as well. 15 children participated in this workshop. Refreshments were distributed to these children daily and certificates were finally awarded.

PAPER WEAVING AND MAT MAKING WORKSHOP

A paper weaving and mat making workshop for children was organized from 12 December 2019 to 14 December 2019 at National Bal Bhavan. During the workshop, the participants were informed about the utility of weaving and handloom machines. They were taught the method of paper weaving and mat making. 20 children participated in this workshop. In the end certificates and refreshments were distributed to these children.

CLAY ART WORKSHOP ON SCULPTURE

The workshop on the sculpture by clay section was organized from 12 December 2019 to 14 December 2019 at National Bal Bhavan. During the workshop, participants were informed



about the importance of clay in life and were taught the method of making different types of animals from it. 20 children participated in this workshop. In the end certificates and refreshments were distributed to these children.

MERRY CHRISTMAS

Merry Christmas program was organized on 21 December 2019 (Saturday) at National Bal Bhavan. On this occasion, the Christmas tree was also decorated in the village area of the National Bal Bhavan and the children of the performing arts recited songs and performed colourful cultural programs and the children of the drama section presented a play 'Maryam Meri Maa'. An employee, wearing a Santa Claus dress, distributed red hats, and toffees to all the participants. About 300 employees and children participated in this program. During the Merry Christmas program, water bottles, cakes, chocolates, fruity were distributed to the children and to the employees. Finally, the children were shown the movie 'Claus'.



FESTIVE DAY 'AMOD DIWAS'

On the occasion of New Year, the 'Amod Diwas' program was organized with great pomp on January 1, 2020 at National Bal Bhavan. During the program, Bal Bhavan's Deputy Director (Administration) along with children and staff participated in sports like Musical Chair, Tug of war, Shooting, Lemon, and Spoon Race, Three Leg Race, Badminton Competition, Table Tennis Competition, Optical Race, etc. All enjoyed the games. Thereafter all the participants took lunch in the hostel. About 300 participants attended the event. The winners of the games were awarded first, second, third prizes.



ASTRONOMY WORKSHOP

A three-day workshop based on astronomy was held at National Bal Bhavan from 9 to 11 January 2020. The purpose of this workshop was to stimulate children minds to understand the universe and astronomy. Children got information from basic astronomy to advanced astronomy. It helped children to know universal facts.

Teacher introduced astronomy to children on the first day. In this session, children were introduced to Sun, planets, asteroids, meteorites and comet projectors with the help of the models. The origin of the Universe, Big Bang theory and steady states, our galaxy, Solar System etc. were introduced to the children. All these topics were also covered through video and audio means.

On the second day, participants were told about advanced levels of astronomy. In this session the participants were taught about the rotation and revolution of the moon and earth, solar eclipse and lunar eclipse, globe, latitude and longitude, and time calculation steps.



On the third day, participants were shown a film show called 'Mission Mangal'. The film was related to satellite-Mangalyaan. 36 participants attended this workshop. Refreshments were given to the participants daily in the workshop and finally, certificates were distributed.

LOHRI, MAKAR SANKRANTI, AND PONGAL

Lohri, Makar Sankranti, and Pongal program was organized on 11 January 2020 (Saturday) at the National Bal Bhavan. The village area of National Bal Bhavan was decorated on this occasion. Thereafter, a colourful cultural program was presented by the performing arts section. About 300 participants attended the event. During this time, the Deputy Director (Administration) explained the specialty of this program and significance of these festivals to all the participants. Finally, tea and refreshments were distributed to all the participants.



JUDO CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENT

The Judo Championship competition was held at National Bal Bhavan from 2 to 4 January 2020. The chief guests at this event was Mr. Praveen Saulanki (World Champion Power Lifter) and Mrs. Sonia Sinha. The chief guests were orally welcomed by Mr. Mukesh Gupta-Deputy Director (Administration) and Mrs. Asha Bhattacharjee-in-charge program. 348 boys and girls participated in this judo championship. Out of which 154 boys and girls proved their superiority in different weight classes. Medals and T-shirts were presented to the winning, runner-up children on behalf of the National Bal Bhavan on the occasion. Children from the first team and second teams were awarded trophies. Mr. Mukesh Gupta-Deputy Director (Administration) and Mrs. Asha Bhattacharjee-in-charge program and other assistants addressed the children for good sports spirit and performance. Finally, certificates and refreshments were distributed to all the participants. The objective of this program was to encourage children to perform by providing them a sports platform.



DISCUSSION ON EXAMINATION UNDER 'EK BHARAT, SHRESTHA BHARAT 3.0' - PROGRAM

On 20 January 2020, under the 'Ek Bharat, Shreshtha Bharat' examination, discussion on '3.0' program was organized at National Bal Bhavan. For this program, about 400 children from different states of India stayed in the hostel of National Bal Bhavan from 18 to 21 January 2020 and they shared their views. The main event was held on 20 January 2020 at Talkatora Stadium in Delhi, which was attended by 2200 children from almost all the states of India. Honorable Prime Minister, Union Minister - Ministry of Human Resource Development, Mr. Nishank, and Deputy Secretary, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Mr. R.C. Meena and other distinguished employees of the ministries were present there. Before the arrival of the Prime Minister, the children of the National Bal Bhavan, for the children, performed the Madley and 'Dance of India' and 'Fit India' songs featuring yoga and traditional dance styles. Through dance attempt was made to highlight unity in Ek Bharat, Shreshtha Bharat, Fit India, and unity in diversity. Whose Prime Minister - Shri Narendra Modi Ji, Shri Nishank Ji, Shri R.C. Meena Ji appreciated the performance very much.



STITCHERY – WORKSHOP

A three-day ‘Mirror Work’ workshop was organized from 28 January 2020 to 30 January 2020 at National Bal Bhavan. In this workshop, children were informed about the craft product and were told about its use for the decoration of textiles and other craft products, which are popular in the state of Gujarat. The stitches used in the mirror work were demonstrated to the children. Children learnt to make rings and then add on Mirrors. They made rings using different types of stitches. Through this demonstration, children learnt to make patches equipped with mirror on jute cloth. 20 children participated in this workshop. Refreshments were served daily to all participants. Certificates were distributed to all participants on the last day of the workshop.

PROGRAM ON THE OCCASION OF ‘BASANT PANCHAMI’

Mata Saraswati was worshiped on January 29, 2020 at the National Bal Bhavan to celebrate *Basant Panchami*. During this celebration some children of the performance section sang ‘*Saraswati Vandana*’ and the Deputy Director-Administration, Mr. Mukesh Gupta ji offered garlands and flowers to the goddess. After that, all the participants offered flowers and prayed for happiness. 50 children and 20 employees participated in this program. In the end, sweets were distributed to all the participants.

STITCHERY – WORKSHOP

A seven-day ‘Jute Bag Making’ workshop was organized at National Bal Bhavan from 31 January 2020 to 6 February 2020. In this workshop, children were taught to cut and add a lining of bags in different sizes on jute cloth using a paper patterns. Children learnt to attach the lining to the cut piece of jute bags by cutting the stitch. After that, the use of patches and embroidery stitches on the jute bags was also taught. It was shown to the children how to make jute bag by sewing machine. With this demonstration, the children learnt to stitch jute bag sewing machine. 20 children participated in this workshop. Refreshments were served daily to all participants. Certificates were distributed to all participants on the last day of the workshop.



ON INVITATION BY NCERT – PROGRAM

On February 6, 2020, 14 children from the National Bal Bhavan’s choir group performed at the Indo-Georgia Meet on the Invitation by NCERT. On the occasion children sang the National Anthem, welcome song *Saraswati Vandana*, and series of folk songs, which were highly praised by the attendees.

PROGRAM TO COMMEMORATE ‘150TH BIRTH ANNIVERSARY OF MAHATMA GANDHI’

The program was organized to commemorate the 150th anniversary of Father of the Nation Mahatma Gandhi from 12 February, 2020 to 14 February, 2020.

On 12 February 2020, a series of creative writing activities related to Gandhi ji were organized. In which children wrote the biographies of Gandhi ji, articles related to his movement and also made drawings. About 50 children participated in this program.



On February 13, 2020, 52 children of Government Sarvodaya Bal Vidyalaya, Hari Nagar, were taken to the Gandhi Museum to see Gandhi's Exhibit, where the exhibition was explained by Ms. Nidhi Saryal. The children got information about Gandhi ji and took inspiration from his life and teachings. The children vowed that they will move forward in life, following the path of truth and non-violence.

MATRIYA BHASHA DIWAS

Matriya Bhasha Diwas was organized on 21 February 2020. On this occasion, various programs were also organized for the children of government schools participating in the three-day activities, where 605 children participated.

Numerous programs for member children of National Bal Bhavan and Staff were organized, like Drama- practice of dialogue in various languages of the country in Natyashastra; singing activities in which children and staff sing songs of native languages like Himachali, Punjabi, Bangla, Rajasthani and other languages too, the lettering activities of embroidery and carving in needle crafts and handicrafts included letter writing in various Indian languages; Wood crafts- participants in wooden squads made slogans / poetry writing / painting / with wood shavings and letters made with wood. Poster making competitions were also organized. Prizes were distributed to the winning children of painting / posters and poetry writing. Children also visited museum galleries for information about the culture of our country. 45 children and 30 staff members participated in the event. The dance section instructors performed two folk dances with the children. In the end, Deputy Director-Administration-Mukesh Gupta wished everyone a happy Holi and requested everyone to be vigilant and increase their immunity





by eating healthy and do exercise to fight the corona virus. On this occasion Gujiya, Thali, and Pakoras were distributed by all the participants on behalf of National Bal Bhavan and sanitizers were also distributed to all. 200 participants and children participated in this program.

REPORT ON INTERNAL COMPLAINT COMMITTEE

An internal complaint committee to look into cases related to sexual harassment of women at workplace (Act of 2013) was constituted at National Bal Bhavan on 19 March, 2019. DD(PC&R), Smt. Indrani Chaudhary is the Presiding officer of this committee, which has Smt. Asha Bhattacharjee (AD Science), Sh. S.K. Sharma (OIC BBK), Smt. Parminder Bosu (Programme Organiser), Sh. Dinesh Kumar (Section Officer) of NBB and Dr. Sudha Nautiyal (Programme Coordinator) of Centre of Youth (NGO) as its members . In the year 2019-20, no complaints from any female employee of NBB was received by the committee. Only one case was marked to the committee, which was not a case of “Sexual Harassment of Woman” but as “Harassment” case. A broader view was taken by the committee and after detailed hearing the report thereof was submitted within the stipulated time given to the committee on 5 April, 2019.



Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi

A scheme for establishment of Jawahar Bal Bhavan was launched in the mid of sixth decade and it was termed that these Bal Bhavan will be Nodal Agencies for more Bal Bhavans in the states, in this manner number of Bal Bhavans were established in various states of the country. Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi was an extension of this very scheme, which was financed by Nehru Memorial Fund in the initial stage. Rural Bal Bhavan, Mandi started its functioning from the “Chaupal” of Mandi Village.

At present, Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi is established on 3.75 acres of land provided by Gram Panchayat, Mandi and this Rural Unit was inaugurated by Smt. Indira Gandhi on 3rd Feb, 1973. This Rural Centre caters to the needs of children of Manglapuri, Gwal Pahari, Mehrauli, Jaunapur, Gadaipur, Sultanpur, Bandhwadi, Asoula, Aya Nagar, Ghitorni, Chhattarpur, Maidangarhi, Rajpur, Satbari, Chandhaura, Fatehpur Beri, Dera, Bhati Mines and Neb Sarai Villages.

Physical Education, Art & Craft, Stitching, Wood Craft and Clay works, Percussion, Dance are included in the activities of Jawahar Bal Bhavan. Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi has created thrust amongst children from rural areas and on demand photography and computer activities have also been included.

878 children were registered in 2019-20 session and Thousands visitors visited Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi.

CENTENARY OF JALIAWALA BAGH

7th September, 2019 – Theatre depicting life and Struggle of Mahatma Gandhi was being prepared to mark his 150th Birth Anniversary preparation under the direction of Sh. Shankar Dey who is giving his services voluntarily since the last 3 years in Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi. The theatre was being further fine tuned during this period.

26th September, 2019 – On 26th September was the final rehearsal of play Struggles of Mahatma Gandhi prior to it's staging on 3rd October to mark 150th Birth Anniversary of Bapu.

OBSERVANCE OF 150TH BIRTH ANNIVERSARY OF MAHATMA GANDHI AT JAWAHAR BAL BHAVAN MANDI

Day 1 – 1st October, 2019 : Posters making by children to mark 150th Birth Anniversary of Father of Nation, Mahatma Gandhijicommenced on this day and children were also introduced to Swadeshi Movement and other movements by those related to Swadeshi Movement in an interactive manner.

Day 2 – 3rd October 2019 : On this day also Children participated in poster making activity with the central theme of *Peace and Equality* under the guidance of Sh. J. K. Koli, Manager (Publication) and presented cultural programmes for which they have been preparing for a long time i.e. Theatre on the "Struggles of Mahatma Gandhi" directed by





Sh. Sankar Dey conceptualized and scripted by Sh. Dey and children during a workshop prior to beginning on the play, *Nakkara recital*; Bhajan "*Raghu Pati Raghava Raja Ram*" having been taught by Sh. Jamil Khan, Instructor (Percussion); two presentations in classical style: one on theme song on Gandhiji and "*Mati Pukare Tumhe Desh Pukare.... Einak Pehne, Lathi Pakre Chalet The Who Shaan Se Zaalim Kaapen thar thar thar thar sunkar unka naam re...*" other based on another favourite song of Mahatma Gandhi "*Vaishnav Jan To*" Choreographed by Sh. Pawan Patel, Instructor (Dance). Two small children presented the song "*Sabarmati Ke Sant Tune Kar Diya Kamal..*" and two others spoke of the merits of Swachta and to live in brotherhood. An exhibition showcasing the art work of children on the theme "*Peace and Equality*" and "*Mahatma Gandhi*" prepared under the guidance of Ms. Gangotree Das Gupta, Instructor (Art & Craft) was also put up.

WORKSHOP IN ART AND CRAFT SECTION

ALPANA is a traditional form of Rangoli done usually on floor and wall coated with clay and cowdung. Children were taught ALPANA- a unique expression of Rangolion surface made of grey board, jute, clay, laden with cowdung. After preparing the surface children made some traditional rangolidesigns practiced in various states. Alpana was done through rice paste. There were several processes involved in this.



Process - 1 (Preparation of basic surface) : A grey board cut was marked with proper measurement / dimensions of square shape & then cut accordingly over which another piece of jute mat was fixed for gripping purpose. On the reverse side hanging space was made of aluminum wire.

Process - 2 (Clay and Cowdung) : Children prepared the paste of clay, cowdung and water and mixed them very well. The paste was very carefully rubbed over the cut piece of Jute surface. Two layers were done then the children kept it under the sunlight for drying.

Process - 3 (Polishing of Surface and Drawing) : After drying the surface was polished with sand paper with a soft rubbing. Children made drawing with the help of scale and pencil of Alpana, mostly giving a circular shape and some were in square shape also. The drawing included traditional motifs, designs of flora, birds, human figures and foot prints.

Process - 4 (Colouring) : Here children used white acrylic colour to bring the effect of rice paste. However it was little bit hard to move the brush on that surface but children did their best.

Final Process - 5 (Finshing and Photography) : After completing all the Alpanas each child was asked to share their experience during the workshop.

DIWALI CELEBRATION

Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi believe of promoting amity and brotherhood through celebration of different festivals of India, Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi celebrated Diwali with children with



the concept “Na Teri, Na Meri Yeh Hain Hum Sab Ki Diwali”. Children decorated Diyas at the art and craft section, so that each child gets a feel of their own lamp. 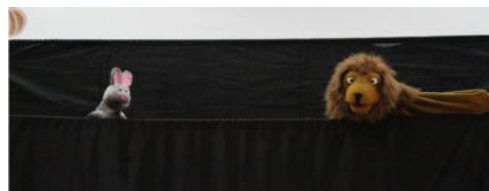

This was followed by a puppet show (traditional and modern) by Sh. Ajit Bhatt and other members of Kalabaaz Puppet Group. The children of this rural centre was enthralled by the show as it was a first time experience of such a show.



This was followed by fun games. After the fun games children enjoyed wholesome lunch. The grand finale Programme was graced by Ms. Rashi Sharma Director National Bal Bhavan . On her arrival at Jawahar Bal Bhavan Director NBB was accorded a traditional welcome by children in traditional attire.

Children of Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi undertook creative writing on the significance of Mother Tongue which they later presented in the programme at the Multi purpose hall.



The children also made a huge scroll type poster depicting that the “THE WORLD IS COLOURFUL, WITH DIFFERENT LANGUAGE, CULTURE, FOOD, ART FORMS, YET AS HUMAN BEINGS THERE IS ALSO ESSENTIAL ONENESS AMONG US”. The poster made by the children includes the names of Indian states and some foreign countries ; the name of their



languages and lastly how they write the word 'HUMAN' in their mother tonguethereby showing respect to all the MOTHER LANGUAGES practiced all over the world. Poster on the theme was also made by the publication manager .

At the main programme children were briefed about the significance of MaatriBhasha and the ManstriBhashaAndolan and why this day is observed as International Mother Language Day.Children were told how on 21st February 1952 how the students of Dhaka University (then in Pakistan) and social activists protested against the language policy of the Government. They wanted official status for Bangla Bhasha(Bengali Language). The protesters were fired upon but the protest still continued. Ultimately Bengali language got its rightful status. In honour of those who lost their life in the struggle UNESCO declared 21st February as International Mother Language Day.

Children and staff presented cultural programme depicting the rich diversity of Indian terms of languages, dance form and song.

One non Bengali speaking child sang the Bengali song " aamiBanglaigaangai" eulogising Bengali Language and subsequently presented Gidda Dance of Punjab. Children also presented folk dances of Haryana, Gujarat , Maharashtra. A staff member presented Bhatiyali folk song of Bengal

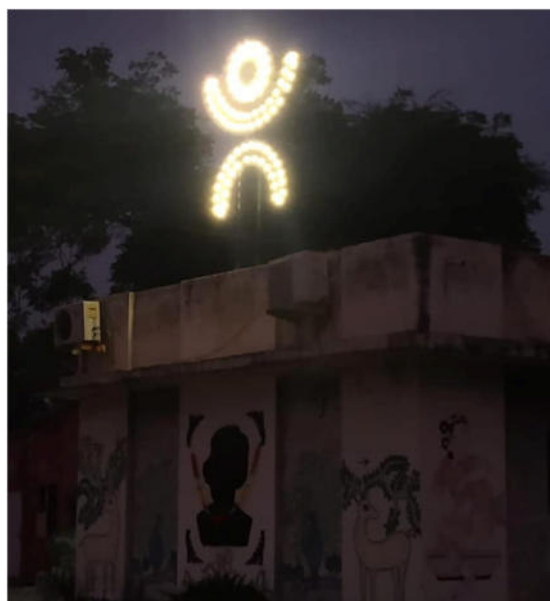

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Accounts

- a. The Financial Statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention and generally on the accrual method of accounting unless otherwise stated.
- b. Separate set of accounts are maintained by the National Bal Bhavan in respect of Main A/c, GPF & NPS activities and Internally Generated Funds.
- c. All Receipts on account of fees/subscription and refund of unspent grants are accounted on receipts basis.

2. Grants-in-Aid

Grants are recognized on receipt basis & taken to credit of Income & Expenditure account except to the extent of expenditure of capital nature incurred (which amount is credited directly to the capital fund).

3. Fixed assets and Depreciations

- a. Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition less depreciation. Fixed assets received as Gifts by the National Bal Bhavan has been merged with the Fixed Assets of the Society. Books received as Gifts are valued at selling price.
- b. Receipts, if any, on the sale of obsolete/unserviceable assets is taken as income under the head 'Misc Receipts'.

4. Depreciation

- 4.1 During this year depreciation has been charged on Straight line method at the prescribed rate as provided in new format for standardization of accounts issued by MHRD.
- 4.2 In respect of additions to fixed assets during the year, depreciation is provided for full year and in respect of deductions from the fixed assets, no depreciation is charged.

5. Specific Expenses/ Payments

a. Printing & Stationery

The amount spent for printing & stationery, is treated as expenditure as and when incurred. No adjustments are made in accounts for the closing stocks, as the value is not determinable.

b. Telephone Deposit

Deposit for telephone and allied facilities is written off during the year of installation/ commissioning and charges/ expenditure bills are accounted for at the net value.



6. Interest on All Deposits / Investments is accounted for on accrual basis.

7. Employees Salaries / Benefits

- a. Central Government Employees service rules are by and large, made applicable to the employees of the National Bal Bhavan.
- b. Retirement benefits are accounted for on the basis of Actuarial Valuation done by approved valuer as per Accounting Standard 15.
- c. The NBB maintains a separate Notified Provident Fund account for its employees.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

1. Grant received from Government, based on budget approved by the Parliament, constitute main source of receipts of the NBB. Though the grants received (after the adjustment of expenditure of capital nature) are taken to income and expenditure account, the effective income of the NBB is nil in the light of restrictions that without sanction of Government, the unspent balance of Grants cannot be carried over from one financial year to another. Thus this does not attract any Income tax liability.
2. Expenditure on Establishment, Printing and Stationery and Telephone deposits have been given the accounting treatment as per accounting policy.
3. An amount of Rs 85.63 lakhs has been shown as Assistance to State in Schedule-8 (Loans, Advances & Deposits) which were outstanding as on 31.03.2020 due to Non receipt of Utilization Certificates from the State Bal Bhavans.
4. An advance of Rs. 1.60 lakhs has been shown as recoverable from DTC (previous year Rs 1.60 lakhs). Out of total advance of Rs 40.80 Lakhs given to DTC, an amount of Rs 39.20 Lakhs has already been settled with them in the previous years. As informed to us, the balance amount of Rs 1.60 Lakhs is not recoverable, so we suggest that the same should be written off in the Books of Accounts.
5. An advance of Rs 528.52 lakhs has been paid to CPWD as per Schedule-8 (Loans, Advances & Deposits) upto 31.03.2020 (previous year Rs 535.71 lakhs).
6. During the current year, Prior period Income of Rs 1,35,467 & Prior Period expenses of Rs 34,39,621/- has been booked. Prior period expenses include BBK Expenses of Rs. 23.67/- lakhs which relates to Advances given to State Bal Bhavans in earlier years.
7. NBB has received funds from MSJE in previous years for special project. Unspent balance amounting to Rs 47,42,231/- (Previous Year is Rs 45,83,283/-) along with interest up to 31.03.2020 is lying with NBB's Canara Bank Account for this Project. Also the interest received on MSJE balance is payable to MHRD & should not be considered as income.
8. An amount of Rs 8,759 is shown as balance lying with Jammu & Kashmir Bank since long. As informed to us, the Bank Branch was in Kashmir & now it is not traceable. It is suggested to write off the same.
9. Sundry Debtors of Rs 3,76,575/- (Schedule-7) remained unrealized and since the balances are outstanding for more than 5 years, it is suggested to write off the balance, in case the same are not recoverable.
10. No provision has been made for Interest payable to MHRD for Financial Year 2019-20. An amount of Rs. 10,66,435/- has been paid to MHRD on account of Interest for Financial Year 2018-19 which is debited to Prior period expenses as no provision was made in previous year also.
11. Advances made and shown as recoverable are adjusted to final head of account/recovered on receipt of final bill/receipt from the concerned party/department.



12. In the opinion of the Management of NBB, Current Assets Loans and Advances shall have a value on realization in ordinary course of business, at least equal to the amount at which they are stated in the Balance Sheet. Provision has been made for all known liabilities.
13. The income of the Institution is exempt from Income Tax under Section 10(23c) of Income Tax Act. No provision for tax is therefore made in the accounts.
14. An amount of Rs 8,48,000/- was shown as utilized for Capital Expenditure instead of Recurring Expenditure out of Grant received for NER in Financial Year 2018-19. The same has been adjusted from the Corpus Fund (Schedule-1) to rectify the Audit objection raised by CAG as per Audit Report dated 29.01.2020.
15. Opening Balances have been verified by the Management and relied on by us.
16. Previous year figures have been regrouped wherever considered necessary.
17. Figures in the final accounts have been rounded to the nearest rupee.

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of National Bal Bhavan for the year ended 31st March 2020



We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of National Bal Bhavan (NBB) as at 31st March, 2020 and Income & Expenditure Account/Receipts & Payments Accounts for the year ended on that date under Section 20(1) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971. The audit has been entrusted for the period up to 2022-23. These financial statements are the responsibility of the National Bal Bhavan Management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Report/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
4. Based on our audit, we report that :
 - (i) We have obtained all the information and explanation, except as stated in the report, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
 - (ii) The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account/Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format prescribed by the Government of India, Ministry of Education, subject to audit comment at Para B.1.
 - (iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the National Bal Bhavan, except as stated in the report, in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
 - (iv) We further report that :
 - A. **Balance Sheet**
 - A.1 **Liabilities**
 - A.1.1 **Current Liabilities & Provisions (Schedule 3) - Rs. 97.04 crore**
 - (i) NBB received grant-in-aid of Rs. 53.00 lakh from Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment during 2011-12 for nationwide drive against Alcoholism Substance (drugs) Abuse & Illicit Trafficking but utilized Rs. 19.25 lakh. The unutilized grant-in-aid amount of Rs. 47.42 lakh (inclusive of interest income of Rs. 13.58 lakh) as on 31.03.2020 has not been shown under Current Liabilities resulting in understatement of Current Liabilities & Provisions and overstatement of Capital Fund by Rs.47.42 lakh. Audit has been making observation on this matter since 2017-18 but remedial action has not been taken by NBB.



A.2 Assets

A.2.1 Fixed Assets (Schedule 4) – Rs. 5.58 crore

(i) The above does not include Capital work-in-progress amounting to Rs. 1.58 crore for various works undertaken by CPWD. The same has been shown under Loans & Advances. This has resulted in understatement of Capital work-in-progress (Fixed Assets) and overstatement of Loans and Advances by Rs. 1.58 crore.

(ii) Land and Building should be depicted in the Balance Sheet/Schedule as two separate heads of account. This is being pointed out by audit since 2012-13 but rectification has not been done. This has resulted in incorrect charging of depreciation on land since 2014-15 with consequent understatement of Fixed Assets and Capital Fund (Amount not quantifiable).

The Assets register should also show the area of each parcel of land separately as freehold and lease hold.

A.2.2 Loans, Advances & Deposits (Schedule 8) – Rs. 7.07 crore

The above includes advances of Rs. 5.28 crore given to CPWD for various works during the period March 2008 to January 2020. Out of these, works for which advances of Rs. 3.71 crore were given pertaining to the period from March 2008 to March 2016 had been completed but the adjustment has not been done for want of completion certificate/Account statement. This has resulted in overstatement of Loans, Advances & Deposits and understatement of expenditure by Rs. 3.71 crore.

B. Internal Receipt Account

B.1 Capital Fund (Rs. 461.35 lakh), Current Liabilities (Rs. 1.41 lakh), Fixed Assets (Rs. 36.57 lakh) and Current Assets (Rs. 426.19 lakh including Rs. 231.93 lakh as Bank Balances in saving bank account no. 0158101118475 of Canara Bank and investment of Rs. 150.16 lakh) have been kept outside the main account of National Bal Bhavan. This had been shown separately as accounts of internally Generated Funds.

This is being pointed out since 2015-16 but no remedial action has been taken.

The Accounts of Internally generated funds (Internal Receipt Accounts) are an integral part of the Accounts of NBB and a consolidated account should be prepared as a whole for the organization to give a complete, true and fair picture of the financial position of NBB. This is also contravention of Format of Accounts prescribed by Ministry of Education which does not provide for any separate account in respect of internally generated funds.

C. General

C.1 An investment of Rs. 2.13 lakh was made in the Government Securities out of GPF accounts pertaining to the period 1980-83. However, related records were not made available to audit. Similarly, the records of Rs.16,759 lying at GPO, New Delhi were not furnished to audit. This is being repeatedly pointed out since 2011-12.

NBB replied that the investment was kept in the safe custody of bank. The matter was taken up with the bank and the bank informed that they have not traced the record of this investment & as per instructions of RBI, bank cannot keep records of more than 10 years in their branch. NBB needs to take a decision in this matter and communicate to audit.

C.2 NBB Notes to the Account (Schedule 24) indicates that the following amounts are required to be written off:

- An amount of Rs. 1.60 lakh not recoverable from DTC;



- An amount of Rs. 8,759 as balance lying with J&K bank not traceable and
- Sundry Debtors of Rs. 3.76 lakh (Schedule 7) remained unrealized. Adequate Provision for bad and doubtful debts should be made in this regard.

However, NBB has not written off the above amount from the accounts. This is being pointed out since 2017-18 but action has not been taken.

D. Grants-in-aid

National Bal Bhavan received Grant-in-aid of Rs. 1988.47 lakh (Grant for creation of Capital Assets: Rs. 87.44 lakh and Recurring Grant: Rs. 1901.03 lakh) from Ministry of Education during 2019-20. It had unspent balance of previous year amounting to Rs. 56.30 lakh (Grant for creation of Capital Assets: Rs. 0.05 lakh and Recurring Grant: Rs. 56.25 lakh). Out of the total funds of Rs. 2044.77 lakh, National Bal Bhavan utilized Rs. 1850.21 lakh (Grant for creation of Capital Assets: Rs. 20.00 lakh and Recurring Grant: Rs. 1830.21 lakh) leaving a balance of Rs. 194.56 lakh (Grant for creation of Capital Assets: Rs. 67.50 lakh and Recurring Grant: Rs. 127.06 lakh) as on 31 March 2020.

E. Management Letter :

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of Director, National Bal Bhavan through a Management Letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

- v Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- vi In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanation given to us, because of the effects of the observations discussed above in the preceding paragraphs, the financial statements, read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report, **do not give a true and fair view** in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India:
 - a. in so far as they relate to the Balance Sheet of the state of affairs of the National Bal Bhawan, Delhi as at 31 March 2020; and
 - b. in so far as they relate to the Income and Expenditure Account of the deficit for the year ended on that date.

Annexure to Audit Report

1. Adequacy of Internal Audit System

- The NBB has no internal audit section/Department of its own. It has also no audit manual. However all the files of payments are preaudited.

2. Adequacy of Internal Control System.

The internal control of National Bal Bhavan is inadequate due to:

- Pendency in obtaining of utilization certificates from State Bal Bhavans/Bal Kendras in respect of advances given to them.
- Non adjustment of advances given to CPWD since 2007-08.
- 45 external audit paras were outstanding as on 31.3.2020.
- Non maintenance of accounting manual.
- Non-confirmation of debtors/loans & advances.

3. System of physical verification of Fixed Assets.

- Physical verification of Fixed Assets i.e. Furniture and Fixture, Vehicles, Plant & Machinery, Computer and accessories was conducted upto March 2020.
- Physical verification of Books & Publication was conducted upto March 2020.

4. System of physical verification of inventory.

- Physical verification of inventory like stationery and other consumable items was conducted upto March 2020.

5. Regularity in payment of dues.

- As per Accounts, no payment over six months in respect of statutory dues was outstanding as on 31.03.2020.
