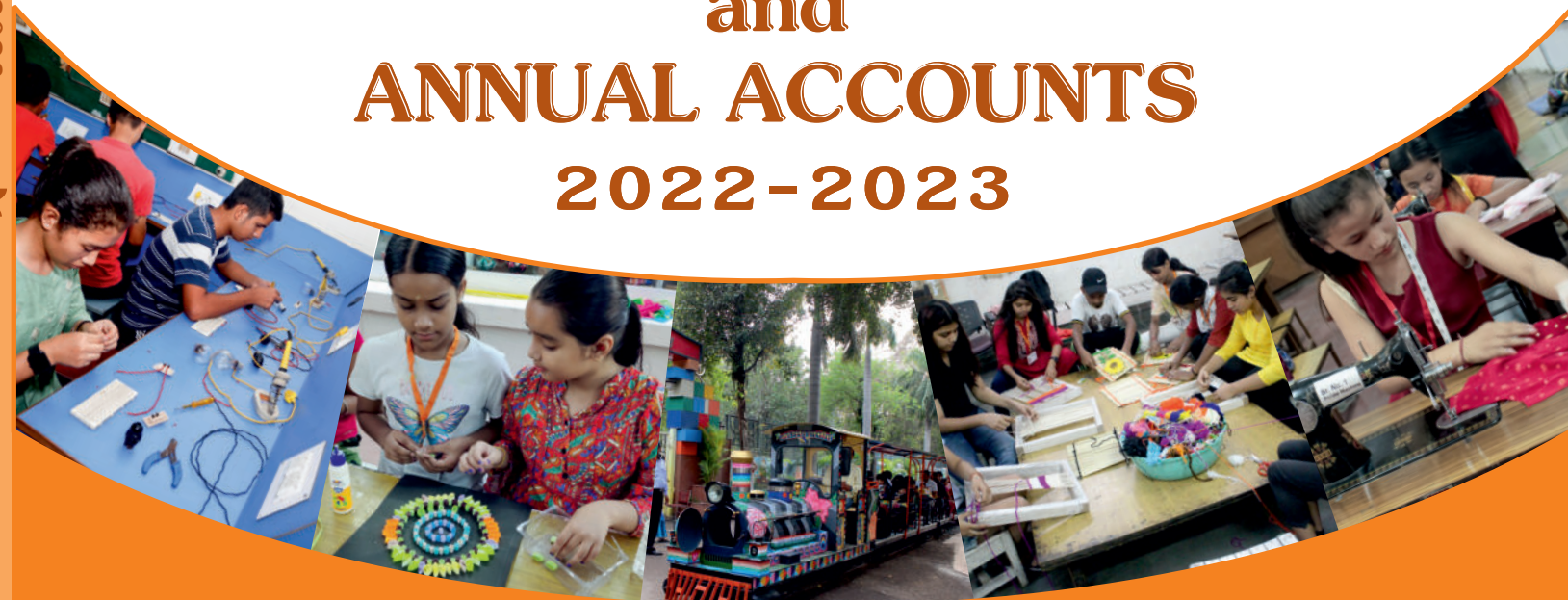

## Introduction



National Bal Bhavan, is an autonomous body under the Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Education, Govt. of India. This institution is a non-formal education center for children between the age group of 5 to 16 years. It was established in 1956, keeping in mind the dream of unmasking learning through the thinking, imagination, creative and entertaining activities for the children, the foundation was laid by the first Prime Minister of India. Bal Bhavan has taken the form of a

movement with 141 affiliated Bal Bhavans and Bal Kendras across the country. Apart from this, a rural Jawahar Bal Bhavan in Mandi village, Delhi and other 40 Bal Kendras are also functioning in Delhi. National Bal Bhavan provides children with different activities and opportunities in accordance with their age, efficiency and strength, to develop children's creativity and skill. This institution provides children a stress free and fear free environment with a great scope of possibilities. National Bal Bhavan and its affiliated institutions run regular programs for children especially for the lower strata of society.

The objective of this organization is to develop the child's creative ability by working on a common platform through various activities, opportunities, deliberations and experiences. Bal Bhavan provides an opportunity to every child and the freedom to fabricate innovative creations by learning through play way method, furthermore it helps to develop their creative potential through activities like dance, drama, music, creative arts, photography, computer etc. National Bal Bhavan, has emerged as a centre where children get their overall personality development at one place through various activities as well as strengthening the spirit of unity.

Every year thousands of children become members of National Bal Bhavan. The institute has started working in 1956 with meager 300 member children but over the years it has increased its membership strength and now lakhs of children are taking advantages of its various facilities. To reach the children of different areas, 40 Bal Kendras were established in many areas of Delhi State. These Bal Kendras fulfill the needs of all the children coming from different strata of society. Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi is a rural unit of National Bal Bhavan, which is working under NBB and provides parallel services to the rural population of surrounding villages. State Bal Bhavans and Bal Kendras have been opened in all parts of the country and remote tribal areas and they are providing similar services everywhere.

## Objectives

To inculcate faith, self-reliance, sovereignty and moral values among children and make our Nation strong and prosperous. Likewise, providing opportunities for developing creativity among them through creative art, creative writing, creative performing arts, physical education, scientific experiments, photography, and housekeeping via informal education system. Workshops, training programmes are conducted to attain this very philosophy and search talent of children and nurturing them for the purpose.

1. To provide opportunities to children for education and creativity.
2. To provide the children with experiences and activities not otherwise available to them.
3. To offer certain educational services to the local schools in order to enrich their curricular and extracurricular activities.
4. To provide leadership and guidance to teachers towards fostering a creative approach in teaching of art and science.
5. To provide training facilities for recreational workers, and Children's Museum personnel.
6. To offer the Nation a prototype comprehensive children's institution, i.e. to establish an Ideal Bal Bhavan.
7. To develop personality and talents of children through recreation and physical activities.
8. To promote social and cultural contacts amongst the children of all classes and communities.
9. To inculcate such values as would help to develop modern Indian personality with a scientific temper.
10. To promote the above mentioned activities as a movement.

## Activities at a Glance

### CREATIVE ART

Creative Art activities are aimed to provide an opportunity to children for their self expression and development of aesthetic sensitivity of children and also to encourage the talent hidden in their personality. There are various activities in creative art, which have been divided under sub-heads which are as follows:-

#### Integrated Activities

Integrated Activities Section attracts children of all age groups. Children especially of small age group generally take interest in Traditional Arts. Being a multimedia section, children can easily shift from one medium to other media. Creative and value-based games are also developed in this section. Traditional Folk Art created with sticks (instead of brush) and use of natural colours is an added attraction of this section. Children also learn to make toys with papier machie and do paper craft in this section. This section creates awareness about Mehndi art, Warli, Madhubani etc.



#### Painting



Children in this section express their creativity by drawing and painting with crayons, Water colours, Oil colours, pencil and Charcoal. This activity is equally popular with senior children as well as younger ones. Younger children make drawings as per their imagination whereas senior ones enjoy drawing portraits, sketches, natural scenery and do theme based drawings. Children are also taught Batik, Tie and Dye, Block printing techniques.

#### Handicraft

Activities in this section are special as children make objects with waste materials such as old newspapers, old magazines, card board boxes, used boxes, bulbs, buttons, embossed papers, thermocol, clippings, seeds, wire, leaves, scrap of trees etc. Children are free to make objects with the help of these items. Creation of beautiful art work & products with waste materials depict the imagination and creativity of children.





## Weaving

Weaving activity is an activity where children learn making various artistic items such as wall hangings, Lamp shades, Tapestry, scenery etc., through techniques of weaving. They are motivated to create beautiful objects. They learn different types of knots and weaving patterns and make mats, sceneries and small carpets of their own.



## Needle Craft



Toy making, puppet making, macrame, crochet work etc. are attractions of stitching & embroidery section. Children learn basics of cutting and stitching of clothes and also different types of designing, patch work and creative embroidery. Toy making with cotton fill is also a popular activity of this section. Children learn making wall hangings, different types of stitches which help in developing creativity among children.

## Clay Work

Activities in this section are helpful in establishing co-ordination between mind, heart and hands in children. Here children learn making animals, human faces and shapes, sceneries and designs with the help of mould by using papier mache, plaster of Paris and clay. This section provides an opportunity to involve children by using new innovative and creative ideas while giving shape to the clay. Potter's Wheel is also used at times for children to learn pottery.



## Book Binding



Activities in binding section are also very popular, as children learn how to keep their books safe and beautiful. In addition they learn technique of binding and making beautiful objects with cardboard, which includes cutting card board, painting, joining etc. Children are also taught how to prepare other items such as candle stand, pen stand, small diary, file covers and many other items.

## Woodcraft

Children are acquainted with different techniques used while making various wooden objects. Children also learn how to examine the durability of a particular wood for making various items from wood. Children are also acquainted with making mural through wood cutting on wooden frames and creating drawings with saw-dust is also taught. Children also learn making pen stand, pen holder, small box, toys, pot cover etc. They are also taught to carve wood and making beautiful object from it. They also learn art of making beautiful things from wood dust.





## SCIENCE ACTIVITIES

Aim of Science Education is to develop “Scientific” attitude among the children. Science Section is not merely a subject of class laboratory but a part of biggest laboratory that is nature through which children enhance their knowledge about day to day happenings and linking them with scientific principles. National Bal Bhavan believes in adopting various interesting activities for making children understand the basic principles of science. An important aspect of science teaching system of National Bal Bhavan is “Integrated approach” in which other activities becomes an integral part of learning. This section is having different Sub-sections which help children to learn Scientific laws and principles. The children are also taught Physics and Natural Science along with use of science in everyday life. Activities in this section include Radio Electronics, Aero-Modelling, Machine Modelling, Astronomy, Computers, Aquarium and Animal Corner, How and Why club and Environment. All activities section use practical approach to generate interest in science and life related issues.

For children taking part in science activities, it is not necessary for them to have science as a subject in their syllabus, what is important here is that they must have curiosity and desire for learning “Why” and “How”. Film shows and camps are also organized by this section from time to time.

Science section has following sub sections :

### Physical & Natural Sciences (How and Why Club)

Children opt for projects under this section, and satiate their curiosity of “How” and “Why” exponentiation through this club. Making creative scientific models, Educational Tour, Science Quizzes etc. are some of the activities which invariably enhance knowledge of children and encourage them to learn something new. The workshops are also conducted. Children are also provided laboratory equipments for experiments and scientific games etc.



### Inventors Club

Children are encouraged to conduct experiments and learn innovative techniques in this section. As they learn the concept of Machine Modelling and thereafter designing it, thereby understanding different aspects connected with their project. Children understand how machines are designed using cardboard as base material.

### Radio and Electronics club

Children from 10 to 16 years of age are given membership of Radio & Electronics club. Basic Principles of Electronics, wiring, repair of domestic equipment, new experiments in circuits, radio, connecting T.V. parts are various activities undertaken by this club. Children are imparted training in Digital projects, new source of energy such as solar energy models etc. More and more children are having membership of “HAM Radio Club”. Keeping in view of ever rising means of developed communication, Ham Amateurs club has also been launched in National Bal Bhavan for Radio listeners





to enable member children to establish “HAM Station” at their home and establish contact with their dear ones.

## Aero Modelling

An expensive hobby such as Aero Modelling is made accessible and easy by National Bal Bhavan to its member children. Children learn the basic principles of wind power and making models of different aircrafts. In addition, they enjoy flying models made by them. Main aim of this activity is to acquaint children with Aviation and related Science and develop interest in this discipline. Children also try experimenting with various designs of aeroplanes, parachutes etc. to understand the flying mechanics. Model rocketry workshops are also organised by this section.



## Computer



Computer is a very popular activity which attracts children in large number. Children learn basics of computer language and also learn to do programming. Children are provided with software along with computer games. This activity is supplementary to their school education. Internet knowledge is also given by National Bal Bhavan to the children so that they may be well versed with latest system. A number of useful workshops and seminars are also conducted on new systems and procedures. Children learn

photoshop and digital printing techniques. Cyber Security awareness is spread for safety of children and is a regular feature of the section.

## Environment

Harit Vahini campaign was started on 19 November, 1986 to indulge children into the mainstream environmental consciousness and activism. Environment Section was created for the implementation of this campaign. This section has grown over the years by expanding the scope of awareness about the most important issues of environment. The section through its hands on activities, field work and project work creates interest in environment amongst children. Ample importance is given to Environment Science and Nature for preservation of natural resources along with preservation of culture, art & craft, folk art and literature, historical monuments etc. Rain Water Harvesting and solar power related projects are given special attention. In addition to it many projects related to Environment are undertaken and children are taught through field visits, surveys, waste recycling etc. To reach out to maximum number of children and create maximum awareness, a National Conference of “Young Environmentalist” is being organized since 1990. Children from different parts of the country participate in this meet and interact on various aspects of environment and discuss the social, emotional and cultural part of this.





## Astronomy

The Sky above holds unknown milky ways having various unsolved mysteries. People are striving to solve these mysteries from time immemorial. A lowcost astronomical unit has been established in Bal Bhavan. Children enjoy activities in this section. They remain curious to have more and more information about stars and sky above. In the past years Astronomy Section conducted Telescope making workshops for Delhi school children and at an International level for SAARC countries.

## Aquarium and activities related to animal corner

Children get basic information about zoology and animals in this section. This section organises workshops related to “Make your own aquarium” and provide information about animals. Children get information regarding the concepts of adaptations, viscosity, marine life, aquatic plants, etc. and learn morphology, food habits and habitations etc. of pet animals.

## LIBRARY ACTIVITIES

National Bal Bhavan has a library with a large number of interesting books for children. These books are on Art, Craft, Culture, Science, Mathematics, Mass media, Computers, stories, fiction and poetry etc., along with a reference section. Books in Hindi, English, Urdu, Tamil and Bangla languages are also in the library. Various journals, magazines are also available in the library. Apart from reading activity this section also organises activities on creative writing for children.



## PHOTOGRAPHY

In National Bal Bhavan children are acquainted with various aspects of photography such as history of photography, basics of camera, digital camera and technique of handling a digital camera for clicking photos of various themes like nature, portrait, model, project, Industry etc. Importance of light, natural light and time of clicking photos is an integral part of teaching photography. Children take photo of people, animal, birds, their habits, various movements, people living in different habitats and their life styles. Children also learn how to make Coffee Table book using Photoshop techniques.





Videography classes and workshops are also conducted by this section. Where children prepare video programmes. Team of Children perform activities such as script writing, camera handling, dialogue, and voice recording to film production under the supervision of their Instructor. Photography section also organises exhibition of the photos on various themes covered by children to motivate them. The section also organises specific photography courses for adults.

Main attractions of this section are:

- Digital Photography
- Photoshop techniques for digital enhancement.
- Field visits and heritage walks to take pictures of nature, monuments etc. and making a photo journal.
- Photo exhibition and display is also done towards the end of a training programme.
- Photography training programme is also organised for adults.

## PERFORMING ARTS

Performing Art provides opportunity to children to develop their imagination with the help of various activities and translate it into action to recognize their talent. Children learn Dance, Drama, Music, Instrumental Music, Vocal music etc. Children also acquaint themselves with traditional folk music and dance of different cultures.

Performing Arts Section consists of the following sub-sections:

- Vocal Music (classical & folk)
- Instrumental Music (percussion and string instruments of Indian origin)
- Classical Dance (Kathak, Bharatnatyam)
- Folk Dance
- Drama





## PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Sports and physical activities are favourite of children of all age groups. National Bal Bhavan provides various type of sports activities to children such as: Table Tennis, Badminton, Football, Cricket, Basket Ball, Judo and Skating etc. It has its own Gymnasium for exercise. Children not only get information related to these sports but are also encouraged to develop their own creative and interesting games.

Judo has added many proud moments for this institution. National Bal Bhavan has had the privilege to train such children who have proved themselves not only at National but at international level also. Physical Education Section conducts inter-school tournament in which children of various schools and institutions actively participate and enjoy.



Skating is also very popular among children and perhaps National Bal Bhavan has one of the best skating rinks in Delhi. Physical Education Section also organize inter school cricket and Foot Ball competitions in Bal Bhavan and children of various schools participate in competitions and enjoy it. National Bal Bhavan's play ground and Physical Education Section are also made available to member schools of National Bal Bhavan. This section also arrange adventures camps, trekking and other field trips as well. Creative games are also organised for children from time to time.

Main attractions of this section are as under:

- Indoor & Outdoor sports  
(Table Tennis, Badminton, Cricket, Basket Ball)
- Judo
- Skating
- Gymnasium (Indoor, Outdoor)
- Carrom Board
- Shooting



## HOME MANAGEMENT

Children are acquainted with good and smooth home management by this section. In this section children try their hand on varieties of dishes. They learn cooking of nutritious and healthy foods so that they may be self reliant. Children are taught how to prepare budget of kitchen and estimation. Regular discussions are held with children about Health & Hygiene and Cleanliness which is useful for them. Various workshops are organized like Flower Arrangement (Ikebana), Bakery products etc.



Main attraction of this section are as under :

- Home Management, Table layout etc.
- Cooking and Baking
- Food Preservation
- Flowers Arrangement

## MUSEUM TECHNIQUES' CLUB

National Children Museum of National Bal Bhavan organises theme based exhibition on various occasions and enhances knowledge of children. This is a unique Children's Museum in India. It has permanent exhibition galleries and thousands of children visit the same and these exhibitions supplement and complement the school education curriculum. Another activity of National Children Museum is "Museum Techniques' Club" which demonstrate techniques of preparing Clay and "Cast" replica from plaster of Paris and children are taught from simple techniques to specific work such as "Piece Mould". In this section children are also taught mounting, script writing and technique for arranging exhibitions etc. Children undergo experience which enhances their knowledge about nature, history, culture, science and technology. Children are educated about our ancient civilization, our history, its ancient heritage and culture as well. Children visit excavation sites to have direct and first hand experience. Special workshops are conducted for children and their visits are also arranged to various historical monuments.

Main attraction of this section are as under :

Moulding and casting, Designing Exhibitions, Historical and Cultural Interactions, Preservation and conservation of Museum objects and Field work.







## National Children's Museum

National Children Museum is an integral part of National Bal Bhavan which has been designed in line with the psychology of growing children and their curiosity of viewing and looking at the world around them. Museum has a rich collection of precious objects which include Toys from other countries, Stone & Metal objects/items, traditional ornaments, pots and utensils, art and craft items, instruments, turbans/headgears, aircraft, satellite and information related to historical monuments. National Children Museum is the only institution which enjoys the status of being a National Level Children Museum. National Children Museum advocates this fact that children's museum is an important source for developing the knowledge of children.



Various exhibitions are arranged in different galleries of this museum, first one is permanent exhibition and other one is temporary exhibition. One of the galleries of the museum is reserved for temporary exhibition, where exhibitions are organised on special subjects and special themes.

Permanent exhibition in the museum has a special attraction "Hamara Bharat" is a prominent one (spread over in 8500 sq.ft.) and it displays lifestyle of Indian people, their live culture, rich art and craft, diversity of religion and costumes, progress in science and technology which draws the attention of the viewers and visitors. Gaurav Gatha (spread over in 1855 sq. ft. area) depicts the era of golden past, its culture, wars etc. which has been arranged in chronological order. Surya Gallery (spread over in more than 8000 sq.ft. area) in which importance of "Surya" is outlined along with civilization of Egypt Mesopotamia, China, Greek etc. Place and importance of Surya in their civilization is depicted. Origin of surya i.e. the Solar system and Earth etc. is also shown here, in other words: presentation of Surya is depicted from both mythological and scientific point of view. Traditional Art and Craft gallery: Treasure for the future generation (spread over in 1700 sq.ft. area) exhibition displays art work of renowned artists. All these exhibition are open for the public.

## National Training Resource Centre

Aims and objective of NTRC is to provide integrated training to teachers and adults by Creative methodology and participation in Creative Art, Performing Art and Science activities. Proposals for Training in Physical Education, sports, Library activities are also under consideration. It has been felt that the work and performance of children be given recognition and this can be achieved by training teachers in creativity.

With the help of various media and creative methods, National Bal Bhavan encourages teachers to recognize the sustained imagination and thought process of children, their creative expression, innovation and capacity of originality and thereby enhancing their capability. Talks and demonstrations are arranged for rural, semi-rural and urban teachers/instructors to make the art as a powerful medium of expression and imparting education.



## Our Programmes

National Bal Bhavan, one of the top organizations is working for the overall development of children across the country. National Bal Bhavan works by keeping this fact in mind that millions of children in India are from such families, who live below the poverty line and whose parents do not even meet their primary needs. In view of these, the National Bal Bhavan is trying to spread the Bal Bhavan movement across all corners of the country using all its resources.

National Bal Bhavan is playing an important role by reaching lakhs of children through its 127 affiliated State Bal Bhavans and 14 State Bal Bhavan Kendras and also through 40 Bal Bhavan Kendras functioning in Delhi region. These institutions are open in the private schools/private institutions which are working in the different areas with the help of various NGOs. The activities of National Bal Bhavan are not confined to our country, but NBB is spreading its philosophy through its programmes of cultural inter-change with children residing in other countries of the world. As such, National Bal Bhavan is imparting education to children through its recreational and creative activities at Local, District, State, National and International levels.

### LOCAL LEVEL PROGRAMS:

National Bal Bhavan organizes regular activities in addition to many innovative programs, which include various workshops, seminars etc. The aim of all these activities is to increase their experience by giving children the opportunity to participate in multi-disciplinary activities. These activities make one aware of national heritage, traditions, culture, art, crafts, literature and scientific progress of the Nation and on one side of the nation on the other hand, children also expand their horizons.

## Detailed report

### PARTICIPATION IN PARIKSHA PE CHARCHA PROGRAM

During Pariksha Pe Charcha, 2022 organized by the Ministry at Talkatora Stadium on 1st April, 2022, Hon'ble Prime Minister - Shri Narendra Modi interacted with the students in relation to stress free examination. Around 1000 school students participated in the programme. Here, an exhibition of art and crafts made by the member children of National Bal Bhavan was showcased, which was highly appreciated by the Prime Minister. Around 40 children from the performing arts section of National Bal Bhavan presented dance and song performance, which was wholeheartedly appreciated by everyone. In the same programme, vocal music instructor- Mrs. Neha Vats Khankriyal also conducted a mass singing session.



### MEDITATION AND YOGA PRACTICE PROGRAM

A meditation and yoga exercise program was organized by the Physical Education Section of National Bal Bhavan from 1 to 30 April, 2022 for the employees to keep them stress free and self-settled.

### PROGRAMS UNDER THE AZADI KA AMRIT MAHOTSAV

In the library section, activities were conducted on the theme of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav'. The children were informed about the freedom struggle and learnt to make collages. About 355 children participated in creating slogans on the theme.

### SITAR AND GUITAR WORKSHOP

In Sitar and Guitar section, a three-day workshop was organized for children on 20 to 22 April, 2022 about Sitar's Riyazi Bols and Paltas.

### EARTH DAY PROGRAM

Earth Day program was organized from 22 to 23 April, 2022 for all the employees of National Bal Bhavan with the theme - 'Invest in our planet', in which old member children were also invited. 28 children participated through online mode and 48 children through offline mode. During program, discussion was held about Earth Day and the problems related to Earth that we all are facing. After that children were taught papier mache work and how to make different





things with it. After a discussion with the children about what should be our attitude towards Mother Earth, a presentation was then shown, based on the history of the celebration of Earth Day. Discussions were held on topics like Invest in our planet, how our collaborative effort can make a significant difference in the environment for the betterment of the planet, how human activity is changing or increasing the rate of pollution and the solution to the problem. Many children presented their views on 'Invest in our planet', took a pledge to save our earth by making bookmarks from recycled paper and by poster making activity.

## AZADI KA AMRIT MAHOTSAV - PROGRAM

In the painting section, children were taught pencil drawing, collage making and flower drawing on the occasion of Independence Day and a painting competition was organized on World No Tobacco Day. Prizes were awarded to the winners of the competition by Mr. Mukesh Gupta, Dy. Director (Admin) National Bal Bhavan.

## COMPUTER AWARENESS PROGRAM

In computer section, a computer awareness program was organized for the children, in which internet cyber security current scenario was discussed through online and offline mode. A film on 'Internet Ka Bawal' made by children was shown. Information was also given on how irrelevant internet usage can be harmful. On May 31, 2022, 32 children were taken for a study tour of



Mausam Bhavan. There the children saw the practical demonstration of the observatory, NHAC (mini super computer) and satellite, and the children were also briefed about the technical terms of geography, thermograph, hydrograph, thermometer etc. Apart from this, information about air density, direction and measurement methods, types of satellites and how they work by revolving around big objects, weather information and how the satellite image of the earth is obtained. Super Computer and Server was shown, from which the children got the latest information about working through the speed of nano-seconds and how it is connected to the satellite. The children were informed about different sizes, types, tools, software and hardware, output, storage and processing devices etc.

## SUMMER FIESTA PROGRAM

The summer session was organized in National Bal Bhavan from 20th May to 23rd June with full zeal and enthusiasm, in which children learned many new and creative activities. During the inauguration ceremony Sh. Anand Prakash, Vice-Chairperson (NBB), Ms. Deepa Anand, Director (NBB), Group Captain Sh. H.J. Paige and other dignitaries lighted the lamp and were traditionally welcomed by National Bal Bhavan. This was followed by a cultural program featuring orchestra, soulful Bengali song, drama- 'Pappu Ban Gaya Dada Ji', Bharatanatyam, Bal-geet and folk dances of Goa etc.



The participant children were elated and filled with confidence by motivational words of Director, NBB & Dy. Director, NBB.



During the summer festival, children participated in around 40 activities at National Bal Bhavan such as **Science Activities** - Physical and Natural Science (How and why Club), Inventors Club, Radio and Electronics Club, Aero Modelling, Commuter, Environment, Astronomy, Aquarium, Zoological and Science Park related activities; **Performing Arts activities** - Vocal Music, Bharatnatyam, Kathak, Instrumental Music, Drama, Folk Dance, Folk Song; **Creative Arts activities** - Painting, Handicraft, Weaving, Sewing-Embroidery, Wood Craft, Clay Work, Integrated activities; Museum Technique's Club; **Some special activities** were also organized for children like - Tie and Dye, Kantha, Sanjhi, Pottery, Madhubani, Book Binding etc.



## SPECIAL ACTIVITY

'Little Ones' activity was organized for the children of 5 to 8 years age group with the aim to develop skills of perseverance, observation and concentration. Learning these activities develop creativity and imagination power in children and build self-confidence in them. Creative activities conducted in Little Ones were :- drama, singing, dancing, art, craft, painting, names and fables, characters, drawing on lion and mouse, film screening, storytelling:- crows and Snake, Painting of film characters, Fox and Grapes, Monkey and Hat seller, Tenali Rama.



## CREATIVE WRITING WORKSHOP

A Creative Writing Workshop was organized on May 21, 2022 which was designed to help children become confident and capable writers. Children were also taught to write essays, slogans poems, stories and draw pictures. A creative writing competition was organized on the topic 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav'. The winners of the competition were conferred with prizes.



## SUMMER CHILDREN'S ASSEMBLY PROGRAM

On every Saturday a special assembly was organized. Hence, on first saturday on 21<sup>st</sup> May, 2022 a children's assembly and a creative writing competition on Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav were organized at National Bal Bhavan, in which about 300 children participated.

## HINDI STORYTELLING WORKSHOP

A four-day workshop on Hindi storytelling from 24th to 28th May, 2022 was organized in which storytelling expert was invited. During this, the children learnt techniques of story writing, creating story characters, using props, creating problems and solving them to make meaningful stories.





Appropriate use of voice modulation and body language fueled passion, imagination and expression and introduced children to new horizons of storytelling. Many fun activities were also organized in this workshop like:- making a story using props or depicting a story by looking at a picture. Around 100 children participated in this workshop.

## WALK THROUGH PREHISTORIC LIFE - WORKSHOP BY ENVIRONMENT AND AQUARIUM SECTION

A workshop titled 'Walking through Prehistoric Life' was organized at National Bal Bhavan from 25 to 26 May, 2022. In this workshop, children got information about extinct animals and fossils. They were given information about the process of extinction of animals, the rate of extinction, process of digging, what is called carbon dating in the present time etc. During the workshop, a documentary about dinosaurs and their extinction was also shown. Children made cut outs and notes on various dinosaurs. During the workshop, children learned to identify the plants and their medicinal uses. The children learned about the heart, how the blood pumping mechanism in our body works, how the heart beat works in different diseases, about the mechanism of stethoscope. About 70 children participated in the workshop.

## SUMMER CHILDREN'S ASSEMBLY PROGRAM

During the Second assembly on 28th May, 2022 Bal Shree awardee in the field of classical vocal music Sh. Dakshraj Sharma gave a mesmerizing performance. Ms. Shubhangi Goyal, Balshree awardee in Kathak dance (2016), performed and mesmerized the participants. Mr. Akshat Mehrotra, Balshree awardee in flute (1998), performed during the Children's assembly and enthralled the participants. Thereafter, deaf and dumb children of NGO Ghaziabad performed a mime act on prevention of child abuse. The special presentation by the children of Ghaziabad won the hearts of the audience. A painting competition on the theme 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' was organized, in which children drew various aspects related to 75 years of independence in their pictures. The Bird masks made by the children were displayed by the members of Handicraft Section. 160 children participated during the competition.



## CALLIGRAPHY WORKSHOP

A four-day calligraphy workshop was organized by Mr. Anis Siddiqui, calligraphy expert, on May 31 to June 1, 2022, in which he taught the children to use brushes/Kokil/fountain pens for different methods and strokes. With the help of nibs, a distinctive style of self-writing was taught through the design process called calligraphy or popcorn writing style.



## RABINDRA JAYANTI AND INTERNATIONAL MUSEUM DAY PROGRAM

A one-day special talk was organized in the Museum Section on the occasion of Rabindra Jayanti and International Museum Day, remembering Tagore ji, who wrote our National Anthem and inspired people to be self reliant in various fields, since the time of Independence. A five-



day workshop was also organized from 31st May to 4th June, 2022 on the theme: Our Heritage (including sites/monuments under the list of UNESCO). The children were introduced to the subject through play-way method. Children were given chits with their names, school names etc. in a bowl, which they were asked to identify. The identity of the children was linked to the identity of the country, thus the children were made aware of the world heritage. Through a power point presentation the 'Heritage' was explained with their day to day activities and the rituals, how people of different religions observe their festivals. The World Heritage Sites like Qutub Minar, Taj Mahal, Jantar Mantar, Humayun's Tomb, India Gate etc. including monuments under UNESCO list were introduced.

In the form of a game, the children were given detailed information about different types of monuments/places e.g. where they are located, by whom they were built, the materials used to make them, and interesting facts related to the sites/monuments. Children learned the technique of making calendars in which children painted their favorite heritage sites & made pop show pieces & heritage sites. Thereafter the children were taken for a tour of Jantar Mantar, New Delhi. There the children saw all the yantras and were told about the working and benefits of different yantras and how time was calculated using them, during that period and also about how advanced technologies like today were not available.

## EDUCATIONAL VISIT AT NATIONAL SCIENCE CENTER

On May 31, 2022, 44 children, 4 instructors and 2 volunteers were taken for a tour of the National Science Center. Children were exposed to world of water, Indian Heritage, Human Biology, Prehistoric Life Entertainment, Science Atomic Energy Gallery, Information Technology, Ayurveda and Sardar Patel Gallery. Children were also told about various scientific principles in our daily life, why there is a need to conserve animals in the environment and how conservation is necessary to conserve the food chain, environment and ecosystem. 3D film about the world of water and its importance in life span ecosystem was also shown. Children learned how to make book marks from recycled paper and also took a pledge to save animals. Various topics were covered like the vision of the eye, how the brain coordinates with the eyes, about the illusion, magic toy related to the illusion, block printing, natural stencils from waste material, human brain, air pressure using bottle and balloon, bio degradable object activity, paper bag making activity, competition on earth work topic, collecting leaves of planted plants and preparing herbarium etc.

## WORLD NO TOBACCO DAY PROGRAM

On May 31, 2022, the World No Tobacco Day program was organized at the National Bal Bhavan. On this occasion, a painting competition was organized in which about 400 children participated.



## AZADI KA AMRIT MAHOTSAV

Various activities were organized for the children by the library section on the occasion of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav. The great stories on freedom were also narrated to all the children. To promote Hindi language, dictation and calligraphy and knowledge of Hindi grammar was also given.





## WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY PROGRAM

In the environment and fish corner section, on the occasion of World Environment Day, children were asked to write stories and slogans based on the environment. They learnt about functioning of the brain and its various parts and prepared a model of the brain cap. A 3D model related to the water cycle was made to save the environment, water cycle activities were conducted using ice and plastic containers. SAHAS NGO organized a special workshop to make children aware of waste management. About 60 children participated in this workshop. To keep the environment clean and green, the children, planted saplings in the premises of National Bal Bhavan. Seed pencils were distributed to children by SAHAS NGO.



An environment-related competition was organized for the children in the painting section, in which the children made slogans and drew cartoons. Prizes were also given to the children. The paintings made by the children were also put on exhibition on the closing ceremony of the summer fiesta on June 23, 2022.

In the drama section, the children staged a 'mute act' based on the environment, of which the purpose was to make children aware that the environment is the root of human life and we can stay healthy and safe only by keeping the environment safe.

On the occasion of World Environment Day, a five-day workshop titled 'Rare Wild Species of India' was organized for the children in the museum section. The workshop was started with orientation program. Thereafter a game was played, in which the children tried to identify the animals by sounds made by them. In this, they learned what different animal sounds are called and the children were told how sound is an important part of communication among animals to express their emotions like anger, happiness, fear etc.

## INTERNET SECURITY AND CYBER SECURITY CARNIVAL PROGRAM

In the computer section, the children were informed about internet safety, theory input, output, storage, processing, devices, types of Computer, types of Software, different types of viruses, computer Awareness Programs, poster on MS-Word, introduction to Power Point, introduction to Software and Hardware, information on Processing Equipments, how to use some standard tools like Excel calculations, hyperlinking, macros, etc. Cyber Security Carnival was organized on June 17, 2022. The objective was to make children aware about cyber safety and to be smart while using the internet. The carnival commenced with a rally in the premises of National Bal Bhavan raising some slogans on cyber security. In this program, Deputy Director-(Administration), Guest Dr. Ratan Datta and I.L. Narasim Rao (Sr. Project Manager) were present. Dr. Ratan Datta spoke about cyber security and gave demonstration about artificial intelligence and Robot. Thereafter, some children staged a skit on the topic 'Cyber Safety and Social Media' to convey the message of how internet use is harmful and a debate was also organised. Shri Narasim Rao gave information about cyber security through storytelling. In the end, the children were also shown a short film 'Internet Ka Bawal'. About 152 member children participated in this program.

## CHILDREN'S VISIT TO NATIONAL SCIENCE CENTER

National Science Center was visited by children of the environment and aquarium section, where they learnt about the magnetic field, the magnetic spring, the repulsive force of a magnet,



the centripetal force, the force of friction, importance of these forces in our daily life. Children learnt about the types of seeds like:- Monocotyledon and Dicotyledon etc. They learned the art of making toys based on magnetic levitation and made a toy which remained suspended in the air without support. Children made an air gun, rain gauge, bark of different trees and used it on paper. Children got information on various daily science events related to the principle of Banoli. The children built and demonstrated a reaction car, did Solar cooking activity, made a collage by identifying the leaves of different plants.

## SUMMER AND CHILDREN'S ASSEMBLY PROGRAM

On the third Saturday, June 4, 2022, the World Environment Day was celebrated in the premises of National Bal Bhavan. On the occasion of World Environment Day, Mr. Lalit Kumar-Secretary, Central and District Legal Services Authority, Rouse Avenue Court, was invited as Chief Guest and was welcomed by giving an art work made by the children. A song - 'Jag Mein Hariyali Laayenge, Geet Khushi Ke Gaayenge' was sung during mass singing. Then a cultural program was presented. Member children sang a song on environment followed by Flute recital by a Balshree awardee, presentation of a skit on environment by drama section, slogans related to environment. The program culminated with by National anthem.



## ODISSI DANCE WORKSHOP

A four-day workshop was organized from 7 to 10 June, 2022, by experts of Odissi dance at National Bal Bhavan in which Odissi dance was taught to children. About 60 children participated in this workshop. Some of the children also got the chance to perform Odissi dance learnt in the workshop.



## WORKSHOP BY HANDICRAFT SECTION

On June 9, 10 and 11, 2022, a paper quilling craft workshop was organized for children by the Handicraft Section. Children were briefed about how thin strips of colored paper are used, the strips are folded and shaped by hand and pasted to create three-dimensional shapes. About 20 children participated in this workshop.

## SUMMER FESTIVAL CHILDREN'S ASSEMBLY PROGRAM

On Fourth Saturday, June 11, 2022, in the Open Air Theatre of National Bal Bhavan, children performed Odissi Dance on stage which they learnt during the odissi dance workshop. Mrs. Shobha Bisht eminent Odissi dancer was the chief guest at the assembly. It was followed by



Sitar, Tabla, folk dance performances. Thereafter, Live Band Concert was presented by a team of professional-musicians Mr. Haider Ali, Mr. Sonu Verma, Mr. Vijay Sachdeva etc. It was followed by patriotic song performance by Instructor (Vocal Music) Mrs. Neha Vats Khankriyal along with Instructor (Folk song)- Sh. Rahul which was enjoyed by all the children. The Deputy Director-Administration boosted the morale of all the artists by presenting them with artworks made by the members children.

The member children of performing art section participated and presented various songs based on the importance of Yoga in the inauguration and closing ceremony of Yoga Olympiad organized by NCERT from 18<sup>th</sup> to 20<sup>th</sup> June, 2022.

## 8TH INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY PROGRAM

On the fifth Saturday, June 18, 2022, the 8th International Yoga Day program was organized during the summer session in the Open Air Theatre. On this occasion, the children of Kathak and Bharatnatyam section performed yoga postures with music. Thereafter, the instructor of physical education section did some yogasanas with the children of physical education. Laughter Yoga team encouraged children to do Laughter Yoga and taught easy yoga exercises to them. Children were informed about the theme of the



Yoga Day celebrations 'Yoga for Humanity' and that the program was organized across the globe. On this occasion, a skit was prepared for the children titled - 'Karo Yog, Raho Nirog'. Ham radio information was given in the workshop, in which complete knowledge of how to start a home radio station was given. About 25 participants participated in this workshop.

## DRONE TECHNOLOGY WORKSHOP

A one day workshop on Drone Technology through Online Portal was organized by Aeromodelling Section for the children and staff of Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Chennai, Tamil Nadu (Department of Art and Culture) on 7th July, 2022. About 26 participants participated in this workshop.

During this workshop, the children were first introduced to wood art and taught how wood is useful in our life. How useless wood can be used to create an artwork, for example, children were taught to make a photo frame with ice cream sticks.

## HANDICRAFT WORKSHOP

On August 3 to 5, 2022, a three-day flower making workshop was organized. In the workshop, the children were told that making any flower is a fun and an imaginative artistic process inspired by nature. Information about petals of real flowers was also given. They were encouraged to take inspiration from the nature and make paper flowers. About 20 children participated in this workshop.

## INDEPENDENCE DAY PROGRAM UNDER THE 75TH AZADI KA AMRIT MAHOTSAV

A three-day workshop was organized by the Clay Section on August 17, 18 and 20, 2022. In the workshop, children were taught to make clay models related to environment like fish, bird, elephant, human skeleton etc. About 15 children participated in this workshop.

## WOOD CRAFT WORKSHOP

A three-day workshop was organized by the Wood Craft Section on August 17, 18 and 20, 2022. In the workshop, children were taught to make paintings from unusable wood and to make houses from ice cream sticks. About 55 children participated in this workshop.

## DRAMATIC ARTS WORKSHOP

A two-day workshop was organized by the Drama Section on August 17 and 18, 2022. In the workshop, children were given detailed information related to theatrical art, by making different stories, how the theatrical performance of the stories is displayed. The main objective of this workshop was to develop the thinking ability of the children and to make them self-reliant and generate energy among the children to work on their own. About 44 children participated in this workshop.

## INTEGRATED ACTIVITIES WORKSHOP

A three day workshop was organized by the Integrated section on 17th, 18th and 20th August, 2022. In the workshop, the children of New Horizon School were taught how to make masks out of paper. About 188 children participated in this workshop.

## WORKSHOP ON TABLA

A three-day workshop was organized by the Tabla section from August 23 to 25, 2022. In the workshop, the children were taught the origin and practice of tabla, introduction of different parts of tabla, introduction of all the six gharanas of tabla, playing of teentaal on the tabla showing taali / khaali with hands, rules of teentaal with 4 paltas. About 30 children participated in this workshop.

## HANDICRAFT WORKSHOP

From 24 to 26 August, 2022, a three-day workshop on Mask Making Craft was organized by the Handicraft Section. In the workshop, children were taught to make face masks from newspapers. About 20 children participated in this workshop.

## RADIO AND ELECTRONICS WORKSHOP

A three-day workshop was organized by the Radio and Electronics Section from August 24 to 26, 2022. Children were taught how to develop and build a low-cost model. The aim of the



workshop was to prepare electronic models which are used in our daily life. In the workshop, the children were informed about the precautions and hazards required while handling electricity and electrical equipments. The participants were explained the identification of various parts and their functions. The basic knowledge of electricity was given by the instructor. Testing of components, repair and soldering of components, cleaning of components were taught. Children developed various circuits using card boards, as per the circuit diagram on the board. Children learned to perform soldering work on load components after circuit is complete with components. After that they were taught to make flash light, DC motor, wind power etc.

## INTEGRATED ACTIVITIES WORKSHOP

A three-day workshop was organized by the integrated section from August 25 to 27, 2022. In the workshop, children of Ramjas Girls Senior Secondary School were taught to make different types of designs on the board with papier mache. About 75 children participated in this workshop.

## TORAN CRAFT WORKSHOP BY HANDICRAFT SECTION

a three-day Toran Craft Workshop from 6th to 8th September, 2022 was organized by the Handicraft Section. Toran is also called Bandanwar. On the first day of the workshop, the children were given the introduction of Toran and its importance. On the second day, the children were taught to make different designs and different types of torans using paper. On the third day, the children were informed about the working method of decorating the pylon. The objective of this workshop was to enable the children to decorate the doors of their homes by making torans by themselves on festivals.

## VARIOUS WORKSHOPS FOR 300 CHILDREN OF INDIAN AIR FORCE SCHOOL

300 children of Air Force Schools from across the country stayed at National Bal Bhavan in three groups (12 to 16 September, 2022, 19 to 23 September, 2022 and 26 to 30 September, 2022). The following workshops / programs were organized for all these children:-



**Inaugural ceremony** - On September 12, 2022, the inauguration ceremony of the workshop / program organized for the students of Air Force Schools was held at the Mekhla Jha Auditorium. AVM Rajeev Sharma - Indian Air Force, Shri Vipin Kumar - Chairperson & Joint Secretary (National Bal Bhavan & Ministry of Education) and Ms. Manisha Rajput, Group Captain - Indian Air Force were present in the program as guests. The inauguration ceremony began with the welcoming of guests and lighting of lamp, followed by colorful cultural programs presented by the Performing Arts Department. The dignitaries of the program addressed the children and blessed them. The program concluded with the national anthem.

## WORKSHOPS/ACTIVITIES:-

**Handicraft** - Paper Bird Craft Activity - Different types of birds, different types of animal shapes, mask making including animal-bird and human masks, book mark making, paper bag making, collage making, different types of paper crafts Flower making etc. were taught.





**NTRC** - Paper mache activity in which children created amazing art works with different types of papier mache was taught.

**Painting** - Painting, pencil shading, free hand painting, charcoal shading, Gond painting by color technique, water color painting, Warli painting etc. were taught.

**Physical Education** - Various games and activities were conducted for children.

**Folk dances** - Punjabi folk dance, Gujarati folk dance (Dandiya), Rajasthani folk dance were taught.

**Folk Music Section** Taught Rajasthani Folk Songs, Haryanvi Folk Songs, Gujarati Folk Songs, Bhojpuri Folk Songs.

**Vocal Music Section** - Bal Geet, Basanti Paridhan, Ghir Ghir Aai Re, Swadesh Matribhumi and some Bhajans and Sufi songs were taught.

**Air Force Gallery** - Demonstration of flight simulator and to operate it.

**Aero Modeling** - Drone Technology - Theoretical session on Drone Technology, Drone Rules, Drone Simulator Training and Drone Flight Highlights.

**Museum** - Moral stories on Panchatantra etc., stories related to jute exhibition and creating artefacts using waste material, jute, face masks based on Ramayana stories etc.

**Radio & Electronics** - Training on Electrical Gadgets and Household Wiring, Household Wiring Construction, Equipment Identification, Series Connection, Assemble and Action with Parallel Cone etc. were taught.

**Environment** - Brain information from paper cap, Human skeleton preparation from paper, Stamp making from waste material, Demonstration of nature printing by leaves and branches.

All the participating children and teachers were given a train ride. Children's Museum of National Bal Bhavan was visited. All the participating children and teachers were taken on a tour of Delhi. Campfire was organized for each group.

## STAR MAKING WORKSHOP BY HANDICRAFT SECTION

A three-day Star Making Workshop was organized by the Handicraft Section from 14th to 16th September, 2022. Children were taught how to make a star using the origami method. The aim of this workshop was to teach children making stars, so that they can decorate their house on festivals by making stars.

## HINDI PAKHWARA

From September 16 to September 29, 2022 Hindi Pakhwara program was organized. The main objective of the fortnight is to promote Hindi so that all the employees can do all their official work in Hindi. In this context, various competitions - noting-drafting, general knowledge, self-composed poetry, essay writing, Hindi typing, Hindi workshop etc. were organized under the Hindi Pakhwada programme.



## WORKSHOP FOR CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS BY COMPUTER SECTION

A five-day workshop for children with special needs was organized by the Computer Section from September 19 to 23, 2022. Children were exposed to the introduction of computers,



Information about how computers help in studies etc. Around 13 children and 6 trainers participated in this workshop.

## ONE DAY WORKSHOP FOR CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS BY RADIO & ELECTRONICS SECTION

A one-day workshop for children with special needs was organized by the Radio and Electronics Section on 21st December, 2022. In the workshop, the children were shown how electricity is generated by a magnetic field with various models. Children were also given exposure to working models. Around 13 children and 6 trainers participated in this workshop.

## CLASSICAL MUSIC WORKSHOP BY VOCAL SECTION

A three-day classical music workshop was organized by the Vocal Music Section from 28 to 30 September 2022. In the workshop, children were told and explained about the origin of ragas, relation of ragas with time cycle, ragas sung in different prahars, classification of ragas according to time etc. The children were also taught the bandishes, taranas etc. of the ragas to be sung at different times. Under this, children were taught Tarana in Raga Alhaiya Bilawal, Tillana in Raga Bhairavi and bandish of Teentaal in Raga Vrindavani Sarang. The workshop concluded with a questions answer session and all the compositions were rehearsed. About 28 children participated in this workshop.

## INSPECTION PROGRAM AT VIGYAN BHAWAN BY THE FIRST SUB-COMMITTEE OF THE COMMITTEE OF PARLIAMENT ON OFFICIAL LANGUAGE

On October 21, 2022, the inspection program was organized by the first sub-committee of the Committee of Parliament on Official Language at Vigyan Bhawan. 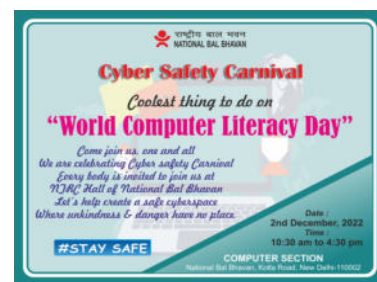
### ‘PRIZE DISTRIBUTION CEREMONY’ OF HINDI PAKHWADA PROGRAM

In the end, Deputy Director (Administration) – Mr. Mukesh Gupta greeted everyone on this occasion and gave a message of brotherhood to all. During the program, participants showered flowers on each other and greeted Holi festival. 200 participants were the part of this event.

## HINDI WORKSHOP

On March 10, 2023, a ‘Hindi workshop’ was organized through Google Meet, on the topic of ‘Voice typing and its use in e-office’. The objective of this workshop was to promote the use of official language Hindi in official works through the tools of voice typing. About 36 participants participated in the workshop.

## ‘28TH NATIONAL YOUNG ENVIRONMENTALIST CONFERENCE - PROGRAM’

National Bal Bhavan has been organizing Young Environmentalist Conference for the last 27 years. This year 28th National Conference of Young Environmentalists at Kilkari Bihar Bal Bhavan, Patna with the theme - ‘Restoration of Ecosystems’ was organized by National Bal Bhavan, New Delhi from March 12 to 14, 2023. Children and their escorts from 14 Bal Bhavans from 8 States participated in the conference. Shri Rishabh Arora from National Bal Bhavan coordinated this conference.



**In the first session**, the conference was inaugurated with the lighting of the lamp by Chief Guest Mr. Deepak Kumar Singh (Additional Chief Secretary, Education Department, Government of Bihar), Mrs. Jyoti Parihar (Director, Kilkari Bihar Bal Bhavan, Patna), Mr. Rishabh Arora (National Bal Bhavan, Coordinator), Dr. Gopal Sharma (Joint Director Zoological Survey of India, Govt. of India), children from Cha-Cha Bal Bhavan, Tamil Nadu and Bangalore Bal Bhavan. Mrs. Jyoti Parihar welcomed the guests by giving them saplings. In her address, Mrs. Jyoti Parihar encouraged the children to openly participate in the activities, eliminate hesitation and be friends with the children of all Bal Bhavans. Mr. Deepak Kumar Singh, Additional Chief Secretary, Education Department, in his address told the children about the ecological system and how we should sustain it. Joint Director of Zoological Survey of India, Patna, Dr. Gopal Sharma threw light on different ecosystem and what role we can play in its preservation and sustenance.



**In the second session**, Dr. Gopal Sharma showed several films related to the environment to the children and he explained in detail about 'Ecosystem Restoration' through power point presentation. He told the children about different types of ecosystems, aquatic, terrestrial, etc. After the presentation, the children also asked him many questions regarding environmental protection, to which they were satisfied after getting the answers. Some important questions like water conservation, air pollution, water pollution, extinct animals and birds and what is ecosystem were asked by the children.

In the second session, expert Dr. Ashok Ghosh interacted with the children. He gave the basic information to save the earth and save ourselves with the right lifestyle. He explained the myth and truth of situations related to water pollution and water scarcity with examples. He advised the kids to replace the plastic with other eco-friendly material. He shared an important fact that every type of water does not required filtration through R.O., we must check the existing quality of water before filtering it. A painting competition was also organized for children in this session in the presence of expert-artists, Mr. Umesh Kumar Sharma and Ms. Chhaya Tiwari in which an exhibition was also organized.

**The third session** was related to the case study on Ecosystem Restoration, in which Mr. Abhay Sinha, Senior Painter and Mr. Rajeev Ranjan Srivastava, Senior Painter, Dr. Gopal Sharma and Dr. Rashmi Komal were the experts. A projector presentation was given in front of them by the team of children of all 14 Bal Bhavans. On ecosystem, the children presented case studies focusing on the problems of their respective fields. Children gave their presentation on different themes, such as water conservation, water filtration, sparrow protection, plant protection etc. Through their skit, the children told that we should not throw garbage in our rivers, garbage should not be scattered around you. Water should not be wasted. Birds should be protected. All the children gave good scripts and theatrical presentation on their respective themes. The children of Amreli Bal Bhavan presented their theme through a puppet show. On this day the children were also taken on a tour of Patna City, Gurudwara. On this day, on the occasion of World Butterfly Day, the children also visited the Butterfly Garden located at Kilkari Bal Bhavan. Children learned that there are 62 different species of butterflies.

**Closing Ceremony Program** - The chief guest of the closing ceremony of the three-day program were - Mr. Vaidyanath Yadav (Secretary Education Department, Government of Bihar) and Mr. Amitabh (Project Director, Shri Kris28hnav Vigyan Kendra). In their address, the guests taught the children to befriend the environment, learn something new every day and keep doing team work. In the end, all the winning children and escorts were awarded and certificates were distributed by the guests. The program concluded with vote of thanks by Mr. Rishabh Arora (National Bal Bhavan, Coordinator).



## Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi

### INTRODUCTION

**Jawahar Bal Bhavan** is a rural unit of National Bal Bhavan. In the mid-sixties, a scheme for the establishment of Jawahar Bal Bhavans was initiated. The Jawahar Bal Bhavan at Mandi was an extension of this scheme. This rural unit was first set up in 1972 and started functioning from the chaupal of Mandi village. Villagers of Mandi donated 4.75 Acres of land to establish it. In 1973, Smt. Gandhi inaugurated the centre at its current location and it was christened



“Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi”. The main objective was to cater to the rural children of the Mandi, Mehrauli, Jaunpur, Gadaipur, Sultanpur, Manglapuri, Gwal pahari, Bandhwari, Asola, Aya Nagar, Ghitorni, Chattarpur, Maidan Garhi, rajpur, Satbari, Chandanhola, Fatehpur Beri, Dera, Bhatti Mines and Neb Sarai villages in and around Mandi. This is an institution which aims to enhance the creative potential of children by providing them various opportunities and a common platform to interact, experiment, create and perform according to their age, aptitude and ability. It offers a barrier-free environment with immense possibilities. Presently the ongoing activities are Physical Education; Art & Craft; Dance; Music; Computer; Home Management; Photography and Publication.

The year 2022-23 recorded the highest membership 1152. Children in large number participated in the plethora of activities throughout this year.

### PROGRAMME HIGHLIGHTS

#### Earth Day

Since 1970 Earth day is being observed each year to promote environmental conservation, plantation, recycling and use of alternate sources of energy. It is also observed every year in Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi with creative activities. The theme of this year's Earth Day was “Invest in our planet”. With this very theme in mind one member child wrote a beautiful poem which was subsequently released as an E-Poster with voice over by Publication Section. Another child made a beautiful 3D card depicting that each one on earth has a role to play to ensure its beauty. Let us all join hands to make this earth a better place. Other children also made drawings to depict the need to conserve mother earth.



#### Literary Meet

The first Day of Literary Meet was organized virtually by Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi and was graced by former Director of National Bal Bhavan and eminent writer Dr. Madhu Pant . The



Meet was coordinated by Publication Section. The children, specially the tiny little members participated in group poem writing activity from their homes with great enthusiasm under the online guidance of Madam Pant. The outcome was a lovely creative poem “Roti ki Daastan”.

### Celebration of International Dance Day

In honour of the creator of modern ballet (Jean-Georges Noverre (1727-1810)) his birthday i.e. 29<sup>th</sup> April is observed as International Dance Day annually to celebrate the art form. The day aims at raising awareness about the benefits of dance and bring people together through it. The theme for 2022 was “Dance for Life”. To mark this day children of Dance section presented Bharatnatyam and also depicted some dance forms and mudras through drawings.

### Celebration of Mother’s Day

Member children of Publication Section made digital and handmade greeting cards on the occasion of mother’s day.

### Celebration of Rabindranath Jyanti

Rabindra Jayanti is celebrated to mark the occasion of Rabindranath Tagore’s birth anniversary. This year 161<sup>st</sup> birth anniversary of Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore was observed on 9<sup>th</sup> May 2022. Children of Jawahar Bal Bhavan presented videos of Rabindra Nritya from their home on the song “amar hi yer manjhe” based on what they have learnt in class.



### Inauguration of Summer Fiesta

After a long gap of 2 years due to pandemic, Summer Fiesta was organized once again at Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi on May 20, 2022, . The first day commenced on a festive note with member children playing the traditional Nakkara and a variety of cultural programmes (playing instrumental music, different forms of dance and creative songs written by staff of JBB Mandi). Children were very happy to get together and enjoyed summer vacations without remaining confined in their homes. Children also enjoyed daily refreshment.



### World Environment Day

The concept of World Environment Day emerged after the Conference of Human Environment in 1972 at Stockholm with the slogan “Only One Earth”. The golden jubilee World Environment





Day was observed at Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi with a rally headed by a palanquin, pledge taking, plantation and cultural programmes.

The children of Art & craft section made masks of animals, placards, slogan and decorated the traditional palanquin (doli).

While all the children marched around the campus voicing slogans for environment protection holding placards and wearing animal, insect & flower masks. Further, children aged 13+ took out a rally with full security and monitoring outside the main gate to acquaint masses about the need to conserve and protect our environment. They carried Traditional Palanquin (doli) having plants. They sang songs based on environment and shouted slogans like 'Save Earth' 'Save Environment'. The early morning commuters were amazed to see the dedication of the children to the cause. The enthusiasm of the children knew no bounds and even the scorching heat could not deter them from their mission of generating Environment awareness. After the morning rally children presented cultural programme once again as an ode to mother nature.



### No Tobacco Day (11<sup>th</sup> June 2022)

A very informative talk on Oral Health was given by President Elect Indian Dental Association, South Delhi and Alumni NBB Dr. Chander Shekhar Joshi. Like previous years, a painting competition in association with Dr. Richa Joshi Memorial Foundation, was organised on the topics 'No Tobacco Day' and 'World Environment Day' in three age groups. All competition material, prizes each age group were arranged by the foundation. Prizes were distributed by alumni Chander Shekhar Joshi and staff of JBB Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi.



### World Music Day

To mark "World Music Day" member children gave presentation on various musical instrument at Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi and other member children presented classical song "Chota Khayaal" on Raag Durga.

### International Yoga Day

Children depicted various yogasans, ताड, सर्वांग, पर्वत, शिरआसान through clay work at the Art and Craft section of Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi on the day of International Yoga Day. To mark this day a grand display of mass Yogasanas was done in the open ground.





## Valedictory Function on Summer Fiesta

The valedictory function of Summer Fiesta was organized on 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2022, the occasion was graced by Ms. Ameli Dungdung, Principal Sarvodaya Kanya Vidyalaya. She was welcomed by member children with drums beats. She headed for the art and craft gallery, she was accorded a traditional welcome. Thereafter she took a round of the exhibition.

Children presented a fusion of cultural programmes comprising orchestra; Songs : welcome song, balgeet, classical song and desh bhakti geet; Dances : Lavani, Fisher Folk, Telengana Dance Lavni, Rajasthani Dance, Bharatnatyam, Skit, Recitation; Yoga and Skating Display.

Also there was a mesmerizing yoga display on the topics : Save Girl Child and Women Empowerment. A poster on Environmental Conservation was also released on this occasion.

## Harit Vahini

Knowledge about the process of cultivation and plantation in the era of technology is a big challenge for our children as every child has experience of only soft skills or online gaming activities etc.

To keep our children in touch with cultivation or plantation process Harit Vahini (हरित वाहिनी) i.e. Children's Green Force was revived where children learnt the process of cultivation and plantation under the supervision of the gardener and also try to follow the same at their home and enjoy. The greatest joy for them



is to see the fruits of their hard work when the vegetables etc. grew in their Harit Vahini Garden.

## Raksha Bandhan

Raksha Bandhan is related to mythology and history in the Hindu epic Mahabharata. In Mahabharata, Lord Krishna once cut his finger which then started bleeding. Seeing this Draupadi tore a piece of cloth from her saree and tied it on his finger to stop the bleeding. The piece of cloth then became a sacred thread and also Nobel laureate Rabindranath Tagore started



a mass Raksha Bandhan festival during the Partition of Bengal (1905), in which he encouraged Hindu and Muslim women to tie a rakhi on men from the other community and make them their brothers to indicate the bonding between the two communities.

The preparation for Raksha Bandhan had already started at Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi prior to the festival with member children making different kinds of Rakhies at Publication Section of JBB Mandi.

Raksha Bandhan is celebrated in JBB Mandi every year with Rakhies made by children. Girl member children tied Rakhi on the wrist of boys & teachers in a traditional manner indicating the bond among them. It displayed a pious relationship among children.



## Celebration of Independence Day

Independence Day of India is celebrated throughout the Country on the 15<sup>th</sup> August every year. The 76<sup>th</sup> Independence day was celebrated in JBB Mandi too with full joy over a period of two day with several activities of the children such as quiz, singing, dancing and drama from 12<sup>th</sup> August to 13<sup>th</sup> August. Member children, member institutions/NGOs participated in the programme.

Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi organized the quiz and sports events on 12<sup>th</sup> August, 2023 Member children and member schools were the participants as well as audience of this programme. The competitive rounds started with the game i.e. musical chair and then there was a quiz competition on freedom fighters and freedom struggle to enhance the knowledge of children on the occasion of 76<sup>th</sup> Independence Day and to convey the message of “Azaadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav”. Prior to the quiz competition a powerpoint presentation on freedom struggle was showcased by a member child which was made by himself.

On second day i.e. 13<sup>th</sup> August, 2023 children presented a song on freedom struggle from 1857 to 1947 written by Sh. Jamil Khan, Instructor (Instrumental Music). All the cultural programme had a common theme on this day. A very creative dance drama based on the life of ‘Jhansi Ki Rani’ also based on the poem “Bundele harbolon ke mooh hamne sunee kahani thi, khoob ladi mardani, woh to Jhansi wali rani thi” written by Subhadra Kumari Chauhan and the song Bhag Bhag Re Bhag Firangi Jhansi Ki Rani Hai Aayi. A theatre programme was presented by member children on Azizan Bai.

Brief Story of Azizan Bai - In June 1857, when the British army surrounded Nana Saheb the Maratha Peshwa at the fort of Kanpur, Azizan Bai opened her doors for his soldiers. After this incident, the soldiers started regularly using her place as a secret base to meet for deciding their war strategy. Azizan, on the direction of Tantaya Tope, General in Nana Saheb's Army visited the camp of British soldiers at night as a dancer but her real mission was to get important information for the rebels. She sacrificed her life for helping Nana Saheb on his mission.

The theatre was enacted under the direction of Sh. Shanker Day, who voluntarily renders service at JBB Mandi. All the freedom fighters were remembered on this day and homage was paid to them. After hoisting the flag, all the staff members and children marched around chanting slogans ‘Vande Matram’ and ‘Jai Hind’ with National flag of India and Azaadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav banner in hand.





Home Management section distributed 'Burfi' (a Sweet) were given to children and staff to celebrate 75<sup>th</sup> Aazadi Ka Amrit Mahotsava.

## Ganesh Chaturthi

Ganesh Chaturthi or Vinayak Chaturthi, one of the popular Hindu festivals of India is observed every year on the chaturthi tithi of Shukla Paksha in Bhadrapad Mas to celebrate the birth of Lord Ganesh. Ganesh Chaturthi was celebrated in Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi through online activity on 31/08/2022. Children learnt how to make a statue of Lord Ganesh in clay. Children made beautiful art work on Lord Ganesh and posted a video of the same on Social Media platform i.e. Facebook account of JBB Mandi.



## Teacher's Day Celebration

National Teachers Day is celebrated on September 5, to mark the birth anniversary of the Second President of India H.E. Dr. Sarvapalli Radhakrishnan, who was a statesman, philosopher and a scholar. Member children made greeting cards and wrote quotes of Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam sent their wishes others recited verses. An activity of making Greeting Cards with messages for teacher was done online on the occasion of teacher's day and these were compiled in a digital mode and uploaded on social media (i.e. facebook of JBB Mandi) by Publication Section.



On the occasion of teacher's day an animated digital book "Meri Kitab" (of the children, for the children, by the children) "Painting Banane Ki Kahani" prepared in Publication Section was released online. The book was an outcome of online meet with Dr. Madhu Pant, Former Director, NBB as part of Publication activity. It was a story of "making painting" and the characters were pencil, eraser, sharpener, paper and colour. It was made in digital mode and the voice over was given by a member child.

## Notepad making activity

Children learnt how to make notepad in simple steps in Publication Section. The steps they learnt to take up were as follows:-

- 1)Gathering up scrap paper, 2) Cutting paper to a uniform size, 3) Stacking the paper together to create a flat edge, 4) Using a paint brush to apply a small amount of padding compound onto the edge of the stack of paper, 5) Once dry, removing the binder clips. The notepad stick together at the top, 6) Embellishing the notepad with stamps on the bottom corner of each page, 7) Cutting a piece of cardstock to 3x11 inches, 8) Then to score the cardstock at the 4 inch and 4.25 inches, 9) Flipping the cardstock around and score at 2.25 and 2.5 inches, 10) Folding the cardstock on the score lines to create a fold over cover, 11) Gluing the back page of the notepad inside the cover, 12) Embellishing the cover with something of their choice.

These steps were uploaded on social media (Facebook account of JBB Mandi) so that more children can learn note pad making.

## Hindi Pakhwada Activity

Each year activities of "Hindi Pakhwada" are organized by NBB and the same is also conducted at JBB Mandi. This year also activities for staff, member children and children of member schools/ institutes/ NGO were organized from 16<sup>th</sup> to 29<sup>th</sup> September 22.



Member children and children of member schools participated in various activities like poetry writing; correcting incorrect words; general knowledge and poster making and slogan writing. Refreshments were distributed to the children after the activities.



A drama was also presented by member children under the direction of Sh. Shankar Dey. The play “Namkeen Rani” was conceptualized, scripted, composed and choreographed by children during the classes with Sh. Shankar Dey and was presented on the occasion of Hindi Pakhwada.

Children and Staff members of Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi received prizes from Director, National Bal Bhavan, on 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2022 in different categories of competitions organized during Hindi Pakhwada. Children got prizes in all streams like general knowledge; correcting sentences; poem writing; poster making and slogan writing. Similarly staff members too won prizes in different categories. Proud moment was when Anshika, a member child won the first prize in poetry writing competition on the topic “Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav”. She recited the same poem during the award ceremony.

### International Day of Peace

The International Day of Peace celebrates the power of global solidarity for building a peaceful and sustainable world. Publication section conducted a very creative online activity to observe this day. Member children of Jawahar Bal Bhavan made beautiful paintings and posters to mark this day.



### Diwali

The festival of lights was observed at Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi in a traditional manner with lighting of lamps and traditional Rangoli. Traditional diyas were decorated by children in the Publication Section and were lighted around the campus. Traditional decorations made by children were displayed from the entry gate onwards which gave JBB Mandi a festive look. Children enjoyed some fun games too.



### Constitution Day

Constitution Day was observed at JBB Mandi. Children and staff took the pledge and fundamentals of the Constitution were discussed. Topic like the Constituent Assembly, its members, the adoption of the Constitution on 26<sup>th</sup> November 1949 by the Constituent Assembly and how it came into effect on 26th January 1950, when India became a Sovereign Socialist Democratic Republic were discussed. Fundamental Rights, Fundamental Duties and Directive Principles were also discussed with children.

Universal Children's Day was observed on 26<sup>th</sup> November. A Children's Creativity Fair was organized with lot of fun filled activities. A sports meet was organized with events like musical chair, race etc.. Special activities were organized by Publication Section, Home Management and Photography Section.



There were competitive rounds of Instrumental Music and Dance which was followed by presentation of play "Udaan" conceptualized by children during theatre classes taken up by Sh. Shankar Dey who is voluntarily working with children. "Udaan" is about inculcating values in school life and becoming a learner in the real term. Thereafter, children presented dances and recited poems.

## Observance of International Day for Elimination of Violence Against Women

International Day for Elimination of Violence Against Women was observed on 25<sup>th</sup> November. The message was spread through children and staff by making posters/writing poems and recitation and presenting songs.

## Observance of Discrimination Against Women Pakhwada

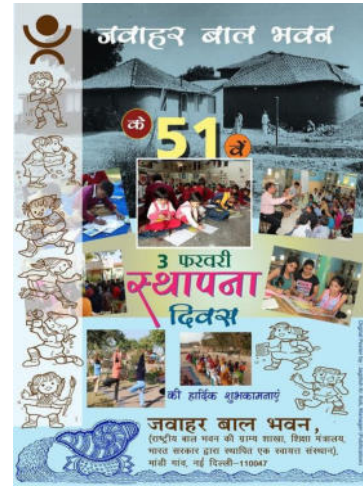
Excitement was writ large on the faces of member children, former members, volunteers at Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi as they prepared for 51<sup>st</sup> Mandi Divas (Founders Day: 3<sup>rd</sup> February).

On the first Day (28<sup>th</sup> Jan) Special Live Painting Activity was organized for volunteers and former members. Volunteers were asked to draw or paint what they want to represent.

As live painting is a form of Visual Performance Art, where artists complete an art work live in front of audience. This needs participation-spirit and depicts experience of what they learnt as students.

On the second Day (31<sup>st</sup> Jan ) member children participated in painting competition. On the third day ( 1<sup>st</sup> Feb) Member children participated in Fancy Dress Competition. On 1st February senior children participated in Lino Printmaking workshop. The purpose of the workshop was to learn the basics of lino printmaking and simple lino printmaking by using a few basic materials was taught to them. Prints are the medium to reproduce drawings in large quantities. Lino printmaking is a method of relief printing, which involves carving a drawing into a soft linoleum block, rolling a thin layer of ink over it, and pressing paper on top to transfer the image. The areas where you have carved away, often creates quite beautiful results. Lino prints look bold with hard lines, flat areas of colour, and high contrast between the paper and ink. Printing is fairly fast in this medium, so multiple copies can be made easily. Also this is a process to know about the negative space and positive space. This was new medium for the students of Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi and they enjoyed it a lot. Some children also did Wood Carving.

On the third day (2nd February) Publication Section organized a special activity for the children Greeting Card & book marks making using the technique of thumb painting was taught and children were fascinated while doing the same themselves. Children also learnt paper craft. Later in the day, there were Sport event for the children.

## SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### 1. Accounts

- a. The Financial Statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention and generally on the accrual method of accounting unless otherwise stated.
- b. Separate set of accounts are maintained by the National Bal Bhavan in respect of Main A/c, GPF & NPS.
- c. All Receipts on account of fees/subscription and refund of unspent grants are accounted on receipts basis.

### 2. Grants-in-Aid

Grants are recognized on receipt basis & taken to credit of Income & Expenditure account except to the extent of expenditure of capital nature incurred (which amount is credited directly to the capital fund).

### 3. Fixed assets and Depreciations

- a. Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition less depreciation. Fixed assets received as Gifts by the National Bal Bhavan has been merged with the Fixed Assets of the Society. Books received as Gifts are valued at selling price.
- b. Receipts, if any, on the sale of obsolete/unserviceable assets is taken as income under the head 'Misc Receipts'.

### 4. Depreciation

- 4.1 During the year depreciation has been charged on Straight line method at the prescribed rate as provided in new format for standardization of accounts issued by MHRD.
- 4.2 In respect of additions to fixed assets during the year, depreciation is provided for full year and in respect of deductions from the fixed assets, no depreciation is charged.

### 5. Specific Expenses / Payments

#### *a. Printing & Stationery*

The amount spent for printing & stationery, is treated as expenditure as and when incurred. No adjustments are made in accounts for the closing stocks, as the value is not determinable.

#### *b. Telephone Deposit*

Deposit for telephone and allied facilities is written off during the year of installation/commissioning and charges/ expenditure bills are accounted for at the net value.



**6. Interest on All Deposits / Investments is accounted for on accrual basis.**

**7. Employees Salaries / Benefits**

- a. Central Government Employees service rules are by and large, made applicable to the employees of the National Bal Bhavan.
- b. Retirement benefits are accounted for on the basis of Actuarial Valuation done by approved valuer as per Accounting Standard 15.
- c. The NBB maintains a separate Notified Provident Fund account for its employees.



## NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

1. Grant received from Government, based on budget approved by the Parliament, constitute main source of receipts of the NBB. Though the grants received (after the adjustment of expenditure of capital nature) are taken to income and expenditure account, the effective income of the NBB is nil in the light of restrictions that without sanction of Government, the unspent balance of Grants cannot be carried over from one financial year to another. Thus, this does not attract any Income tax liability.
2. Expenditure on Establishment, Printing and Stationery and Telephone deposits have been given the accounting treatment as per accounting policy.
3. An amount of Rs 39.76 lakhs has been shown as Assistance to State in Schedule-8 (Loans, Advances & Deposits) which were outstanding as on 31.03.2023 due to Non receipt of Utilization Certificates from the State Bal Bhavans.
4. An advance of Rs 311.55 lakhs has been paid to CPWD as per Schedule-8 (Loans, Advances & Deposits) upto 31.03.2023 (previous year Rs 348.54 lakhs).
5. During the current year, Prior period Income of Rs 36.380/- & Prior Period expenses of Rs 15.41 Lakhs have been booked.
6. NBB has received funds from MSJE in previous years for special project. Unspent balance amounting to Rs 51.76 Lakhs (Previous Year is Rs 50.29 Lakhs) along with interest up to 31.03.2023 is lying with NBB's Canara Bank Account for this Project. Provision has been made in the books for amount payable to MSJE (Including Interest).
7. An amount of Rs 8,759 is shown as balance lying with Bank in Jammu & Kashmir since long. As informed to us, the Bank Branch was in Kashmir & now it is not traceable. It is suggested to write off the same.
8. Sundry Debtors of Rs 3,71,575/- (Schedule-7) remained unrealized and since the balances are outstanding for more than 5 years, it is suggested to write off the balance, in case the same are not recoverable.
9. Provision has been made for Interest payable to MHRD for FY 2022-23.
10. Endowment fund of Rs. 10,000/- has been taken to Donation Income during the year under Miscellaneous receipts (Schedule No. 13).
11. Women & Child development fund of Rs. 2,40,835/- which was shown as Endowment fund in the previous years has been taken under Current Liabilities during the year (Schedule No. 3).
12. Advances made and shown as recoverable are adjusted to final head of account/recovered on receipt of final bill/receipt from the concerned party/department.
13. In the opinion of the Management of NBB, Current Assets Loans and Advances shall have a value on realization in ordinary course of business, at least equal to the amount at which they are stated in the Balance Sheet. Provision has been made for all known liabilities.
14. Previous year figures have been regrouped wherever considered necessary.
15. Figures in the final accounts have been rounded to the nearest rupee.

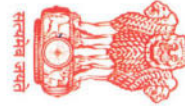

## Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of National Bal Bhavan for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March 2023



We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of National Bal Bhavan (NBB) as at 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2023 and Income & Expenditure Account/Receipts & Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 20(1) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971. The audit has been entrusted for the period up to 2022-23. These financial statements are the responsibility of the National Bal Bhavan Management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Report/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
4. Based on our audit, we report that:
  - (i) We have obtained all the information and explanation, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
  - (ii) The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account/Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format prescribed by the Government of India, Ministry of Education.
  - (iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the National Bal Bhavan, in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
  - (iv) We further report that:
    - A. **Balance Sheet**
      - A.1 **Assets**
        - A.1.1 **Fixed Assets (Schedule 4) - Rs. 7.69 crore**

Land and Building should be depicted in the Balance Sheet/Schedule as two separate heads of account. This has been repeatedly pointed out by audit since 2012-13 but rectification has not been done. This has resulted in incorrect charging of depreciation on land with consequent understatement of Fixed Assets and Capital Fund (Amount not quantifiable). Moreover the Assets register should also show the area of each parcel of land separately as freehold and leasehold.





### A.1.2 Loans, Advances & Deposits (Schedule 8) – Rs. 4 crore

The above includes advances of Rs. 3.12 crore given to CPWD for various works during the period March 2008 to March 2023. Out of these, works for which advances of Rs. 0.69 crore was given has been completed and completion certificate has been received but the adjustment for the same is still pending. Out of the remaining advances work of Rs. 2.01 crore has been completed but the adjustment has not been done for want of completion certificate/account statement.

This has resulted in overstatement of Loans, Advances & Deposits and understatement of Fixed Assets/Expenditure by Rs. 2.70 crore.

### B. General

**B.1** Investment of Rs. 2.13 lakh in Government Securities pertaining to the period 1980-83 and of Rs. 16759 at GPO New Delhi of GPF accounts could not be varified as the related records were not made available to Audit. NBB stated that the records are not traceable. A decision regarding write off of this amount needs to be taken by the Management. This is being repeatedly pointed out since 2011-12 but no action has been taken by the Management to write off the amount. This has resulted in overstatement of Assets and Capital Account of GPF by Rs. 2.30 lakh.

**B.2** NBB Notes to the Account (Schedule 24 – Point 7 and 8) indicates that the following amounts are required to be written off:

- (i) An amount of Rs. 8,759 as balance lying with J&K bank not traceable and
- (ii) Sundry Debtors of Rs. 3.71 lakh (Schedule 7) remained unrealized.

However, NBB has not written off the above amount from the accounts. This is being pointed out since 2017-18 but action has not been taken.

**B.3** Out of Rs. 39.76 lakh depicted in loans, advances and deposits (Schedule 8), an advance of Rs. 24.76 lakh to State Bal Bhavan/Bal Kendras for the period from 2012-13 to 2021-22 was outstanding as on 31-03-2023 due to non receipt of utilization certificate from State Bal Bhavan/Bal Kendras. The utilization certificate should be obtained immediately before the finalization of accounts so that the expenditure for the year may be taken to the income and expenditure account in the year of expenditure itself and not shown as advance in accounts. This is being pointed out since 2013-14 but UCs or huge amounts are still pending.

### C. Grants-in-aid

National Bal Bhavan received grant-in-aid of Rs. 2051.5 lakh (Grant for creation of Capital Assets: Rs. 100 lakh and Recurring Grant: Rs. 1951.50 lakh) from Ministry of Education during 2022-23. It had unspent balance of previous year amounting to Rs. 161.00 lakh (Grant for creation of Capital Assets: Rs. 0 and Recurring Grant: Rs. 161.00 lakh). Out of the total funds of Rs. 2212.50 lakh, National Bal Bhavan utilized Rs. 1931.47 lakh (Grant for creation of Capital Assets: Rs. 100.00 lakh and Recurring Grant: Rs. 1831.47 lakh) leaving a balance of Rs. 281.03 lakh (Grant for creation of Capital Assets: Rs. 0 and Recurring Grant: Rs 281.03 lakh) as on 31 March 2023.

### D. Management Letter :

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of Director, National Bal Bhavan through a Management Letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

- v Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- vi In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanation given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report, give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India:
  - a. in so far as they relate to the Balance Sheet of the state of affairs of the National Bal Bhavan, Delhi as at 31 March 2023; and
  - b. in so far as they relate to the Income and Expenditure Account of the surplus for the year ended on that date.

## Annexure to Audit Report

### 1. Adequacy of Internal Audit System

- The NBB has no internal audit section/Department of its own. It also has no audit manual.

### 2. Adequacy of Internal Control System.

The internal control of National Bal Bhavan is inadequate due to :

- Non obtaining of utilisation certificates from State Bal Bhavans/Bal Kendras in respect of advances given to them pertaining to the period from 2011-12 to 2021-22.
- Non adjustment of advances given to CPWD since 2007-08.

### 3. System of physical verification of Fixed Assets.

- Physical verification of Fixed Assets including Books & Publication was conducted upto March 2022.

### 4. System of physical verification of inventory.

- Physical verification of inventory like stationery and other consumable items was conducted upto March 2023.

### 5. Regularity in payment of dues.

- As per Accounts, no payment over six months in respect of statutory dues was outstanding as on 31.03.2023.
