Introduction



National Bal Bhavan, is an autonomous body under the Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Education, Govt. of India. This institution is a non-formal education center for children between the age group of 5 to 16 years. It was established in 1956, keeping in mind the dream of unmasking learning through the thinking, imagination, creative and entertaining activities for the children. Bal Bhavan has taken the form of a movement with 141 affiliated Bal Bhavans and Bal Kendras across the country. Apart from this, a rural

Jawahar Bal Bhavan in Mandi village, Delhi and other 40 Bal Kendras are also functioning in Delhi. National Bal Bhavan provides children with different activities and opportunities in accordance with their age, efficiency and strength, to develop children's creativity and skill. This institution provides children a stress free and fear free environment with a great scope of possibilities. National Bal Bhavan and its affiliated institutions run regular programs for children especially for the lower strata of society.

The objective of this organization is to develop the child's creative ability by working on a common platform through various activities, opportunities, deliberations and experiences. Bal Bhavan provides an opportunity to every child and the freedom to fabricate innovative creations by learning through play way method, furthermore it helps to develop their creative potential through activities like dance, drama, music, creative arts, photography, computer etc. National Bal Bhavan, has emerged as a centre where children get their overall personality development at one place through various activities as well as strengthening the spirit of unity.

Every year thousands of children become members of National Bal Bhavan. The institute has started working in 1956 with meager 300 member children but over the years it has increased its membership strength and now lakhs of children are taking advantages of its various facilities. To reach the children of different areas, 40 Bal Kendras were established in many areas of Delhi State. These Bal Kendras fulfill the needs of all the children coming from different strata of society. Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi is a rural unit of National Bal Bhavan, which is working under NBB and provides parallel services to the rural population of surrounding villages. State Bal Bhavans and Bal Kendras have been opened in all parts of the country and remote tribal areas and they are providing similar services everywhere.

Objectives

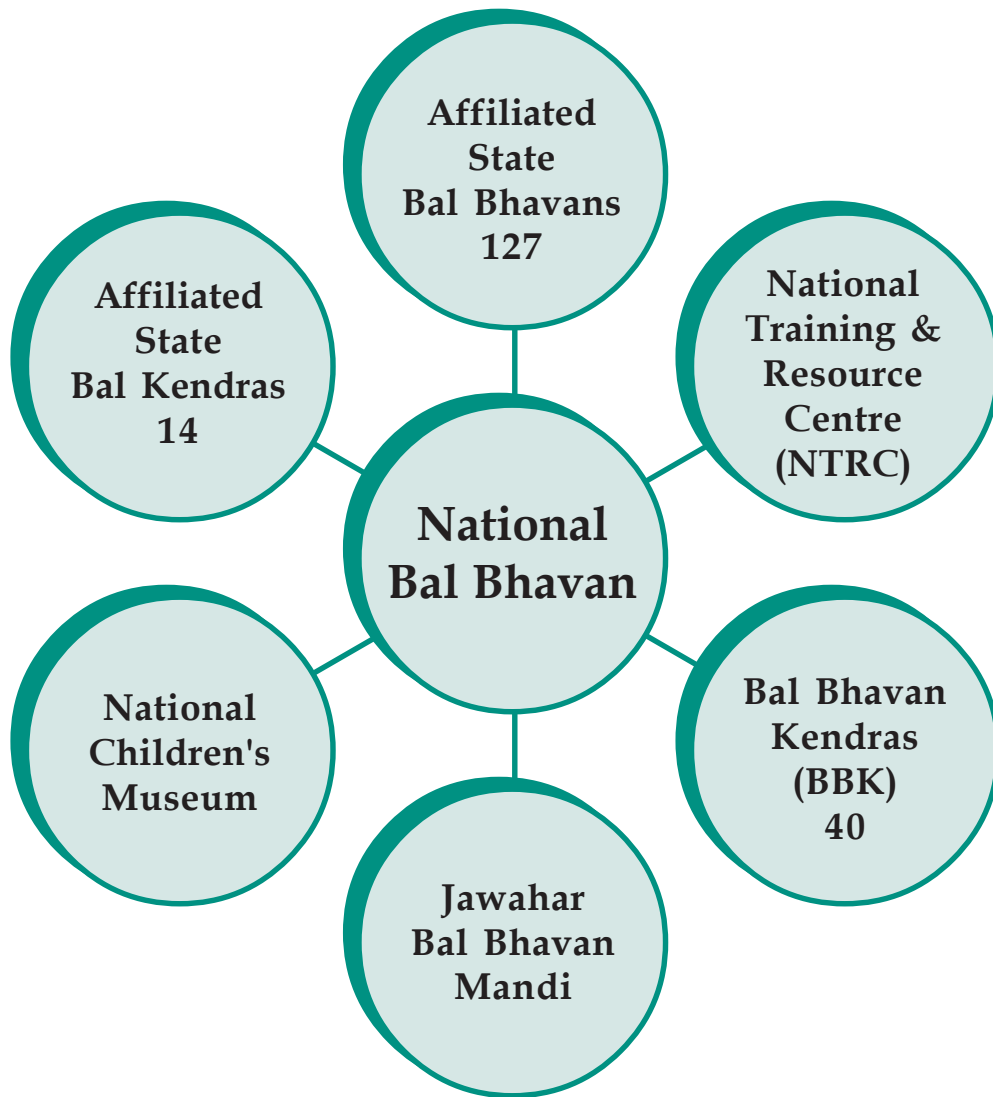
The objectives of National Bal Bhavan are :

Activities at a Glance

CREATIVE ART

Creative Art activities are aimed to provide an opportunity to children for their self expression and development of aesthetic sensitivity of children and also to encourage the talent hidden in their personality. There are various activities in creative art, which have been divided under sub-heads which are as follows:-

Integrated Activities

Integrated Activities Section attracts children of all age groups. Children especially of small age group generally take interest in Traditional Arts. Being a multimedia section, children can easily shift from one medium to other media. Creative and value-based games are also developed in this section. Traditional Folk Art created with sticks (instead of brush) and use of natural colours is an added attraction of this section. Children also learn to make toys with papier mache and do paper craft in this section. This section creates awareness about Mehndi Art, Warli, Madhubani etc.



Painting



Children in this section express their creativity by drawing and painting with crayons, Water colours, Oil colours, pencil and Charcoal. This activity is equally popular with senior children as well as younger ones. Younger children make drawings as per their imagination whereas senior ones enjoy drawing portraits, sketches, natural scenery and do theme based drawings. Children are also taught Batik, Tie and Dye, Block printing techniques.

Handicraft

Activities in this section are special as children make objects with waste materials such as old newspapers, old magazines, card board boxes, used boxes, bulbs, buttons, embossed papers, thermocol, clippings, seeds, wire, leaves, scrap of trees etc. Children are free to make objects with the help of these items. Creation of beautiful art work & products with waste materials depict the imagination and creativity of children.





Weaving

Weaving activity is an activity where children learn making of various artistic items such as wall hangings, Lamp shades, Tapestry, scenery etc., through techniques of weaving. They are motivated to create beautiful objects. They learn different types of knots and weaving patterns and make mats, sceneries and small carpets of their own.



Stitchery



Toy making, puppet making, macrame, crochet work etc. are attractions of stitching & embroidery section. Children learn basics of cutting and stitching of clothes and also different types of designing, patch work and creative embroidery. Toy making with cotton fill is also a popular activity of this section. Children learn making of wall hangings, different types of stitches which help in developing creativity among children.

Clay Work

Activities in this section are helpful in establishing co-ordination between mind, heart and hands in children. Here children learn making animals, human faces and shapes, sceneries and designs with the help of mould by using papier mache, plaster of Paris and clay. This section provides an opportunity to involve children by using new innovative and creative ideas while giving shape to the clay. Potter's Wheel is also used at times to teach pottery to children.



Woodcraft



Children are acquainted with different techniques used while making various wooden objects. Children also learn how to examine the durability of a particular wood for making various items from wood. Children are also acquainted with making mural through wood cutting on wooden frames and creating drawings with saw-dust is also taught. Children also learn to make pen stand, pen holder, small box, toys, pot cover etc. They are also taught to carve wood and to design beautiful object from

it. They also learn art of making beautiful things from wood dust.

SCIENCE ACTIVITIES

The aim of Science Education is to develop "Scientific" temperament among the children. Science Section is not merely a subject of class laboratory but a part of biggest laboratory that is nature through which children enhance their knowledge about day to day happenings and linking them with scientific principles. National Bal Bhavan believes in adopting various interesting activities for making children understand the basic principles of science. An important aspect of science teaching system of National Bal Bhavan is "Integrated approach" in which other activities



become an integral part of learning. This section is having different Sub-sections which help children to learn Scientific laws and principles. The children are also taught Physics and Natural Science along with use of science in everyday life. Activities in this section include Radio Electronics, Aero-Modelling, Machine Modelling, Astronomy, Computers, Aquarium and Animal Corner, How and Why club and Environment. All activities section use practical approach to generate interest in science and life related issues.

For children taking part in science activities, it is not necessary for them to have science as a subject in their syllabus, what is important here is that they must have curiosity and desire for learning “Why” and “How”. Film shows and camps are also organized by this section from time to time.

Science section has following sub sections :

Physical & Natural Sciences (How and Why Club)

Children opt for projects under this section, and satiate their curiosity of “How” and “Why” through this club. Making creative scientific models, Educational Tour, Science Quizzes etc. are some of the activities which invariably enhance knowledge of children and encourage them to learn something new. The workshops are also conducted. Children are also provided laboratory equipments for experiments and scientific games etc.



Inventors Club

Children are encouraged to conduct experiments and learn innovative techniques in this section. They learn the concept of Machine Modelling and thereafter designing it, thereby understanding different aspects connected with their project. Children understand how machines are designed using cardboard as base material.

Radio and Electronics club

Children from 10 to 16 years of age are given membership of Radio & Electronics club. Basic Principles of Electronics, wiring, repair of domestic equipment, new experiments in circuits, radio, connecting T.V. parts are various activities undertaken by this club. Children are imparted training in Digital projects, new source of energy such as solar energy models etc. More and more children are having membership of “HAM Radio Club”. Keeping in view of ever rising means of developed communication, Ham Amateurs club has also been launched in National Bal Bhavan for Radio listeners to enable member children to establish “HAM Station” at their home and establish contact with their dear ones.



Aero Modelling

An expensive hobby such as Aero Modelling is made accessible and easy by National Bal Bhavan to its member children. Children learn the basic principles of wind power and making models



of different aircrafts. In addition, they enjoy flying models made by them. Main aim of this activity is to acquaint children with Aviation and related Science and develop interest in this discipline. Children also try experimenting with various designs of aeroplanes, parachutes etc. to understand the flying mechanics. Model rocketry workshops are also organised by this section.



Computer



Computer is a very popular activity which attracts children in large number. Children learn basics of computer language and also learn to do programming. Children are provided with software along with computer games. This activity is supplementary to their school education. Internet knowledge is also given by National Bal Bhavan to the children so that they may be well versed with latest system. A number of useful workshops and seminars are also conducted on new systems and procedures. Children learn

photoshop and digital printing techniques. Cyber Security awareness is spread for safety of children and is a regular feature of the section.

Environment

Harit Vahini campaign was started on 19 November, 1986 to indulge children into the mainstream environmental consciousness and activism. Environment Section was created for the implementation of this campaign. This section has grown over the years by expanding the scope of awareness about the most important issues of environment. The section through its hands on activities, field work and project work creates interest in environment amongst children. Ample importance is given to Environment Science and Nature for preservation of natural resources along with preservation of culture, art & craft, folk art and literature, historical monuments etc. Rain Water Harvesting and solar power related projects are given special attention. In addition to it many projects related to Environment are undertaken and children are taught through field visits, surveys, waste recycling etc. To reach out to maximum number of children and create maximum awareness, a National Conference of “Young Environmentalist” is being organized since 1990. Children from different parts of the country participate in this meet and interact on various aspects of environment and discuss the social, emotional and cultural part of this.



Astronomy

The Sky above holds unknown milky ways having various unsolved mysteries. People are striving to solve these mysteries from time immemorial. A lowcost astronomical unit has been established in Bal Bhavan. Children enjoy activities in this section. They remain curious to have more and more information about stars and sky above. In the past years Astronomy Section





conducted Telescope making workshops for Delhi school children and at an International level for SAARC countries.

Aquarium and activities related to animal corner

Children get basic information about zoology and animals in this section. This section organises workshops related to “Make your own aquarium” and provide information about animals. Children get information regarding the concepts of adaptations, viscosity, marine life, aquatic plants, etc. and learn morphology, food habits and habitations etc. of pet animals.

LIBRARY ACTIVITIES

National Bal Bhavan has a library with a large number of interesting books for children. These books are on Art, Craft, Culture, Science, Mathematics, Mass media, Computers, stories, fiction and poetry etc., along with a reference section. Books in Hindi, English, Urdu, Tamil and Bangla languages are also in the library. Various journals, magazines are also available in the library. Apart from reading activity this section also organises activities on creative writing for children.



PHOTOGRAPHY

In National Bal Bhavan children are acquainted with various aspects of photography such as history of photography, basics of camera, digital camera and technique of handling a digital camera for clicking photos of various themes like nature, portrait, model, project, Industry etc. Importance of light, natural light and time of clicking photos is an integral part of teaching photography. Children take photo of people, animal, birds, their habits, various movements, people living in different habitats and their life styles. Children also learn how to make Coffee Table book using Photoshop techniques.

Videography classes and workshops are also conducted by this section, where children prepare video programmes. Team of Children perform activities such as script writing, camera handling, dialogue, and voice recording to film production under the supervision of their





Instructor. Photography section also organises exhibition of the photos on various themes covered by children to motivate them. The section also organises specific photography courses for adults.

Main attractions of this section are:

- Digital Photography
- Photoshop techniques for digital enhancement.
- Field visits and heritage walks to take pictures of nature, monuments etc. and making a photo journal.
- Photo exhibition and display is also done towards the end of a training programme.
- Photography training programme is also organised for adults.

PERFORMING ARTS

Performing Art provides opportunity to children to develop their imagination with the help of various activities and translate it into action to recognize their talent. Children learn Dance, Drama, Music, Instrumental Music, Vocal music etc. Children also acquaint themselves with traditional folk music and dance of different cultures.

Performing Arts Section consists of the following sub-sections:

- Vocal Music (classical & folk)
- Instrumental Music (percussion and string instruments of Indian origin)
- Classical Dance (Kathak, Bharatnatyam)
- Folk Dance
- Drama





PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Sports and physical activities are favourite of children of all age groups. National Bal Bhavan provides various type of sports activities to children such as: Table Tennis, Badminton, Football, Cricket, Basket Ball, Judo and Skating etc. It has its own Gymnasium for exercise. Children not only get information related to these sports but are also encouraged to develop their own creative and interesting games.

Judo has added many proud moments for this institution. National Bal Bhavan has had the privilege to train such children who have proved themselves not only at National but at international level also. Physical Education Section conducts inter-school tournament in which children of various schools and institutions actively participate and enjoy.



Skating is also very popular among children and perhaps Physical Education Section also organize inter school Cricket and Football competitions in Bal Bhavan and children of various schools participate in competitions and enjoy it. National Bal Bhavan's play ground and Physical Education Section are also made available to member schools of National Bal Bhavan. This section also arranges adventures camps, trekking and other field trips as well. Creative games are also organised for children from time to time.

Main attractions of this section are as under:

- Indoor & Outdoor sports
(Table Tennis, Badminton, Cricket, Basket Ball)
- Judo
- Skating
- Gymnasium (Indoor, Outdoor)
- Carrom Board
- Shooting



HOME MANAGEMENT

Children are acquainted with good and smooth home management by this section. In this section children try their hands on varieties of dishes. They learn cooking of nutritious and healthy foods so that they may be self reliant. Children are taught how to prepare budget of kitchen and estimation. Regular discussions are held with children about Health & Hygiene and Cleanliness which is useful for them. Various workshops are organized like Flower Arrangement (Ikebana), Bakery products etc.



Main attraction of this section are as under :

- Home Management, Table layout etc.
- Cooking and Baking
- Food Preservation
- Flowers Arrangement

MUSEUM TECHNIQUES' CLUB

National Children Museum of National Bal Bhavan organises theme based exhibition on various occasions and enhances knowledge of children. This is a unique Children's Museum in India. It has permanent exhibition galleries and thousands of children visit the same and these exhibitions supplement and complement the school education curriculum. Another activity of National Children Museum is "Museum Techniques' Club" which demonstrate techniques of preparing Clay and "Cast" replica from Plaster of Paris and children are taught from simple techniques to specific work such as "Piece Mould". In this section children are also taught mounting, script writing and technique for arranging exhibitions etc. Children undergo experience which enhances their knowledge about nature, history, culture, science and technology. Children are educated about our ancient civilization, our history, its ancient heritage and culture as well. Children visit excavation sites to have direct and first hand experience. Special workshops are conducted for children and their visits are also arranged to various historical monuments.

Main attraction of this section are as under :

Moulding and Casting, Designing Exhibitions, Historical and Cultural Interactions, Preservation and Conservation of Museum objects and other Field work.





National Children's Museum

National Children's Museum is an integral part of National Bal Bhavan which has been designed in line with the psychology of growing children and their curiosity of viewing and looking at the world around them. Museum has a rich collection of precious objects which include Toys from other countries, Stone & Metal objects/items, traditional ornaments, pots and utensils, art and craft items, instruments, turbans/headgears, aircraft, satellite and information related to historical monuments. National Children's Museum is the only institution which enjoys the status of being a National Level Children's Museum. National Children's Museum advocates this fact that Children's Museum is an important source for developing the knowledge of children.



Various exhibitions are arranged in different galleries of this museum, first one is permanent exhibition and other one is temporary exhibition. One of the galleries of the museum is reserved for temporary exhibition, where exhibitions are organised on special subjects and special themes.

Permanent exhibition in the museum has a special attraction "Hamara Bharat" is a prominent one (spread over in 8500 sq.ft.) and it displays lifestyle of Indian people, their live culture, rich art and craft, diversity of religion and costumes, progress in science and technology which draws the attention of the viewers and visitors. Gaurav Gatha (spread over in 1855 sq. ft. area) depicts the era of golden past, its culture, wars etc. which has been arranged in chronological order. Surya Gallery (spread over in more than 8000 sq.ft. area) in which importance of "Surya" is outlined along with civilization of Egypt Mesopotamia, China, Greek etc. Place and importance of Surya in their civilization is depicted. Origin of surya i.e. the Solar system and Earth etc. is also shown here, in other words: presentation of Surya is depicted from both mythological and scientific point of view. Traditional Art and Craft gallery: Treasure for the future generation (spread over in 1700 sq.ft. area) exhibition displays art work of renowned artists. All these exhibition are open for the public.

National Training Resource Centre

The aim and objective of NTRC is to provide integrated training to teachers and adults by Creative methodology and participation in Creative Art, Performing Art and Science activities. Proposals for Training in Physical Education, Sports, Library activities are also under consideration. It has been felt that the work and performance of children be given recognition and this can be achieved by training teachers in creativity.

With the help of various media and creative methods, National Bal Bhavan encourages teachers to recognize the sustained imagination and thought process of children, their creative expression, innovation and capacity of originality and thereby enhancing their capability. Various demonstrations are arranged for rural, semi-rural and urban teachers/instructors to make the art as an imparting education and powerful medium of expression.





Our Programmes

National Bal Bhavan, one of the top organizations is working for the overall development of children across the country. National Bal Bhavan works by keeping this fact in mind that millions of children in India are from such families, who live below the poverty line and whose parents do not even meet their primary needs. National Bal Bhavan is playing an important role by reaching lakhs of children through its 127 affiliated State Bal Bhavans and 14 State Bal Bhavan Kendras and also through 40 Bal Bhavan Kendras functioning in Delhi region. The activities of National Bal Bhavan are not confined to our country, but NBB is spreading its philosophy through its programmes of cultural inter-change with children residing in other countries of the world. As such, National Bal Bhavan is imparting education to children through its recreational and creative activities at Local, District, State, National and International levels.

- Under the 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsava', 'Organ Donation' program was organized on August 3, 2023, under which employees took 'Organ Donation' pledge.
- On the occasion of 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsava', 'Meri Maati, Mera Desh' program was organized from 9 to 30 August, 2023 under which 'Paanch Pran' pledge was taken.
- Hindi Pakhwada program was organized from 16th September to 4th October, 2023. The main objective of the program was to promote Hindi.
- Vigilance Awareness Week Program was organized at National Bal Bhavan from 30th October to 5th November, 2023 in which integrity pledge was taken.

Detailed report

Different types of workshops for children of Air Force schools

Different creative and wonderful activities were organized at National Bal Bhavan in two groups for 400 children of Air Force schools from all over India from 11 to 15 April, 2023 and from 25 to 29 April, 2023. The main activities children enjoyed were Handicraft, Papier Mache, Integrated Activities, Painting, Sewing, Physical Education, Folk Dance, Folk Music, Vocal Music, Air Force Gallery, Drone Technology, Museum, Radio and Electronics, Environment etc. Children participated enthusiastically and learned a lot during these activities. All the participating children and teachers also enjoyed a train ride.



Closing ceremony

The closing ceremony of the first group was held on 15.04.2023 and that of second group was held on 29.04.2023. The chief guest were Mrs. Neeta Chaudhary and Air Vice Marshal - Shri Rajeev Sharma (Assistant Chief of Air Staff, Indian Air Force). Air Vice Marshal Shri PS Karkare, Shri K. Anantharaman, Smt. Mukta Agarwal (Director, NBB), Shri Mukesh Gupta, Deputy Director (Administration) were present. An exhibition of the works done by the children during the workshops was also organized by the Museum section in the closing ceremony which was inaugurated by the Chief



Guest. The ceremony started with a group song by the children of Air Force schools in Mekhla Jha Auditorium, then the children performed songs, folk songs and folk dances learnt during the workshops. The performances were highly appreciated and encouraged by all the guests.

Earth Day

Earth Day program was organized at Mekhla Jha Auditorium of National Bal Bhavan on 21st April, 2023. The theme of this program was 'Investing in Our Planet'. Dr. Ratan K. Dutta (Director, Department of Science and Technology) was the chief guest in this program. The chief guest discussed the topic with the children and encouraged them. Stitchery Workshop

A sewing workshop was organized for children from 25th to 27th April, 2023, with the objective to teach children the technique of making 'Flowers and Vases' from cloth and 'Flower Pot' from waste materials. About 20 children participated in this workshop.

On the occasion of Rabindra Jayanti, on May 9th, 2023, programs based on the compositions of Guru Rabindranath Tagore were organized in the Mekhla Jha Auditorium of National Bal Bhavan. The children of the musical instrument section played the song 'Ekla Chalo'. The song 'Pagli Hawa' was sung by the children of the vocal section. Children of Bharatnatyam section presented a dance performance based on the song 'Mere Chit Mein' and children of Drama Art section presented a drama based on the story 'Chhutti'.



Computer Awareness Program

'Computer Awareness' program was organized by the Computer Section from 18th to 19th May, 2023 in which the following activities were organized for the children:-

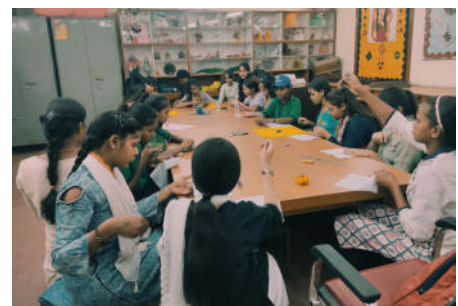
1. Cyber Security through Computer Multimedia, Audio-Visual

On this occasion, a short film 'Internet Ka Bawaal' was also shown to the children. About 50 children participated in this program.

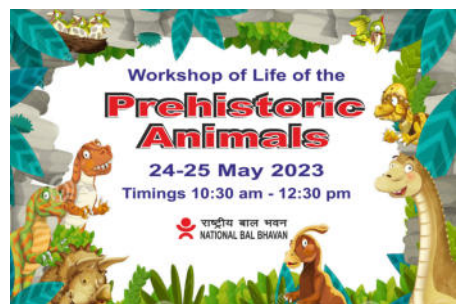
Workshop on 'Basic Stitches and Turpai'

A three-day workshop on 'Basic Stitches and Turpai' was organized from May 23 to 25, 2023. In it children were taught basic stitches and Turpai. Children eagerly participated in this workshop.



Workshop on 'Prehistoric Life of Animals'

A two-day workshop on 'Prehistoric Life of Animals' was organized by the Environment Section from 24th to 25th May, 2023, wherein animal expert Dr. Shahkul Khan was the special guest. The aim of the workshop was to provide children with information about the prehistoric life of animals. Children were given information about the habitats and eating habits of animals. An animal painting activity and quiz was organized for the children. About 26 children participated in this workshop.





Workshop on 'Electronic Gadgets and Household Wiring'

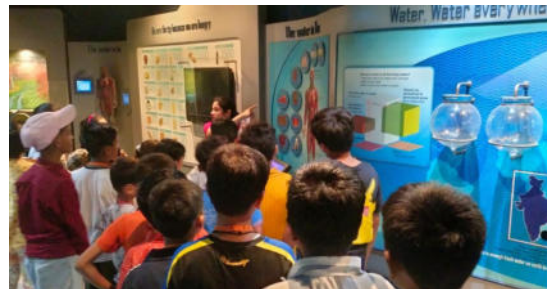
A three-day workshop on 'Electronic Gadgets and Household Wiring' was organized from May 25th to 27th, 2023. The objective of this workshop was to create innovative ways of household wiring and better understanding of the wiring system. About 30 children participated in this workshop. Children learned to take necessary precautions and about possible electrical hazards and handling of electrical equipments and were explained about various components and their functions, identification of equipments used during the workshop period. The participants understood the basic information about electricity and also learned about series connection, parallel connection, ladder-case wiring and extension boards.

Workshop on 'Rang-Birange Dhago Ki Duniya'

A six-day workshop on 'Rang-Birange Dhago Ki Duniya' was organized by the Sewing Section from 26th May, 2023 to 2nd June, 2023. Children learnt various types of embroidery stitches using colorful threads like - Asymmetrical Kachha, Parallel Kachha, Back Stitch, Dandi Stitch, Chain Stitch, Double Chain Stitch, Lazy-Daisy Stitch, Thread Marka Stitch, Fishbean Stitch, Herring etc. Information about Bone, Arrowhead Stitch, Blackie Stitch, Designer Blackie Stitch, Cross Stitch, Feather Stitch, Fancy Border, Nest Stitch, Brick Stitch, Bulleen Stitch, Button Hole Stitch etc. was given to the children. Children participated in this workshop with full interest. Certificates were awarded to all the children.

A Workshop on 'Jal Ek Anmol Ratna'

On the occasion of World Environment Day, 'Jal Ek Anmol Ratna' workshop was organized by Museum Section. The aim of the workshop was to sensitize children about water as a precious resource and its natural surroundings. During the workshop, discussions on various topics were held through powerpoint presentation like watercycle, food cycle, photosynthesis, necessity of water, quantity of fresh water available on earth, water in our bodies, adequate amount of water needed in our bodies, different oceans and water bodies, uses of water, kinds of animals living in water, their dependence on water etc. Children were also informed about measures which can be taken to save water and ways to make our earth clean and green through fulfilled activities. Participating children were taken on education tour to National Science Museum, where they learned how to conserve rain water.



Summer Fiesta

The Summer Fiesta was organized with full zeal and enthusiasm from 23rd May to 21st June 2023 in the premises of National Bal Bhavan. Special assemblies was organized for children in





the open air theatre every Saturday. During the session, children learnt many new and creative activities. Padmabhushan Pandit Sajan Mishra was the chief guest at the inauguration ceremony of the summer session on 21 May 2023. Mr. Vipin Kumar, Chairman, National Bal Bhavan, Mrs. Mukta Agarwal, Director, Mr. Mukesh Gupta, Deputy Director (Administration) and other dignitaries were also present. An exhibition showcasing glimpses of National Bal Bhavan's activities was displayed by museum section. Under the cultural program, presentation of musical instruments, Raag Miyan Malhar (song), Rajasthani folk dance (Chari), Punjabi folk song and Vande Mataram (Bharatnatyam) were performed. The program concluded with the National Anthem. About 3000 children participated in this program. During the summer festival, various innovative activities like storytelling, calligraphy workshop etc. were organized for the children.

To arouse their interests, tie and dye art, paper mache, pottery, Madhubani art, bamboo art etc. were taught.

Children also participated in the activities like - Science Activities, Crafts and Arts, Painting, Handicraft, Weaving, Sewing-Embroidery, Wood Art, Clay Work, Bookbinding, Tie and Dye, Physical and Natural Sciences (Why and How Club), Inventors Club, Radio and Electronics Club, Aero-Modelling, Computer, Environment, Astronomy, Aquarium, Biology and Science Park related activities etc.

During the summer session, arrangements were also made for refreshments for the children everyday.

Special Activity

A 'Little Ones' activity was organized for children in the age group of 5 to 8 years. The objective of this activity was to develop young children's skills regarding persistence, observation and concentration. Learning these activities develops creativity and imagination and builds self-confidence in them. Under this activity, children were told various stories based on moral values and were taught how to inculcate them in their character. These stories were told in both Hindi and English languages. Hand-printing and painting activities were also organized for small





children. On the occasion of International Yoga Day, yoga meditation session was held and yoga postures were taught.

Children were taught to sketch and paint various monuments of Delhi like Jantar Mantar, Red Fort, Lotus Temple, India Gate etc. An animated short film 'The Croods - A New Age' was shown to the little ones on 26th May in Mekhla Jha Auditorium of NBB and 'Spirit Untamed' was shown on 2nd June.

Under the puppet activity, children were taught to make finger puppets of various animals. On the occasion of Ocean Day on 9th June, an animated film 'The Sea Beast' was shown. Landscape art activity was also conducted for the children. 'Drip technique' was taught for making table mats and greeting cards. In the mask making activity, children learnt to make wild animals faces like giraffe, elephant, monkey, rabbit, hippopotamus etc. Paper craft activity was conducted to make birds and octopus. Card making activities and painting of birds and animals using thread art technique were taught. Making of different types of automobiles like car, scooter, helicopter, airplane, bus, truck, submarine etc. through collage art were also taught to the children.

Some special activities like fables and colours, thumb painting, paper elevation painting etc. were also taught.

Summer Fiesta - Special Children's Assembly

On the first Saturday of Summer Fiesta, 27th May 2023 a Special Children's Assembly was organized in the Open Air Theater of NBB, in which group singing and tabla playing was presented by the member children. An interesting demonstration of making charming cartoons was also given by cartoon and painting illustration expert Shri Uday Shankar ji. Along with this, interesting stories were narrated to them by story expert Mrs. Usha Chhabra. The children enjoyed it very much. About 2500 children participated in this Bal Sabha.



Children's visit to Mausam Bhawan

On 2nd June 2023, a study trip to Mausam Bhawan was organized for the member children by the Computer Section with the aim to increase the knowledge of children towards technologies and to make them aware of the computer generations that have developed till now. In this informative tour, children saw the use of various types of equipments like Mini Supercomputer, Satellite, Radar, Thermography, Metallic strip of RPC etc. Children learnt how these devices work, what are humidity and temperature maps, how weather forecasting works, how many types of satellites are there and how each satellite can get four pictures every hour etc. Children were informed about measuring wind speed and how radar works. About 35 children and three escorts participated in this program.

Summer Fiesta - Special Children's Assembly

June 3, 2023 was celebrated as World Environment Day in the premises of National Bal Bhavan. In this assembly, member children of the Environment Section gave speeches on World Environment Day. Member children of the performing arts section, performed a melodious





song and a play related to the environment. A special team of Manipuri dance performed mesmerizing Manipuri dance. About 2500 children participated in this program.

On this occasion various activities were organized for the children by the Environment Section of NBB, through which children were encouraged to replace plastic bags with newspaper bags. Along with this, children were also made aware about the measures to conserve the earth's resources and the effects of changes in the environment through poster making and slogan writing activities. Through these activities, children learnt how to maintain balance in the environment. On this occasion, the participants toured the premises of National Bal Bhavan and planted trees.



Summer Fiesta - Special Children's Assembly

On 10th June 2023, third Special Assembly of Summer Fiesta started with a group song. After that children of the performing arts section presented Rajasthani folk dance and Bharatanatyam. Thereafter, a special band presented patriotic songs in the musical form of a concert. All the children in the audience sang these songs with full enthusiasm and enjoyed a lot.



Fabric Bookmark Making Workshop

A workshop on making 'Cloth Bookmarks' was organized from 6th to 9th June. In the workshop, children learned to make bookmarks of different designs using felt and ice cream sticks. About 40 children participated in this workshop.



Workshop on "Hamare Sangrahalaya Hamari Virasat"

Museum section organized a five-day workshop on "Hamare Sangrahalaya Hamari Virasat" from 6th to 10th June 2023. The focus was on celebrating International Museum Day.

The aim of the workshop was to sensitize children about importance of museum, sustainability and heritage. During the workshop children were given an exposure to different types of museums like Transport Museum, Art and Culture Museum, International Museum etc. Through games and quizzes, participating children learnt about importance of museums in preserving our cultural heritage and transferring the same to our proud future generations. These were followed by educational visits to National Rail Museum, National Handicraft and Handloom Museum, International Dolls Museum. About 30 children participated in this workshop.



Workshop on Pot Painting

A workshop on 'Pot Painting' was organized from 7 to 9 June 2023 in which about 18 children participated.

Workshop on Oil pastel painting

An oil pastel painting workshop was organized from 7th to 9th June 2023 in which about 15 children participated.

Workshop on Radio and Electronics

A workshop on Radio and Electronics was organized from 8th to 10th June 2023 in which about 108 children participated. In this workshop children were informed about necessary precautions and were taught steps for household wiring projects like:- learning safety precautions, identifying power transmission and distribution components, devices and common symbols, connecting a lamp to a switch, series connection, parallel connections, ladder case wiring, extension boards, etc. Different types of electricity and computers were explained with block diagrams. Digital principles and applications, knowledge of the internal workings of a computer system based on computer system architecture were explained. Computer and its various components such as CPU, various memories such as RAM and ROM, basic input and output system, motherboard, hard disk drives were also explained. Children were also taught installation of the power supply, microprocessor and connecting data cables and other connectors on the DVD ROM drive.



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Workshop on Environment and Aquarium

A two-day workshop was organized by the Environment Section from 13th to 14th June, 2023. This workshop was based on small live animals, birds and fishes. The objective of the workshop was to provide information about the lifestyle of small animals, insects and fish. Mr. Rajeev Kumar (expert in fishes) was invited as an expert. He provided detailed information on sounds of different animals and how fishes live longer in aquariums. Presentations on live animals, birds and fish were given in the workshop. A quiz was organized for the children and were taught to draw sketches. About 35 children participated in this workshop.



Workshop on Dry Pastel Painting

A workshop on Dry Pastel Painting was organized by the Painting Section from 13th to 16th June, 2023. In the workshop, children sketched different types of concepts on drawing paper. About 18 children participated in the workshop.



Cyber Security Carnival

Cyber Safety Carnival program for children was organized on 16th June, 2023 in the Computer Section of National Bal Bhavan to develop the knowledge of children about safe use of Internet. Cyber Security Carnival organized by 'Cyber Shanti', provided knowledge of cyber security to the children. On this occasion, an important rally was also taken out on Cyber Security with slogans and placards. After that the children rode in the cyber safety train of Bal Bhavan. Two plays on Cyber Security were presented by the students of Cyber Security Club. The children of National Bal Bhavan were distributed prizes by Cyber Shanti and were motivated to participate in various activities of National Bal Bhavan. A short film on 'Internet Ka Bawal' was screened. About 250 children participated in this program.



Summer Fiesta - Special Children's Assembly

During the special assembly on 17th June 2023, Ms. Shubhangi Goyal presented a Kathak Dance performance. Children of the performing arts section presented patriotic song tunes on Harmonium, percussion instrument, Kathak and Odissi dance Kachahari. During the assembly, a magic show and a puppet show were organized. About 2500 children participated and enjoyed the entire program thoroughly.



G-20 Event in Pune

National Bal Bhavan participated in an exhibition on the theme of 'Ensuring Foundation Literacy and Numeracy' especially in the context of Blended learning at G20 event in Pune. During the exhibition at Pune, focussing on National Education Policy Ms Smriti, Artist Museum, Ms. Preeti, Instructor Handicraft & Mr. Sultan, Modeller got the opportunity to display the artefacts of various activities conducted at National Bal Bhavan. Various Indian States and Union Territories displayed their artefacts during the same.



The stall of NBB not only displayed the artefacts of children but also guided visitors and children as to how these artefacts can be used as teaching aids in various subjects like Mathematics, Science, History, Botany, Civics, Geography, English etc. from elementary to college level. Live demonstration of activities was also conducted by



NBB staff. Everyone was mesmerised by the kinds of artefacts prepared by NBB and how they are useful in learning various curriculum based subjects. Around 700 children (100-120 children per day) participated in the activities.

Educational visit to Mango Orchards

On June 19th, 2023, an educational tour of the mango orchard was organized by Mother Dairy to give information about different varieties of mango to the children in Baghpat village of Uttar Pradesh. About 40 member children of National Bal Bhavan participated. The farmer greeted all the children and provided information about different mango species like : Dussehri, Chausa, Langra, Gulab Khaus etc. The children also asked many questions to the farmer. Farmer informed how to select the ripest and sweetest mangoes with the help of tactile and visual inspection. The children were inspired to further establish their bond with nature by learning how to grow a mango tree in their home garden.

At the end, the children shared their feedback about their experience and also how the trip helped them gain immense knowledge about how mangoes are grown in an orchard. Along with mango, they were also informed about various nutritional benefits of jackfruit. Children were also informed how to identify and differentiate between different types of mangoes based on their physical characteristics, color and smell. Children learned that the mangoes provided by 'Safal' are free of chemicals and safe to use.

Summer Fiesta's Closing Ceremony and 9th International Yoga Day

On June 21st, 2023, the closing ceremony of the Summer Festival and the 8th International Yoga Day program was organized in Open Air Theatre of National Bal Bhavan. The program started with a vocal performance. They urged every person to plant trees to help the environment recover from destructive human activities. On this occasion, children presented verses related to yoga. Children of Bharatanatyam section presented various yoga asanas on musical rhythm along with dance. After that, the instructor of Physical Education section made them perform yoga asanas like:- Namaskar Chakrasana, Sarvangasana etc. which the children performed along with skating. About 3000 children participated in this program enthusiastically.



Hindi Workshop

Hindi workshop was organized through virtual conferencing on June 29, 2023 at NBB. The topic of the workshop was - "Standard terminology of administrative work". The data in the terminology of the Parliamentary Official Language Committee was taken into consideration. The objective of this workshop was to use the official language Hindi as much as possible in office work. Quarterly meetings of the Official Language Implementation Committee were organized through Google Meet. The meeting was presided over by the Head of Office. About 20 employees participated in this meeting.



Workshop on World Oceans Day

An eight-day World Oceans Day workshop was organized at the Museum Section of National Bal Bhavan from 1st to 8th July, 2023. The objective of this workshop was to create awareness among the children about the importance of our oceans and the role of children in preserving them. The children were informed through games about the role they can play in maintaining a healthy planet. The children learned about various mythological stories in the Indian context and depicted them through artwork. Stories related to sea or water sources from Panchatantra were also narrated. A power point presentation was shown to the children to make them understand the sea and why we celebrate World Oceans Day and a group discussion was held with them on the importance of reforestation. Children were told stories like: Samudra Manthan, Matsya Avtaar, Kurma Avtaar, Varaha Avtaar, Goddess Saraswati deposited Vadavagni in the sea, Hanuman crossed the sea by flying, Shri Ram requested the sea for permission to build Ram Setu. Next day children went on a visit to National museum. On the third day, children were exposed to traditional folk art and art forms like Madhubani, Pattachitra, Kangra art, Gond art, Mughal art from different regions of India like Bihar, West Bengal, Himachal Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan etc. through Lecture-cum-demonstration. Children made traditional paintings of their choice like Madhubani, Pattachitra and Kangra etc. Stories from Panchatantra:- Khara Sagar, Bagula and Kekada were narrated and their moral values were conveyed. Children were told not to believe anything they hear without assessing. The children were given the message from the stories of Panchatantra that one who does not accept change gets destroyed. They were taught to draw sea creatures like whale, seal, squid etc. A Power Point presentation was shown on how museums play an important role in protecting our natural heritage globally. In the workshop, children learned bookmark making activity. Paintings, papier-mâché objects and bookmarks etc. made by children were displayed. A quiz on various oceans, sea animals, locations of poles etc. was conducted for children. About 17 children participated in this workshop. In the end, participation certificates were given to all the children.



Clay Art Workshop

A three-day clay modeling workshop was organized in the clay art section of National Bal Bhavan from 6th to 8th July, 2023. During this workshop, children were taught to make figures of different types of animals. Approximately 15 children participated in the workshop every day. In the end, participation certificates were given to all the children.





Weaving Workshop

A three-day weaving workshop was organized in the weaving section of National Bal Bhavan from 6th to 8th July, 2023. During this workshop, children were taught to make different types of mats, small carpets, bracelets etc. Approximately 15 children participated in the workshop every day. In the end, participation certificates were given to all the children.



Integrated Activity Workshops

- (i) A three-day paper mask workshop was organized in the Integrated Activities section of National Bal Bhavan from 13th to 15th July, 2023. During this workshop, children were taught to make paper masks and other types of masks. Approximately 20 children participated in the workshop each day. In the end, participation certificates were given to all the children.
- (ii) A three-day workshop on making Traditional Wooden Toys was organized in the Integrated Activities section of National Bal Bhavan from 20th to 22nd July, 2023. During this workshop, children were taught to make various types of traditional wooden toys and turtles. Approximately 20 children participated in the workshop each day. In the end, participation certificates were given to all the children.

Workshop on Embroidery on Plastic Canvas

An embroidery workshop on plastic canvas was organized in National Bal Bhavan from 11 to 13 July, 2023. This workshop gave the children information about plastic canvas and taught them to do embroidery on it. About 25 children participated in this workshop.



Wool Craft Workshop

Wool craft workshop was organized in National Bal Bhavan from 14th to 25th July, 2023. This workshop taught the children to make pom-pom puffs, birds, embroidery and hangings from wool. About 20 children participated in this workshop.

Key Chain Making Workshop

Key Chain making workshop was organized in National Bal Bhavan from 26 to 28 July, 2023. This workshop taught children how to do embroidery on plastic canvas. Also they were taught how to make key rings. About 20 children participated in this workshop.



Workshop on Solar System

A workshop on Solar System was organized in National Bal Bhavan from 26 to 28 July, 2023. Children were given information about all the planets of solar system. A quiz on the solar system was also organised. Children learned to make bookmarks related to the solar system. About 7 children participated in this workshop. In the end, certificates were given to all the children.



G-20 Closing Ceremony

In the closing ceremony of the prestigious G-20 program organized by the Ministry of Women and Child Development at the famous Mahatma Temple in Gandhinagar, Gujarat state, the children of the Bharatnatyam and Vocal Music section of the National Bal Bhavan presented their cultural program on August 3, 2023. Topic of the presentation was 'Women Empowerment'. Children demonstrated empowerment through dance which inspired people to remain united, so that our country can be taken to new heights. At the end of the program the participants of National Bal Bhavan expressed their gratitude and visited the Sabarmati Ashram with great enthusiasm, followed by a visit to Ahmedabad's vibrant riverfront and the iconic Atal Bridge. The participants visited Amul Mother Dairy to learn about the complex process of converting milk into various dairy products. Thereafter, the participants visited Kankaria Lake, Ahmedabad (Gujarat). Finally, they also enjoyed a train ride around the lake. 27 children along with 4 officers and 11 escorts participated in this programme.

On the occasion of Amrit Mahotsav of Freedom, 'Angdan Mahotsav' program was organized on August 3, 2023. The objective of the program was to inspire and promote healthy lifestyle and well-being in which, the following programs were organized:-

1. '**Angdaan**' - Pledge Ceremony for Angdaan was organized in the Open Air Theatre of National Bal Bhavan. In which about 77 employees participated.

2. **Painting Activity** - Slogan writing and poster making activity was organized for the member children of National Bal Bhavan. In which, children drew different body parts on paper and got information about them. 18 children participated in this activity.

3. **Handicraft Activity** - An activity of making useful things from waste materials was organized for the member children of National Bal Bhavan in which, children learned to make human body parts from waste materials through craft activity. Through this program children were inspired to donate organs. 30 children participated in this activity.





4. Drama Activity - A street play activity was organized on 'Angdaan' for the member children of NBB. The purpose of this dramatic activity was that after death a person should donate his organs so that a needy person can get a new life. This is an example of true human service. All the people should also help in spreading this message for all. 20 children participated in this occasion.



5. Environment Activity - Awareness activity was organized for the member children of NBB to donate their body organs. In this program, information was given about the importance of organ donation and how one donor can save many lives. The children learned that organ donation is a noble act, one that can be done to save lives even after the donor dies. To help children understand, a chart depicting body parts was also prepared which showed various organs as well as organs which are eligible for donation by humans. 7 children participated in this occasion.

'Meri Maati Mera Desh' campaign program under the Amrit Mahotsav of Independence

To commemorate the completion of 75 years of India's independence, the 'Meri Maati Mera Desh Abhiyan' program was organized from 9 to 30 August 2023 on the occasion of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav. The objective of the program was to pay tribute to the heroes who made supreme sacrifice for the country under which the following programs were organized:-

1. 'Panch Pran Pratigya Abhiyan' - program was organized in the Open Air Theatre of National Bal Bhavan. In this campaign, all the participants took Panch Pran pledges holding the soil of their country in their hands. After that, Mr. Mukesh Gupta-Deputy Director (Administration) and Mr. Chander Mani-Incharge of Program and other employees as well as children participated in Vasudha Vandan - planting in which about 50 employees and 25 children participated.



2. Painting Activity - National Bal Bhavan organized a poster making activity under the 'Meri Maati Mera Desh' campaign on August 12, 2023, on the occasion of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav.

3. Handicraft Activity - Poster making activities on 'Meri Maati Mera Desh' were organized for the member children of NBB. Herein, children got the information about the environment and learned to make trees and plants by using paper.

4. Drama Activity - Member children of NBB presented a Martyrdom drama on 'Veeron ka Vandan' on August 12, 2023, on the occasion of Amrit Mahotsav of Freedom. The purpose of



this dramatic activity was to display patriotism. The story of 'Shaheed' Natak depicted the sacrifice of Bhagat Singh, Sukhdev, Rajguru and thousands of Indians. Around 300 children participated in the activity.

5. Environment Activity - Scrapbook making activity for member children of National Bal Bhavan was organized on 16th August, 2023. The book featured photographs of the National Flag (Tricolor) and National Emblem, India's first Independence Day celebrations on August 15, 1947, along with special tributes to the heroes who made the supreme sacrifice for our country. Women freedom fighters were also included in the book who fought for freedom, justice and equality. Photographs of August, 1947 were also shown to the children. In the end, for the theme 'Honoring the Women freedom fighters', children were made aware about the courageous women, who fought for India to achieve independence. Fighting against all odds was their main motive.

6. Sewing Activity - A tri-color memorial activity was organized on 16th August, 2023 through sewing for the member children of NBB. They were taught how to make Tricolor hangings, birds and key chains.

7. Vocal Music Activity - Vocal Music activity for member children was organised in NBB premises. They were taught to salute & honor the heroes and sing the National Anthem correctly at every venue.

Workshop on Sewing-Embroidery ‘Sada Shamiz’

A three-day ‘Sada Shamiz’ workshop was organized in the sewing-embroidery section of National Bal Bhavan from 9 to 11 August, 2023. In this workshop, children were given the knowledge of body measurements for plain shamiz, drawing & making paper patterns, cutting and sewing of clothes by drafting them with the help of paper patterns.

Sundial Workshop by Astronomy Section

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A three-day educational tour workshop by Museum Section

A three-day educational tour activity workshop was organized from 17 to 19 August, 2023, for member children by Museum. In which the Junior Artist (Museum) took the children on a tour of three museums i.e. National War Memorial Museum, National Gandhi Museum, National Handicrafts and Handloom Museum. National Unity Day

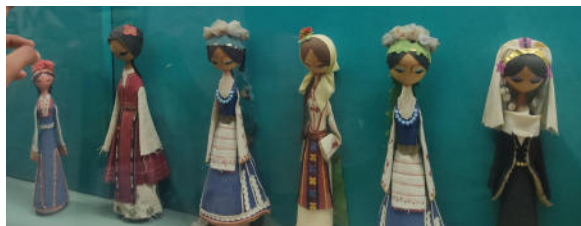

Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi

INTRODUCTION

Jawahar Bal Bhavan is a rural unit of National Bal Bhavan. In the mid-sixties, a scheme for the establishment of Jawahar Bal Bhavans was initiated. The Jawahar Bal Bhavan at Mandi was an extension of this scheme. This rural unit was first set up in 1972 and started functioning from the chaupal of Mandi village. The villagers of Mandi donated 4.75 acres of panchayat land to construct it and it was christened 'Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi'. Later Smt. Indira Gandhi inaugurated the center at its present location in the year 1973. The main objective of it was to cater to the rural children of the Mandi, Mehrauli, Jaunpur, Gadaipur, Sultanpur, Manglapuri, Gwalpahari, Bandhwari, Asola, Aya Nagar, Ghitorni, Chattarpur, Maidan Garhi, rajpur, Satbari, Chandanhola, Fatehpur Beri, Dera, Bhatti Mines and Neb Sarai villages in and around Mandi. This is an institution which aims at enhancing the creative potential of children by engaging them in various activities and providing them the opportunities and common platform to interact, experiment, create and perform according to their age, aptitude and ability. It offers a barrier-free environment with immense possibilities. Presently the on-going activities are Physical Education, Art & Craft, Dance, Music, Computer, Home Management, Photography and Publication.



Poster Making Workshop

About 50 children participated in this workshop organized by Publication Section. In the workshop, children learnt "How to make a poster" on any subject of their interest. Children learnt and made posters related to propagating the message of not using plastic and resolved to reduce the use of plastic and clean the environment. Some children also made digital posters on "Water is life", "Say No to Single Use Plastic" etc.

World Environment Day

Environment Day 2023 with the theme "Beat Plastic Pollution" was observed at Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi. A pledge was taken as part of "Mission Life" followed by Mass Rally by children and staff within the campus. Children were wearing masks, holding placards and voicing slogans for environment protection. DISTRICT CHILD WELFARE COUNCIL, BAL BHAVAN, HISAR

Bal Bhavan Nursery School : A nursery school runs in Bal Bhavan for children between two and a half years to six years of age. This year 103 children were admitted in this school.

Bal Pustakalaya : In the Bal Pustakalaya the total number of beneficiaries is 2590 and the number of members is 789.

Short Term Courses : During summer vacations, short term courses like dance, painting, computer, Karate etc. were organized in Bal Bhavan for girls, women and small children. This year 350 children participated in the summer camp every day.

Fish Aquarium : A fish aquarium has been established in Bal Bhavan, Hisar. Around 6000 children visited the aquarium this year.

Computer Training Centre : A computer training centre is being run by Bal Bhavan, Hisar. Various certificate courses are conducted at the centre. In the year 2023-24, 130 children received training.

Fashion Designing : This institute conducts three months, six months and one year courses in fashion designing for girls and women. This year a total number of 22 girls and women received daily training in fashion designing. Out of these, some girls and women are being given free training under the 'Chief Minister Family Upliftment Scheme'. The examinations of this course are conducted by Women Industrial Training Institute, Hisar.

Beautician Centre : This institution conducts advanced course in Beauty Care for girls and women. This year, a total of 15 girls and women received training every day.

Evening coaching classes : Evening classes for children from nursery to sixth class are held at the centre. A total of 18 children attend the centre for tuition every day.

Dance class : A dance training centre is being run in Bal Bhavan for boys and girls. This year, 25 boys and girls are taking benefit of dance class every day.

Baby Supple Pool : There is a baby supple pool in the campus of Bal Bhavan for the entertainment of children during summer vacations. 625 children were benefited.

Children's Day : Courtesy of 'Haryana State Child Welfare, Chandigarh', the competition of Children's Day-2023 was organized in the District Child Welfare Councils, working for the all-round development of children in all the districts of the state. In Hisar district, the competition was organized at the district board and state level. About 1703 children participated in all these competitions.

Day-Care Center Bal Bhavan, Hisar : A day-care center is being run in Bal Bhavan, Hisar. A total of 31 children are enrolled in it.

Mukhyamantri Parivar Utthan Antyodaya Yojana : Under the 'Mukhyamantri Parivar Utthan Antyodaya Yojana', stalls were set up by the office in the fairs organized with the cooperation of the district administration in district Hisar and sub-tehsils (Barwala, Uklana, Agroha, Adampur, Narnod and Hansi) and the activities going on in the Child Welfare Council are publicised.

The similar Activities are also being run at our Mini Bal Bhavan, Hansi at Sub-Division Level.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Accounts

- a. The Financial Statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention and generally on the accrual method of accounting unless otherwise stated.
- b. Separate set of accounts are maintained by the National Bal Bhavan in respect of Main A/c, GPF & NPS.
- c. All Receipts on account of fees/subscription and refund of unspent grants are accounted on receipts basis.

2. Grants-in-Aid

Grants are recognized on receipt basis & taken to credit of Income & Expenditure account except to the extent of expenditure of capital nature incurred (which amount is credited directly to the capital fund).

3. Fixed assets and Depreciations

- a. Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition less depreciation. Fixed assets received as Gifts by the National Bal Bhavan has been merged with the Fixed Assets of the Society. Books received as Gifts are valued at selling price.
- b. Receipts, if any, on the sale of obsolete/unserviceable assets is taken as income under the head 'Misc Receipts'.

4. Depreciation

- 4.1 During this year depreciation has been charged on Straight line method at the prescribed rate as provided in new format for standardization of accounts issued by MHRD.
- 4.2 In respect of additions to fixed assets during the year, depreciation is provided for full year and in respect of deductions from the fixed assets, no depreciation is charged.

5. Specific Expenses / Payments

a. Printing & Stationery

The amount spent for printing & stationery, is treated as expenditure as and when incurred. No adjustments are made in accounts for the closing stocks, as the value is not determinable.

b. Telephone Deposit

Deposit for telephone and allied facilities is written off during the year of installation/commissioning and charges/ expenditure bills are accounted for at the net value.



6. Interest on All Deposits / Investments is accounted for on accrual basis.

7. Employees Salaries / Benefits

- a. Central Government Employees service rules are by and large, made applicable to the employees of the National Bal Bhavan.
- b. Retirement benefits are accounted for on the basis of Actuarial Valuation done by approved valuer as per Accounting Standard 15.
- c. The NBB maintains a separate Notified Provident Fund account for its employees.



NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

1. Grant received from Government, based on budget approved by the Parliament, constitute main source of receipts of the NBB. Though the grants received (after the adjustment of expenditure of capital nature) are taken to income and expenditure account, the effective income of the NBB is nil in the light of restrictions that without sanction of Government, the unspent balance of Grants cannot be carried over from one financial year to another. Thus, this does not attract any Income tax liability.
2. Expenditure on Establishment, Printing and Stationery and Telephone deposits have been given the accounting treatment as per accounting policy.
3. An amount of Rs 18.29 lakhs has been shown as Assistance to State in Schedule-8 (Loans, Advances & Deposits) which were outstanding as on 31.03.2024 due to Non receipt of Utilization Certificates from the State Bal Bhavans.
4. An advance of Rs 102.91 lakhs has been paid to CPWD as per Schedule-8 (Loans, Advances & Deposits) upto 31.03.2024 (previous year Rs 311.55 lakhs).
5. During the current year, Prior period Income of Rs NIL & Prior Period expenses of Rs 24.39 Lakhs have been booked.
6. NBB has received funds from MSJE in previous years for special project. Unspent balance amounting to Rs 53.54 Lakhs (Previous Year is Rs 51.76 Lakhs) along with interest up to 31.03.2024 is lying with NBB's Canara Bank Account for this Project. Provision has been made in the books for amount payable to MSJE (Including Interest).
7. An amount of Rs 8,759 is shown as balance lying with Jammu & Kashmir Bank since long. As informed to us, the Bank Branch was in Kashmir & now it is not traceable. It is suggested to write off the same.
8. Sundry Debtors of Rs 3,71,575/- (Schedule-7) remained unrealized and since the balances are outstanding for more than 5 years, it is suggested to write off the balance, in case the same are not recoverable.
9. Provision has been made for Interest payable to MHRD for FY 2023-24.
10. It has been observed that in case of Air Force activity (internal Receipts) organized by NBB during the Previous Year, there were some expenses of Rs 57,340 which were not claimed by authorized person in the Final Bill sent to Air Force. These expenses were incurred by the Program section directly and not informed to the Hostel section. To avoid any loss of revenue all the expenses should be consolidated at one place and the person responsible for carrying out the activity should be informed beforehand.
11. As per the CAG Audit report dated 24.08.23, an observation is given by them regarding an Investment done of Rs 2.13 Lakhs in Government Securities pertaining to the period 1980-83 and Rs 16,759/- in GPO, New Delhi of GPF accounts. This could be verified by the CAG Auditors as the related records were not made available for Audit. NBB stated that the records are not traceable. Auditors suggested to write off this amount, however, no action has been taken by the Management since 2011-12.



12. TDS of Rs.4,78,268/- outstanding in GPF has been w/off during the previous year. This TDS belong to FY 2014-15(Rs.3,96,708), FY 2015-16(Re.1) and FY 2016-17(Rs.81,559). Since no Income Tax case is pending for these years and no amount is recoverable, the same has been w/off in books also.
13. Advances made and shown as recoverable are adjusted to final head of account/recovered on receipt of final bill/receipt from the concerned party/department.
14. In the opinion of the Management of NBB, Current Assets Loans and Advances shall have a value on realization in ordinary course of business, at least equal to the amount at which they are stated in the Balance Sheet. Provision has been made for all known liabilities.
15. Previous year figures have been regrouped wherever considered necessary.
16. Figures in the final accounts have been rounded to the nearest rupee.

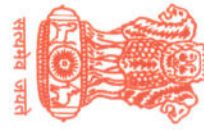

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of National Bal Bhavan New Delhi for the year ended 31 March 2024



We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of National Bal Bhavan (NBB) as at 31 March 2024, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 20(1) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act. The audit has been entrusted for the period up to 2027-28. These financial statements are the responsibility of the NBB Management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
4. Based on our audit, we report that:
 - i) We have obtained all the information and explanations, subject to the observation in the report. Which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
 - ii) The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format prescribed by the Ministry of Education, Government of India vide order No. 29-4/2012-FD dated 17 April 2015.
 - iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the National Bal Bhavan, in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
 - iv) We further report that:
 - A. **Balance Sheet**
 - A.1 **Assets**
 - A.1.1 **Fixed Assets: (Schedule 4) - Rs. 10.07 crore**
 - (i) Land and Building should be depicted in the Balance Sheet/Schedule as two separate heads of account. This has resulted in incorrect charging of depreciation on land with consequent understatement of Fixed Assets and Capital Fund. This has been repeatedly pointed by audit since 2012-13 but rectification has not been done.



Moreover, the assets schedule should also show the area of each parcel of land separately as freehold and leasehold.

B. General

B.1 An investment of Rs. 2.13 lakh was made in Government Securities out of GPF accounts pertaining to the period 1980-83. However, related records were not made available to audit. Similarly the records of Rs. 16,759 lying at GPO New Delhi were not furnished to audit. In the absence of the records, amount of Rs. 2.30 lakh could not be verified in audit. This is being repeatedly pointed out since 2011-12 but remedial action has not been taken by NBB.

B.2 NBB Notes to the Accounts (Schedule 24 – Point 7 and 8) indicates that the following amounts are required to be written off:

- An amount of Rs. 8,759 as balance lying with J&K bank was not traceable.
- Sundry debtors of Rs. 3.71 lakh (Schedule 7) remained unrealized.

However, NBB has not written off the above amount from the accounts. This has resulted in overstatement of Sundry Debtors and understatement of Administrative expenses – Bad debts by Rs. 3.80 lakh. This is being pointed out since 2017-18 but action has not been taken by NBB.

B.3 Loans, Advances and Deposits (Schedule 8) includes Rs. 18.28 lakh as assistance to States. This advance pertains to the period 2012-13 to 2021-22 and is outstanding as on 31.3.2024 due to non receipt of utilization certificates from State Bal Bhavans/ Bal Kendras. Non adjustment of these advances have resulted in overstatement of Loans, Advances & Deposits and understatement of Expenditure. This issue is being pointed out since 2013-14 but UCs for huge amounts are still pending resulting in non-adjustment of advances.

C. Grants-in-aid

National Bal Bhavan received grant-in-aid of Rs. 1904.43 lakh (Grant for creation of Capital Assets: Rs. 90.00 lakh and Recurring Grant: Rs 1814.43 lakh) from Ministry of Education during 2023-24. It had unspent balance of previous year amounting to Rs. 281.03 lakh (Grant for creation of Capital Assets: Rs. 12.50 lakh and Recurring Grant: Rs 268.53 lakh). Out of the total Funds of Rs. 2185.46 lakh, National Bal Bhavan utilized Rs. 2084.34 lakh (Grant for creation of Capital Assets: Rs. 90.00 lakh and Recurring Grant: Rs. 1994.34 lakh) and refunded Rs. 12.57 lakh to Ministry leaving a balance of Rs. 88.55 lakh (Grant for creation of Capital Assets: Rs. Nil and Recurring Grant: Rs 88.55 lakh) as on 31 March 2024.


D. Management Letter

Annexure to the Audit Report

1. Adequacy of Internal Audit System

- The NBB has no internal audit section/Department of its own. It also has no audit manual.

2. Adequacy of Internal Control System.

The internal control of National Bal Bhavan is inadequate due to:

- Non obtaining of utilization certificates from State Bal Bhavans/Bal Kendras in respect of advances given to them.

3. System of physical verification of Fixed Assets.

- Physical verification of Fixed Assets including Books & Publications was conducted upto March 2024.

4. System of physical verification of inventory.

- Physical verification of inventory like stationery and other consumable items was conducted up to March 2024.

5. Regularity in payment of dues.

- As per Accounts, no payment over six months in respect of statutory dues was outstanding as on 31.03.2024.
