Introduction



National Bal Bhavan, is an autonomous body under the Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Education, Govt. of India. This institution is a non-formal education center for children between the age group of 5 to 16 years. It was established in 1956, keeping in mind the dream of unmasking learning through the thinking, imagination, creative and entertaining activities for the children, the foundation was laid by the first Prime Minister of India. Bal Bhavan has taken the form of a

movement with 141 affiliated Bal Bhavans and Bal Kendras across the country. Apart from this, a rural Jawahar Bal Bhavan in Mandi village, Delhi and other 49 Bal kendras are also functioning in Delhi. National Bal Bhavan provides children with different activities and opportunities in accordance with their age, efficiency and strength, to develop children's creativity and skill. This institution provides children a stress free and fear free environment with a great scope of possibilities. National Bal Bhavan and its affiliated institutions run regular programs for children especially for the lower strata of society.

The objective of this organization is to develop the child's creative ability by working on a common platform through various activities, opportunities, deliberations and experiences. Bal Bhavan provides an opportunity to every child and the freedom to fabricate innovative creations by learning through play way method, furthermore it helps to develop their creative potential through activities like dance, drama, music, creative arts, photography, computer etc. National Bal Bhavan, has emerged as a centre where children get their overall personality development at one place through various activities as well as strengthening the spirit of unity.

Every year thousands of children become members of National Bal Bhavan. The institute has started working in 1956 with meager 300 member children but over the years it has increased its membership strength and now lakhs of children are taking advantages of its various facilities. To reach the children of different areas, 49 Bal Kendras were established in many areas of Delhi State. These Bal Kendras fulfill the needs of all the children coming from different strata of society. Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi is a rural unit of National Bal Bhavan, which is working under NBB and provides parallel services to the rural population of surrounding villages. State Bal Bhavans and Bal Kendras have been opened in all parts of the country and remote tribal areas and they are providing similar services everywhere.

Among all activities of NBB, Bal Shree honour is one of the very prestigious scheme to identify and nurture creative children. This scheme was initiated in the year 1995 and further revised in the year 2015. Since its inception it is honouring creative children under four main streams i.e. Creative Arts, Creative Scientific Innovation, Creative Performance and Creative Writing and up to 31st March 2021, total 745 creative children from across the country have been selected for Bal Shree Honour.

Our Mission

To let every child fully participate, contribute and strive towards a creative, humane, innovative and joyful world in all its wonder.

Our Vision

To provide opportunities that ignite curiosity and celebrate possibilities through immersive dynamic experiences in visual arts, scientific activities and physical activities. To foster values that mold self confidence, holistic and responsible citizen of the world.





Objectives

The objectives of National Bal Bhavan are:

To inculcate faith, self-reliance, sovereignty and moral values among children and make our Nation strong and prosperous. Likewise, providing opportunities for developing creativity among them through creative art, creative writing, creative performing arts, physical education, scientific experiments, photography, and housekeeping via informal education system. Workshops, training programmes are conducted to attain this very philosophy and search talent of children and nurturing them for the purpose.

- 1. To provide opportunities to children for education and creativity.
- 2. To provide the children with experiences and activities not otherwise available to them.
- 3. To offer certain educational services to the local schools in order to enrich their curricular and extracurricular activities.
- 4. To provide leadership and guidance to teachers towards fostering a creative approach in teaching of art and science.
- 5. To provide training facilities for recreational workers, and Children's Museum personnel.
- 6. To offer the Nation a prototype comprehensive children's institution, i.e. to establish an Ideal Bal Bhavan.
- 7. To develop personality and talents of children through recreation and physical activities.
- 8. To promote social and cultural contacts amongst the children of all classes and communities.
- 9. To inculcate such values as would help to develop modern Indian personality with a scientific temper.
- 10. To promote the above mentioned activities as a movement.

Activities at a Glance

CREATIVE ART

Creative Art activities are aimed to provide an opportunity to children for their self expression and development of aesthetic sensitivity of children and also to encourage the talent hidden in their personality. These are various activities in creative art, which have been divided under sub-heads which are as follows:-

Integrated Activities

Integrated Activities Section attracts children of all age groups. Children especially of small age group generally take interest in Traditional Arts. Being a multimedia section, children can easily shift from one medium to other media. Creative and value-based games are also developed in this section. Traditional Folk Art created with sticks (instead of brush) and use of natural colours



is an added attraction of this section. Children also learn to make toys with papier machie and do paper craft in this section. This section creates awareness about Mehndi art, Warli, Madhubani etc.

Painting



Children in this section express their creativity by drawing and painting with crayons, Water colours, Oil colours, pencil and Charcoal. This activity is equally popular with senior children as well as younger ones. Younger children make drawings as per their imagination whereas senior ones enjoy drawing portraits, sketches, natural scenery and do theme based drawings. Children are also taught Batik, Tie and Dye, Block printing techniques.

Handicraft

Activities in this section are special as children make objects with waste materials such as old newspapers, old magazines, card board boxes, used boxes, bulbs, buttons, embossed papers, thermocol, clippings, seeds, wire, leaves, scrap of trees etc. Children are free to make objects with the help of these items. Creation of beautiful art work & products with waste materials depict the imagination and creativity of children.



Weaving

Weaving activity is an activity where children learn making various artistic items such as wall hangings, Lamp shades, Tapestry, scenery etc. through techniques of weaving. They are motivated to create beautiful objects. They learn different types of knots and weaving patterns and make mats, sceneries and small carpets of their own.



Needle Craft



Toy making, puppet making, macrame, crochet work etc are attractions of stitching & embroidery section. Children learn basics of cutting and stitching of clothes and also different type of designing, patch work and creative embroidery. Toy making with cotton fill is also a popular activity of this section. Children learn making wall hangings, different types of stitches which help in developing creativity among children.

Clay Work

Activities in this section are helpful in establishing co-ordination between mind, heart and hands in children. Here children learn making animals, human faces and shapes, sceneries and designs with the help of mould by using paper mache, plaster of Paris and clay. This section provides an opportunity to involve children by using new innovative and creative ideas while giving shape to clay. Potter's Wheel is also used at times for children to learn pottery.



Book Binding



Activities in binding section are also very popular, as children learn how to keep their books safe, and beautiful. In addition they learn technique of binding and making beautiful objects with cardboard, which includes cutting card board, painting, joining etc. Children are also taught how to prepare other items such as candle stand, pen stand, small diary, file covers and many other items.

Woodcraft

Children are acquainted with different techniques used while making various wooden objects.

Children also learn how to examine the durability of a particular wood for making various items from wood. Children are also acquainted with making mural through wood cutting on wooden frames and creating drawings with saw-dust is also taught. Children also learn making pen stand, pen holder, small box, toys, pot cover etc. They are also taught to carve wood and making beautiful object from it. They also learn art of making beautiful things from wood dust.



SCIENCE ACTIVITIES

Aim of Science Education is to develop "Scientific" attitude among the children. Science Section is not merely a subject of class laboratory but a part of biggest laboratory that is nature through which children enhance their knowledge about day to day happenings and linking them with scientific principles. National Bal Bhavan believes in adopting various interesting activities for making children understand the basic principles of science. An important aspect of science teaching system of National Bal Bhavan is "Integrated approach" in which other activities becomes an integral part of learning. This section is having different Sub-sections which help children to learn Scientific laws and principles. The children are also taught Physics and Natural Science along with use of science in everyday life. Activities in this section include Radio Electronics, Aero-Modelling, Machine Modelling, Astronomy, Computers, Aquarium and Animal Corner, How and Why club and Environment. All activities section use practical approach to generate interest in science and life related issues.

For children taking part in science activities, it is not necessary for them to have science as a subject in their syllabus, what is important here is that they must have curiosity and desire for learning "Why" and "How". Film shows and camps are also organized by this section from time to time.

Science section has following sub sections:

Physical & Natural Sciences (How and Why Club)

Children opt for projects under this section, and satiate their curiosity of "How" and "Why" exponentiation through this club. Making creative scientific models, Educational Tour, Science Quizzes etc are some of the activities which invariably enhance knowledge of children and encourage them to learn something new. The workshops are also conducted. Children are also provided laboratory equipments for experiments and scientific games etc.



Inventors Club

Children are encouraged to conduct experiments and learn innovative techniques in this section. As they learn the concept of Machine Modelling and thereafter Designing it, thereby understanding different aspects connected with their project. Children understand how machines are designed using cardboard as base material.

Radio and Electronics club

Children from 10 to 16 years of age are given membership of Radio & Electronics club. Basic Principles of Electronics, wiring, repair of domestic equipment,

new experiments in circuits, radio, connecting T.V. parts are various activities undertaken by this club. Children are imparted training in Digital projects, new source of energy such as solar energy models etc. More and more children are having membership of "HAM Radio Club". Keeping in view of ever rising means of developed communication, Ham Amateurs club has also been launched in National Bal Bhavan for Radio listeners



to enable member children to establish "HAM Station" at their home and establish contact with their dear ones.

Aero Modelling

An expensive hobby such as Aero Modelling is made accessible and easy by National Bal Bhavan to its member children. Children learn the basic principles of wind power and making models of different aircrafts. In addition, they enjoy flying models made by them. Main aim of this activity is to acquaint children with Aviation and related Science and develop interest in this discipline. Children also try experimenting with various designs of aeroplanes,



parachutes etc to understand the flying mechanics. Model rocketry workshops are also organised by this section.

Computer



Computer is a very popular activity which attracts children in large number. Children learn basics of computer language and also learn to do programming. Children are provided with software along with computer games. This activity is supplementary to their school education. Internet knowledge is also given by National Bal Bhavan to the children so that they may be well versed with latest system. A number of useful workshops and seminars are also conducted on new systems and procedures. Children learn

photoshop and digital printing techniques. Cyber Security awareness is spread for safety of children and is a regular feature of the section.

Environment

Harit Vahini campaign was started on 19 November, 1986 to indulge children into the mainstream environmental consciousness and activism. Environment Section was created for the implementation of this campaign. This section has grown over the years by expanding the scope of awareness about the most important issues of environment. The section through its hands on activities, field work and project work creates interest in environment amongst children. Ample importance is given to Environment Science and



Nature for preservation of natural resources along with preservation of culture, art & craft, folk art and literature, historical monuments etc. Rain Water Harvesting and solar power related projects are given special attention. In addition to it many projects related to Environment are undertaken and children are taught through field visits, surveys, waste recycling etc. To reach out to maximum member of children and create maximum awareness, a National Conference of Young Environmentalist" is being organized since 1990. Children from different parts of the country participate in this meet and interact on various aspects of environment and discuss the social, emotional and cultural part of this.

Astronomy

The Sky above holds unknown milky ways having various unsolved mysteries. People are striving to solve these mysteries from time immemorial. A lowcost astronomical unit has been established in Bal Bhavan. Children enjoy activities in this section. They remain curious to have more and more information about stars and sky above. In the past years Astronomy Section conducted Telescope making workshops for Delhi school children and at an International level for SAARC countries.

Aquarium and activities related to animal corner

Children get basic information about zoology and animals in this section. This section organises workshops related to "Make your own aquarium" and provide information about animals. Children get information regarding the concepts of adaptations, viscosity, marine life, aquatic plants, etc. and learn morphology, food habits and habitations etc. of pet animals.

LIBRARY ACTIVITIES

National Bal Bhavan has a library with a large number of interesting books for children. These books are on Art, Craft, culture, Science, Mathematics, Mass media, computers, stories, fiction and poetry etc., along with a reference section. Books in Hindi, English, Urdu, Tamil and Bangla languages are also in the library. Various journals, magazines are also available in the library. Apart from reading activity this section also organises activities on creative writing for children.



PHOTOGRAPHY

In National Bal Bhavan children are acquainted with various aspects of photography such as history of photography, basics of camera, digital camera and technique of handling a digital camera for clicking photos of various themes like nature, portrait, model, project, Industry etc. Importance of light, natural light and time of clicking photos is an integral part of teaching photography. Children take photo of people, animal, birds, their habits, various movements, people living in different habitats and their life styles. Children are learning to make Coffee Table book using Photoshop techniques.





Videography classes and workshops are also conducted by this section. Where children prepare video programmes. Team of Children perform activities such as script writing, camera handling, dialogue, and voice recording to film production under the supervision of their Instructor. Photography section also organises exhibition of the photos on various themes covered by children to motivate them. The section also organises specific photography courses for adults.

Main attractions of this section are:

- Digital Photography
- Photoshop techniques for digital enhancement.
- Field visits and heritage walks to take pictures of nature, monuments etc. and making a photo journal.
- Photo exhibition and display is also done towards the end of a training programme
- Photography training programme is also organised for adults.

Performing Arts

Performing Art provides opportunity to children to develop their imagination with the help of various activities and translate it into action to recognize their talent. Children learn Dance, Drama, Music, Instrumental Music, Vocal music etc. Children also acquaint with traditional folk music and dance of different cultures.

Performing Art Section consists of the following Sub-sections:

- Vocal Music (classical & folk)
- Instrumental Music (percussion and string instruments of Indian origin)
- Classical Dance (Kathak, Bharatnatyam)
- Folk Dance
- Drama











PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Sports and physical activities are favourite of children of all age groups. National Bal Bhavan provides various type of sports activities to children such as: Table Tennis, Badminton, Football, Cricket, Basket Ball, Judo and Skating etc. It has its own Gymnasium for exercise. Children not only get information related to these sports but are also encouraged to develop their own creative and interesting games.

Judo has added many proud moments for this institution. National Bal Bhavan has had the privilege to train such children who have proved themselves not only at National, but international level also. Physical Education Section conducts inter school tournament in which children of various schools and institutions actively participate and enjoy.







Skating is also very popular among children and perhaps National Bal Bhavan has one of the best skating rinks in Delhi. Physical Education Section also organize inter school cricket and Foot Ball competitions in Bal Bhavan and children of various schools participate in competitions and enjoy it. National Bal Bhavan's play ground and Physical Education Section are also made available to member schools of National Bal Bhavan. This section also arrange adventures camps, trekking and other field trips as well. Creative games are also organised for children from time to time.

Main attractions of this section are as under:

- Indoor & Outdoor sports (Table Tennis, Badminton, Cricket, Basket Ball)

HOME MANAGEMENT

Children are acquainted with good and smooth home management by this section. In this section

children try their hand on varieties of dishes. They learn cooking of nutritious and healthy foods so that they may be self reliant. Children are taught how to prepare budget of kitchen and estimation. Regular discussions are held with children about Health & Hygiene and Cleanliness which is useful for them. Various workshops are organized like Flower Arrangement (Ikebana), Bakery products etc.

Museum Techniques

National Children Museum of National Bal Bhavan organises theme based exhibition on various occasions and enhances knowledge of children. This is a unique Children's Museum in India. It has permanent exhibition galleries and thousands of children visit the same and these exhibitions supplement and complement the school education curriculum. Another activity of National Children Museum is "Museum Technique Club" which demonstrate techniques of preparing Clay and "Cast" replica from plaster of Paris and children are taught from simple techniques to specific work such as "Piece Mould". In this section children are also taught mounting, script writing and technique for arranging exhibitions etc. Children undergo experience which enhances their knowledge about nature, history, culture, science and technology. Children are educated about our ancient civilization, our history, its ancient heritage and culture as well. Children visit excavation sites to have direct and first hand experience. Special workshops are conducted for children and their visits are also arranged to various historical monuments.



Main attraction of this section are as under:

- Moulding and casting
- Designing Exhibitions
- Historical and Cultural Interactions.
- Preservation and conservation of Museum objects.
- Field work

Publication Related Activities

Publication related activities are conducted during Summer Fiesta. This is a unique programme conducted to enlighten children through publication related activities and by publishing of a Magazine, Newsletter and a special News paper 'Akkad-Bakkar Times' involving children in its editing, sketching and production. In this activity children not only bring out newspaper and journals but also acquaint themselves with various techniques which inculcate creativity and self reliance. Children are taken to



various Publication Groups and News Channel Offices. In addition, this section organizes workshops on various subjects such as Sketching of Books, Book Production, Preparation of an Advertisement and Designs etc so that they may have knowledge of various aspects of publication.



National Children's Museum

National Children Museum is an integral part of National Bal Bhavan which has been designed in line with the psychology of growing children and their curiosity of viewing and looking at the world around them. Museum has a rich collection of precious objects which include Toys from other countries, Stone & Metal objects/items, traditional ornaments, pots and utensils, art and craft items, Instrument, turbans/headgears, aircraft, satellite and information related to historical monuments. National Children Museum is the only institution which enjoys the status of being a National Level Children Museum. National Children Museum advocates this fact that children's museum is an important source for developing the knowledge of children.

Various exhibitions are arranged in different galleries of this museum, first permanent exhibition and other one is temporary exhibition. One of the galleries of the museum is reserved for temporary exhibition, where exhibitions are organised on a special subjects and special themes.

Permanent exhibition in the museum has a special attraction "Hamara Bharat" is a prominent one (spread over in 8500 sq.ft.) and it displays lifestyle of Indian people, their live culture, rich art and craft, diversity of religion and costumes, progress in science and technology which draws the attention of the viewers and visitors, Gaurav Gatha (spread over in 1855 sq. ft. area) depicts the era of golden past, its culture, wars etc. which has been arranged in chronological order. Surya Gallery (spread over in more than 8000 sq.ft. area) in which importance of "Surya" is outlined along with civilization of Egypt Mesopotamia, China, Greek etc and place and importance of Surya in their civilization is depicted. Origin of surya i.e. the planet and Earth etc. is also shown here, in the other words: presentation of Surya is depicted from both mythological and scientific point of view. Traditional Art and Craft gallery: Treasure for the future generation (spread over in 1700 sq.ft. area) exhibition displays art work of renowned artists. All these exhibition are open for the public.



National Training Resource Centre

Aims and objective of NTRC is to provide integrated training to teachers and adults by Creative methodology and participation in Creative Art, Performing Art and Science activities. Proposals for Training in Physical Education, sports, Library activities are also under consideration. It has been felt that the work and performance of children be given recognition and this can be achieved by training teachers in creativity.

With the help of various media and creative methods, National Bal Bhavan encourages teachers to recognize the sustained imagination and thought process of children, their creative expression, innovation and capacity of originality and thereby enhancing their capability. Talks and demonstration are arranged for rural, semi rural and urban teachers/instructors to make the art as a powerful medium of expression and imparting education.





Detailed Report

All the instructions given by the Ministry of Home Affairs were followed during the Covid-19 period.

All weekly plans and video links made available on the website nationalbalbhavan.nic.in. All the activity trainers have submitted weekly plans which were uploaded on YouTube, Facebook and National Bal Bhavan website. The member children also interacted with the trainers on WhatsApp or on verbal calls.

Based on the MHA guidelines as per the instructions received from the above authority - all the employees were instructed to follow the rules to contain and prevent the spread of COVID-19, which were followed by the employees.

Activity staff of National Bal Bhavan, Jawahar Bal Bhawan Mandi and Bal Bhavan Kendras worked from home as per the directions.

During Lockdown 1.0 (1st April to 17th April 2020)

Activity sections were closed and all activity staff were informed by NBB officials to work from home and make virtual creative activities for children. Efforts were made by some staff and they created very good videos for children, some interacted with the children and some have posted written content.

Activity staff instructed to design/suggest creative activities for children. Some teachers have posted activities on WhatsApp and facebook for children. Aquarium and Animal Corner, Photography, Home Management (JBB, Mandi), Computers etc.

LOCKDOWN 2.0 (18TH APRIL TO 30TH APRIL 2020)

Directions were given by the Competent Authority to all Activity staff that a Weekly Plan be made by each and may be uploaded on the Website. They also prepared online videos, ppts, write-ups, Interaction with children. A virtual tour of the Jute Exhibition had been added on the Website.

All staff had downloaded the Aarogya Setu App (who have compatible mobiles). Work from home was being regularly monitored.

MAY, 2020

Dated 01.05.2020 Activity sections of NBB during this period of pandemic, came up as the hope for children encouragement programmes through motivational videos and educational programmes from home as well as office. These videos were uploaded at NBB YouTube channel as well as instructors cooperated with children through video chats and calls and Roster of duties of staff on 50% attendance on alternative days had been circulated and followed



accordingly. (Activity, Administration and Accounts). Staff had been instructed to follow all mandatory directions to remain safe and keep others safe. NBB had received tremendous response from the regular students as well as non-regular students.

Photography section taught the children Rules of Composition, Strong points, Leading

Photo editing, Image size and convert to jpg and other formats, Colour correction, Storage of data, Creating photo library, Use of Mobile Camera - Rules of composition, Using window light for portrait, Available light Table Top, Using reflector with available things, Using Artificial light available at home, Example of Shutter speed, Example of Aperture, Example intersection of threes, Example of comparative statement in photography, Example of diving frame.



Clay section shared the information that how to make Swan making from vegetable/fruits, Peacock making from vegetable / fruits, Boat making from vegetable / fruits, Vegetable basket, Bouquet of roses, Making Lion from vegetables, Making Hut from vegetables, Making Face of joker from vegetables, Making Mother and child from vegetables, Making Deer from vegetables, On the basis of nature every type of animal, bird, human face etc. will be made, Make sculpture based on sea creatures like any type of fish, turtle, snail etc. from clay.




Tabla - To inform the student about performing arts, their types and music. To tell about music, rhythm, taal, chhad, quantity, department, tali khaali qaida, palta laggi etc. To make the student acquainted with the rich history of tabla, its making and about the artists. Taught the student to hold the tabla, sit the tabla and to place the child's fingers on the tabla correctly. To acquaint the student about the different parts of tabla, right, dangga, edge, flame, ink, ground, *gudri*, *gitte*, *baddi* and *gajra*. Taught children to play the initial words of tabla like:- *Gay*, *Dhe*, *Na*, *Ta*, *Dha*, etc. Taught children the use of all these fingers respectively the thumb, index finger, middle finger, ring finger and little finger. Taught children the initial phases of practice like: *Dhe*, *Dhe*, *Na*, *Na*, *Dha* etc. After a good rhythm in the elementary children, the student should do the initial practice of some difficult words like:- *Tirkit*, *Kal*, *Kanta*, *Tuna* etc. After a good practice of the words, the student should



start making rhythm. The first and foremost thing in tabla is the three talas. The student should first learn this rhythm.

Library - Wrote an article about changes in life after lockdown, created a story based on corona situation, Essay on the topic corona-Covid 19: its effects on society, Wrote a poem in humorous way telling about corona effects on our lifestyle and society, Wrote a Slogan to spread awareness and for prevention from covid 19.

Museum section made videos and PPTs on various topics like - Under the program 'Celebrate World Heritage Day' by the museum section, the importance of our earth and our natural resources was told to the children through creative activities. In addition to story sessions and artistic activities based on moral values, children were made aware of the rich cultural diversity of our clothes by linking them with festivals and traditions, as well as warping activities. The importance of 'humankind and agriculture' in human life, festivals related to agriculture, methods of food production, farming and its equipment, animal husbandry etc. were explained through activities. The program 'Let's go into the past - Indus Valley Civilization' was followed by activities about the city, architecture, townplanning art, culture, cuisine, transportation, systems etc of the Indus civilization. In the program 'Come play and learn about plants', life cycle of plants, herbarium making, interesting facts about trees and plants were made aware and artistic activities were done. The children were given art craft performances, which had become popular during that civilization in a play way. Children were made aware about agriculture and food. Children were given information about their culture such as religion, writing system, burial system, trade and risk of transport etc. The museum introduction to the need and methods of obtaining food followed by the activity. The children were given information about the crops to be raised according to the season. Children were given information about farming, its types and tools to be used. Made aware about animal husbandry and its importance in our country, told about crops and festivals in India with interesting facts related to children, introduction about the functions of plants and their parts, an interesting activity was organized in which children were given information on how different types of plants make food. The children were made aware of the Harbarium Technique.

INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY

On the occasion of the **International Yoga Day** 21st June 2020 Instructors of the Physical Education Centre of NBB, Museum and JBB Mandi shared meditation and yogic exercises . Activities were also shared by part time instructors of Bal Bhavan Kendra. Same day the Annular Solar eclipse was also observed. The Astronomy Section and How and Why section made children aware of the eclipse.

June, 2020

Vocal Music section taught children sargam, alankar, tal, laya, types of laya, dadra geet, song based on environment, languages used in folk music, Maand, Jhoola, Kajri, self making of alankar as well as how to make songs. Students of the vocal section created some songs theme 'Bal', where more than 40 children contributed and participated.

Bharatanatyam section taught 'tat tai ta ha' adavu's footwork & hand movements, neck and head movements, introduction of various musical instruments used in Bharatanatyam, pancha nadai or thatti mettu adavu, 'Ganesh kauthuvam' dance etc.

Painting section introduced various paintings as well as art forms through videos like marble texture painting, Sanjhi Art, poster color painting, straw painting demonstration, comb 'kanga' painting demonstration, glass painting demonstration and Bhil Art or Tribal Art, where we received positive response from the students of pointing out so

where we received positive response from the students of painting art section.

Clay section taught children how to make lion, bear, monkey, wild elephant, cheetah, eagle, duck, peacock, parrot, sparrow made with raw mango, squirrel, Deer & man, cat, elephant & man, dog & puppy, as well as various cartoon characters from the available material at home.

Tutorials on Jute introduction, Jute basket weaving, Jute handbag weaving, Jute-box weaving, woven jute flower basket, History of tribal weaving in India covering Tripura, Chhattisgarh, Nagaland and Assam; Woven Greeting cards, woven mat style, woven heart shape, woven net floral, woven dress greeting cards; woven bracelet, necklace, hair band, mobile case, heart shape hair clip, and woven paper fish was introduced to children by **Weaving section**.



Wood craft section taught various activities like making flowers from ice-cream sticks, paintings by waste wood, wood toys, carving on wood, introduction of inlay work, how to make inlay painting, design in wood inlay, wood dust painting, how to create frames, etc. through videos.

Handicraft section created videos of how to make paper fish, dog face, umbrella, rose, paper frog, earrings, doll, paper basket, newspaper bag, Envelope, origami star, Butterfly, wall hanging, emoji magic card, tree collage, Warli collage, Ganesh collage, cardboard box, hut hanging, elephant hanging and flower.

Children of the **Stitchery section** created various objects at home through videos prepared by the Instructor. These videos contained various topics covering waste materials as well as materials available at home like hand gloves from old shirts, mirror work, kantha stitches, Mini coin pouch, Macramé knots, friendship bands, sanitizer bottle



holder, stitches on Plastic waste couch, tulip flower, Chikankari or shadow work, Fabric bow, hair bands, fitted face mask, Sindhi kadai, tassel earrings, finger puppets, pincushion, potli bag, wool flower, appliqué or patch work, Kashida embroidery and blanket stitches.

Online videos of essentials of photography, tutorials on different subjects of photography like portrait photography, bird photography, flower photography, landscape and nature photography were done by the **photography section**.

Astronomy section created videos on topics like Universe, Kaleidoscope making, The Earth, Layers of Atmosphere, model-making of Chandrayaan-2, ISRO, simple Periscope making, ADITYA L-1 (Part -1 &2), Phase of moon, India's Rocket-PSLV & GSLV, India's 1st Satellite-ARYABHATTA, 1st ROHINI Satellite- ROHINI RS-1, Satellite INSAT-1A, solar eclipse, summer solstice, Chandrayaan-1 mission, Mars Orbiter Mission Mangalyaan (Part-1&2), Upcoming mission GAGANYAAN, Betelgeuse Supernova 2022.

Environment section where children took 13 videos and 4 online classes. Children learnt about the different scientific principles. They learnt about the cyclone and storm formation, reflection and refraction of lights, illusion of eye, stamp making, water absorption in plants, measuring of rain water, climbing toy, wind vane-how instrument show the direction of airflow. On 5th June children celebrated World Environment Day through various activities. Through these activities children understand different scientific phenomena and work on different scientific instruments.



Computer section took shared information on making a PDF document, Google form etc.

Museum section put up powerpoint presentations on Rocks, Our Cultural Heritage and Environment, World of Puppets and our Sun.

JULY, 2020

The Vocal Music section taught children different types of song and introduction of Abhang, abhang with taal, Bharud, Thumri, bhaav in thumri, Dadra, Bhajan etc. as well as how to make songs. Students of the vocal section practiced online and more than 40 children contributed and participated.

Whereas Bharatanatyam section taught 'nritta, nritya, and natya', footwork of 3rd & 4th *'paichal' adavu*, four types of abhinaya, ganesh kauthuvam, hand movements of 3rd & 4th *'paichal'* adavu navrasa, sep taltala, Tai tai tatt ta neck and head movements, introduction of importance of 'margam or sequence' in Bharatanatyam. Teermanamadavu footwork, pataka hasta viniyoga, Teermanamadavu hand movement and second half of pataka hasta viniyoga, was also taught.

Folk dance covered activities like fisher folk, footwork's, Rajasthani folk, Lavani and different foot and hand movements.

Painting section introduced various paintings as well as art forms through videos, where we received positive response from the students of the painting art section.

Clay section taught children how to make animals living in Iceland's with clay, as well as various characters from the available material at home.

Museum section made videos and PPTs on various topics like Our Heritage: Gifts from Past with main focus on Intangible Cultural Heritage like festivals, rituals, traditional art, folk dances etc. and how intangible cultural heritage can be preserved by museums were taught in a creative manner. In 'The story of Indian Money', the development of Indian currency, ticks in Numis, etc. were told from the point of view of a museum. In the programme 'Houses and their designs' the methods of designing



houses from ancient times till now, architecture, role of museum in saving these heritage etc. In 'Museums- Treasure Houses of our Glorious Past' the types of museums and their importance children were told in an interesting way.

Tutorials on weaving, was introduced to children by Weaving section on various topics like decorative, woven ball, woven paper turtle, optical illusion paper weaving, magic woven card, introduction of fibers like cotton, silk, linen, jute, wool, single ribbon woven lace, double ribbon woven lace, four ribbon woven lace, ribbon woven star and wand, Loop woven flower rakhi, woven floral Rakhi, braid woven Rakhi, flower woven Rakhi, friendship bands, paper roll woven band National Bal Bhavan, Weaving Section, About Spandex pipe woven friendship band and knot woven friendship band.



Drama section created videos on topics improvisation of drama, voice & speech, eye contact game, history of drama, scene work, classical acting, etc.


Children of the Stitchery section created various objects at home through learning videos prepared by the Instructor. These videos contained various topics covering waste materials as well as materials

Online topics like Microsoft word start, introduction, How to make Macros in Microsoft word, Convert text to table and table to text in Microsoft word, Sum formula in Microsoft word, Microsoft Excel Introduction, Five most using formulas in Excel, Ms Excel Camera Tools, Make Excel file Password protected, Pivot Table in Excel, How to change the case in text in Excel, How to make Data Entry Form in Excel, By using Excel how to use text to speech command,





Computer classification based on work method, Hindi computer Terminology, How to create shutdown icon in Desktop, What is Search Engine Optimization (SEO), How to delete duplicate files in computer, and What is 32 bit and 64 bit Processor covered by **Computer section**.

Environment section where children learnt about the friction, rotocopter, Early man and cave painting, density of different liquids and how we can increases density of water, mangrove forest and its specific characteristics, illusion, hot air rise up, reptile, animals from leaves, lifecycle of butterfly, what are manuscripts and they prepared own manuscripts. One group of children prepared a bottle aquarium and observed fish. 31 students participated.

AUGUST, 2020

the Indian Flag and how many times it has been changed through creative activities, as well as the freedom struggle from the National Children's Museum point of view. Come learn about the traditional dances of India and their classification through activities. In the program 'World of Hills', information about the formation of mountains, their types, Great Himalayas and Himalayan mountain range were provided.

Tutorials on weaving, was introduced to children by Weaving section on various topics like Different types of optical illusion weaving, Independence Day woven card, Woven

tricolour band, Rayon, Nylon, Polyester, Acrylic, Spandex, different types of Loom machines for weaving.

Wood craft section taught various activities like How to make a key ring by wood, How to do framing of painting, How to make a design in wood inlay technique, How to make toys by wood, How to make flower tree by ice cream stick, How to make a painting by waste wood, How to make wood toys by wood, How to do carving in wood, How to make a portrait in wood inlay, How to make a photo frame from wood sticks, how to make alphabet in wood inlay How to make a design in wood inlay technique, Practice of making inlay by children's.

Environment section where children learnt about the Whirling papers snake, Air circulation, Heat capacity-sand versus water, Hair hygrometer Earth atmosphere, Interaction with children, Why stars are not visible in day time?, Why do stars twinkle?, Prepare your own Astrolabe, Structure of sun, Online interaction session with children, Soil pH- online interaction with children, Magic bottle – air pressure, Porosity of Soil, Compost making in jar, Online class on humus formation and mulching of soil, Air released by stomata, Water candle, Soil profile, Pollution catcher, Students will make list of pollutant and its effect on our ecosystem.

Along with this children were taught 'Gushthihast Viniyog and Shikhihast Viniyog'. The first half of the 'Kapitthahasta Viniyog' were taught and the first four 'Tatta Addavu' were practiced. The second half was taught to the 'Kapitthahata Viniyog' and the other four elements, the Addavu and the Katikamukha hast Viniyog, were taught. The first half of 'Suchihast Viniyog' was taught.

Story of Snake and Crow.



Weaving - Tutorials on weaving, was an introduction to children by the Weaving section on various topics like Weaves, Important parts of Handloom Machine, Brief information about Denim (jeans) fabric (Introduction, history, manufacturing etc.)

Photography - Online videos of essentials of photography, regular tutorials on different subjects and subject based tutorials like Product photography, Stage / Dance photography.

OCTOBER, 2020




Tutorials on weaving were introduced to children by the weaving section. Also, maintained handloom items, serviced handloom machines and repaired weaving frames.

There are around 15 villages around Bal Bhawan Mandi as Mangalapuri, Sultanpur Ghitorni Gadaipur, Aya Nagar, Jaunapur, Satbari, Chattarpur, Chandanhola, Fatehpur Beri, Asola Dera village, Bhati Mines Mandi village and some villages of Haryana state along with Gwal Pahari, Baliawas along with many slums, children from thousands of families residing in these take advantage of many creative activities in different sections of Bal Bhavan Mandi every day.

The unique and interesting teaching method of Bal Bhavan sets it apart from the formal education

Unique environment and education system

system. While formal education depends on regular reading and assessment. Bal Bhavan provides its members with a flexible and interesting study environment to suit their needs. For example, for two different children learning painting, it is necessary to first do theoretical studies in formal studies, then it is the turn of practical studies. Whereas in Bal Bhavan, first the child is given practical study or painting

according to his interest and when the child awakens more curiosity about it, then he is made to study that theory in the form of interesting story which was boring earlier. A similar effect happens in technical knowledge too. When children start learning computer, they first have to do a lot of writing work which is usually boring for children. On the contrary, if they give an opportunity to learn and understand through a graphical medium, they will understand more effectively. Along with



this, if somehow the flexible time is given according to their interest, then they learn with full interest at the time they wish with all their heart. Bal Bhavan, Mandi works with rural children on this principle because children in villages and settlements are often busy with their household work. And for them, it is not possible to follow the regular time bound schedule. Therefore in such situation the principle of Bal Bhavan has been formulated in such a way that children from such community coming to learn different activities in Bal Bhavan can choose his/her own time-schedule and proceed the activities without escaping the single class with the help







and support of their respective instructor.

BENEFITS AND REQUIREMENTS

Before establishing an institution or starting a work, we must study its benefits and its basic needs. It is necessary to praise the foresight of its founders regarding Bal Bhavan. At the time when Jawahar Bal Bhavan was established, there were not enough schools available in the country. The situation was similar in the rural areas of Delhi. Most of the population used to live in villages or settlements. Most of the children of the village did not attend school because the school was away from the village and they either played in the streets or helped in the work of farm and stackyard. Bal Bhavan Mandi has done the work of decorating the talent of these children and training them in various disciplines. The evidence of this can be found when we see those old and adults in the surrounding villages, whose third generation has started coming to Bal Bhavan Mandi holding the fingers of their grandparents and they share the activities of their time.

This culture continues even today. Village and slum children including those children who do not go to school due to any reason or who are willing to make good use of their time after school break, they come to Bal Bhavan and enjoy their time in various interesting and entertaining ways and participate in activities.

JAWAHAR BAL BHAVAN, MANDI DURING THE COVID PANDEMIC

The academic year 2020-21 started during the period of Covid pandemic. In this situation Bal Bhavan Mandi continue the activities with the thought of complete responsibility of balancing

the mind-state of the children living away from everyone, in their houses. Activity and administrative staff were instruct to work from home and member children were connected & engaged in various activities through on-line mode. While making good use of the time, it was to be kept away from negative activities and negative thoughts. During this hard time Bal Bhavan Mandi however celebrated Ravindra Jayanti, Christmas, Mandi Day and Environment Day, Gandhi Jayanti, Netaji Subhash Chandra



Bose's birth anniversary, and Parakram Diwas with children by conducting theme based activities with children. Christmas and Mandi Day were also celebrated virtually with children. The trainers constantly connected with the children, not only got the children to do various activities during the entire Corona period, but also taught them how they can learn many useful activities in this by using the time of disaster as an opportunity.

Arts & Crafts Section has been providing technical and practical knowledge of making various types of artifacts to the children by connecting virtually with the children every day. Staying at home with the children, he also got many creative works made by using the materials available in the house and primarily unusable. Similarly, the computer section organized many

informative online classes for the children. Meanwhile, together with the children, by compiling the information shared by them, they were given issue of children's related to corona for newspaper 'Gupchup Mandi Times' which is being published as an e-magazine. Along with the other activities of the Section, the Computer Section has been contributing continuously in the day-to-day office and administrative work of Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi. Various creative activities along with e-classes of children during Corona period, all Hindi work like noting-drafting, office order, circular, duty roster, online



registration form for children, compilation of activity report information, editing videos of all sections, uploading them on the YouTube, updating the blog website, Hindi typing work and compiling the digital magazine of the publication section "Vicharak Bapu aur bachche", and all the Hindi typing work for the children, etc. are being continuously contributed by the Computer Section single handed.

Dance section is providing instructions to all the children through the virtual platform. Along with conferring online training of various dance styles to the students, they are also sharing the theoretical information of dance with the children so that the children might keep increasing their theoretical knowledge along with practical knowledge. Dance was presented after training on Gandhi Jayanti. The favourite bhajan 'Vaishnav Jan To Tene Kahiye' and the

dance based on the life of Bapu were also presented.



The Vocal Section imparted knowledge of various Songs and Ragas to the children through online classes during this pandemic time. On the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti, children memorized the songs taught by the instructor from their respective homes. The children also practiced singing various songs under the supervision of the instructor. However, due to some administrative reasons, at present classes of vocal music, instructors are not available to the children. Detailed information about the activities of instrumental music, sports, publishing and home management etc. is being conferred in the present activity report. During the year 2020-21 so far, a total of 115 children have been registered online for membership, which is increasing in ascending order. Hundreds of children have so far taken advantage of Bal Bhavan Mandi's YouTube channel.

Consequences and Effects

In order to continue the registration of the children, made available the online application form to the

the computer section of Bal Bhavan Mandi made available the online application form to the children which were circulated to the children through WhatsApp, Facebook and website. So far more than 100 children have registered themselves for various activity sections through this platform. It is the result of online classes being run by Bal Bhavan Mandi that children not only attend classes regularly but also in case of non-arrival of class on time, there are various activities

available on WhatsApp group, blog website and YouTube. Taking advantage of the online videos and virtual classes Bal Bhavan Mandi classes were made available. As a result of this, children are able to protect themselves even by staying at home and are also sending requests for classes as per their requirement through phone to their instructors. In response, children are also sharing their own experiences through similar medium by learning the activities being taught in activities like art-craft, dance, music, house-management etc.



The effect of this online training is that children have become busier in practicing and generating questions from their homes. As a result they are spared from any bad company and are able to remain mentally alert and focused as ••• well as happy.

Arts & Crafts Section

The Arts & Crafts Section of Jawahar Bal Bhavan Mandi played a vital role in keeping the children engaged in a fun and creative way during the Corona pandemic. Classes were organized

regularly by the Arts Section with the children regularly. Children enthusiastically participated in all classes and activities. The Art & Crafts Section made beautiful artworks by themselves and also shared the photographs. On various festive occasions such as Gandhi Jayanti, Rabindra Nath Tagore Jayanti, Parakram Diwas (Jayanti of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose), children were encouraged to present their art-work in the classrooms along with studies.

Some of these attractions were painting of mixed medium from unusable materials available at home, making

flowers from newspaper, portrait of Rabindranath Tagore, paper mesh, sculpture made from aluminium foil etc. On Rabindra Jayanti, children were made to paint on poems composed by them, portray their personality and write poems.

Children were locked in their homes during the summer session due to pandemic. So activities



were done according to the environment. Such as painting of summer fruits, introduced to the art of Kalamkari and were taught through extensive practice.

The detailed information about the activities carried out is attached as an appendix at the end of the report.

Home Management Section

Home Management Section taught various delicious food preparation methods to the children throughout the year and made them understand the importance of nutrition along with nutritious food. In times of illness, where children were getting limited options to eat, the home management section of Bal Bhavan Mandi taught them to prepare various nutritious foods in a more palatable way. Children took advantage of the information provided during the activities, cooked dishes themselves at their home and shared their photos and videos. Some of the children also made other culinary items of their choice like cakes, biscuits etc. and photos on the pertaining topics

and shared the videos so that other children can also learn the method of cooking those dishes. The detailed information about the activities carried out is attached herewith as an appendix with the report.





The dance section regularly conducted online classes with the children throughout the year. During this, the children were not only provided technical education, but they were also provided theoretical knowledge related to the art of dance. The children continued the practice and in pertaining to this and shared various



presentations in the form of videos through mobile from their home. During this time, training of Bharatnatyam, Folk Dance and other Regional Dances was made available online to the children. Apart from this, on various occasions/festivals like special dance performance on the occasion of Rabindranath Tagore Jayanti, Aadhaar presentation on Gandhiji's favourite songs on the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti, dance performance on the occasion of Deepawali etc. were



performed and shared online. The detailed information about the activities carried out is attached herewith as an appendix with the report.

Instrumental Music Section

The instrumental music section organized classes regularly to educate the children about the various rhythms during this


period. In the absence of instruments, how to practice Taal using material available in our home and how we can find the rhythm in any sound. For example, trying to get the children to harmonize with a song of a movie by identifying its characters.

During this type of creative experiments, the instrumental music section conducted online classes. Children liked this type of experiments very much and as a result of this, children took part in online classes of instrumental music by showing their interest and shared their videos through WhatsApp and which were also uploaded on the YouTube and blog website of Bal Bhavan Mandi through the computer section so that more children also get inspiration and learn this performing art. The detailed information about the activities carried out is attached herewith as an appendix with the report.

Vocal Section

The vocal section encouraged the children to stay focused and use their energy positively through music in the time of this pandemic. In the regular classes, the children were provided the knowledge of songs, sura and taal. On various festivals, on patriotism and on many such occasions and on the occasion of Rabindra Jayanti, children were introduced to Rabindra Sangeet and Kabir songs were taught to them. The children shared the videos of the song composed by them on Rabindra Jayanti. Children were introduced to the practical knowledge of music as well as its theoretical knowledge, in which knowledge of musical method, vocals method etc. ere shared. A small online knowledge test of children was also conducted.

Using these classes, children learned to sing not only songs but also hymns etc. in a melodious



manner. In these classes, children also got the knowledge of Rabindra Sangeet of Rabindranath Tagore and presented it as well. The instructor wrote and composed the songs on many occasions and got the children to perform the songs by getting them memorized. In this direction, the song composed by him on Gandhi Jayanti was a special attraction, which was written and composed and performed by the children.



Publication Section

Recently, the Publication Section got transferred from National Bal Bhavan to Jawahar Bal Bhavan, Mandi has organized several creative activities for the children and also got virtually connected through Facebook and WhatsApp groups. The Publication Section has also published an e-edition of a digital e-magazine, the Corona special issue of e-bal newspaper Akkad-Bakkar Times, *Corona Darona* Times and a booklet - "Animals Played Basketball". "When animals played basket ball" was prepared and supported by the children too of the Publication Division which was released by respected Former President of India Dr.



A.P.J. Abdul Kalam Ji in the year 2013 and it was also signed by him. In the e-newspaper "Corona Darona Times" the former members of Bal Bhavan i.e. Balshree honored children and State Bal Bhavan's children had also contributed their best. On the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti, an unique activity was performed with the publication of e-magazine which was based on the moral values and teachings of Mahatma Gandhi. In this, not only the children of Bal Bhavan Mandi, but also the children of State Bal Bhavans, Balshree Awardee children, alumni member children has contributed and sent their entries. This is the first magazine of its kind. In which writing skill, dance, song, animation and instrumental music were presented. The theme of this

e-magazine was "Vichaarak Bapu Aur Bachche".



Apart from this, children were involved in several activities like use of oil pastel colors, cartoon making, greeting cards, notepad making, elements of story review and book review, digital poster making, news writing (radio and TV), hand drawing, water colours in general, experimental techniques, letter press and offset printing, mixed art, bookmark making, poster color painting, copywriting orientation, thumb painting etc.

Computer Section

The Computer Section has continuously provided online classes to

the children. Due to the arrival of sudden disaster children's were taught that how to use this time as an opportunity. They were constantly explained about the use of time and sudden disaster as an opportunity. Along with the virtual training of operating the basic computer, the instructor helped the children to realize their imaginations by live discussion, where children's newspaper Gupchup Mandi Times Special 'Corona edition' was published during this period which was fully contributed by children as the first digital magazine, which



was produced by the Publications Section. Along with providing classes to the children, the computer section tried to answer to all the questions asked by children related to the classes and others issues/topics keeping in view of the current situation. A digital calendar has also been created for the growth of children's imaginations and ideas.

The computer section of Bal Bhavan Mandi is not only a section of various activities but this section runs the blog website of Bal Bhavan Mandi, takes the responsibility of properly editing the audio-videos of the classes of all the sections to reach the children, daily office work. This section sincerely supports the Bal Bhavan, Mandi and help in all technical services, emergency situation, basic maintenance of CCTV, maintenance of all computer equipments, maintenance of sanitizer machines, networking, phone etc. Due to the situation in the rural area, it is very difficult to get any kind of technical service immediately in Bal Bhavan Mandi. Therefore it is quite understood that in such a situation, the computer section is truly playing a vital role.

Physical Education Section


The physical education section was connected with the children on WhatsApp to teach them different interesting movements so that they might keep themselves healthy in a fun and enjoyable manner by escaping from loneliness with the support of constant sports and good health so that they could channelize their energy properly even in solitude, avoiding negative thoughts by using it in positive direction.

MANDI DAY

On 3rd February 2021, Bal Bhavan Mandi organized its foundation day. In the restricted circumstances of the Corona epidemic, the program of this day was organized completely online. Children participated in it from their respective homes where children performed various performances from their homes such as: singing of songs, presentation of instrumental music and most interestingly, Mandi Geet presented by the student after a very small period of training organized by their respective Art Trainer. Apart from this, a motion picture presentation was made by the arts and crafts instructor in which various



forms of Bal Bhavan and the work done by the children during the lockdown were presented. The children liked this virtually



Reports received form the concerned states

Detailed report of the following programs throughout the year, received from Bal Bhavan's

1. Kilkari Bihar Bal Bhavan

This year, despite the corona epidemic and lockdown, online training was conducted in about 18 groups. Through other programs, 5000 children were benefitted from Kilkari, Patna, Gaya, Bhagalpur, and Darbhanga. A radio program named Fbal Kilkariye is being broadcast from 24th April 2020. Children are trying to make the nature around them sensitive to the animals of the community. 44 points broadcast so far has been carried out.

'Let's Laugh' Comedy Show

A comedy show by the team of senior children of Kilkari by the name of 'Chalo Hanste Hain' (Let's Laugh) is being telecasted on a YouTube channel to relieve the mental stress of the children.

Summer Camp

Online Summer Camp was organized from 01 to 15 June 2020. In the camp, children were trained in 50 activities in 17 subjects, in which a total of 1500 children including 500 outsiders from 36 other states were benefitted.

Special attraction

The children interacted with the District Magistrate, Patna through the Bal Kilkari radio program. Inspirational speakers were:

- 1. Brahma Kumaris has arrange an online session of Jyoti Behen with children.
- 2. Online interaction of children with Mr. Amarendra Kumar.
- 3. Anand Kumar, Founder Super-30, had interaction with children over Inspiring careers.

Children's Day

November 14, 2020 Children's Day program was organized online. All children did various activities in their homes and sent a video of it. It was consolidated into a video and sent to the children.

Kavi Sammalen (Poet convention)

On the occasion of Education Day, a *Kavi Sammalen* (Poet convention) was organized with senior-child poets, where children recited sensitive and humorous poems on subjects like their teacher, nature, environment, cowshed, etc.

On 18th December 2020, the Bal Kavi Sammelan was live on Facebook on the topic of child rights, where the children talked about the rights of the children and raised their voice for children's rights.

Radio broadcast program

How children could remain happy and mentally healthy as well as creative while their stay at home during the time of the Covid19 pandemic, for this purpose, a radio program is being broadcast by Kilkari Bal Bhavan to reach out to the children of villages as well as the urban areas of Bihar, to stage their creativity, to talk on the issues related to children and their ideology.

Kilkari E-Publication

In the financial year 2020-21, children were given the facility of e-publication through the Kilkari website so that children can read interesting and inspiring materialist things while their stay at home, and could maintain their creativity:-

- 1. E-publication was done from April for Bal Kilkari Monthly Magazine.
- 2. Books published by Kilkari Bal Bhavan are available in the form of e-books.

Butterfly garden




2. DISTRICT CHILD WELFARE COUNCIL, BAL BHAVAN HISAR

This year, online training was given despite the corona epidemic and lockdown. Masks were prepared by the sewing-embroidery teacher and 10,000 masks, sanitizers, and handwashing soap were distributed to needy and poor children in slums. Awareness was raised to protect children from the corona.

Competitions were organized during the lockdown like:-

- Solo Anthem Competition: (for children in three age groups 3 to 5, 6 to 10, and 11 to 14 years)
- Dance Competition: (for children in three age groups 3 to 5, 6 to 10, and 11 to 14 years)
- Speech Competition: (for children in two age groups 6 to 10, and 11 to 14 years)
- Poetry Competition: (for children in two age groups 3 to 5, and 6 to 10 years)
- Essay writing competition: (for children in two age groups 6 to 10, and 11 to 14 years)
- Story Competition: (for children in two age groups 3 to 5, and 6 to 10 years)
- Competition for use of unusable items: (for children in the age group of 11 to 14)
- Mimicry Competition: (for children in two age groups 6 to 10, and 11 to 14 years)





The first winner of all the above competitions was awarded cash Rs.500/-, prize, the second winner was given cash Rs.300/-, prize, the third winner was given cash 200/-, prize and consolation prize winner was awarded cash Rs.100/-.

To prevent 9 orphaned children from corona infection, staff was deployed for 24-hours for the care of children as well as the assistants working in the center, and medical health checkups were also done from time to time.

Due to the impact of Covid-19 infection from July 2020 to September 2020; the teachers were received online training by psychiatrists and educationists so that the teachers could encourage the children.

The slum children were trained by the evening teacher and awareness programs to save the children were conducted. Masks, soaps, and sanitizers were distributed in the slum areas.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Accounts

- a. The Financial Statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention and generally on the accrual method of accounting unless otherwise stated.
- b. Separate set of accounts are maintained by the National Bal Bhavan in respect of Main A/c, GPF & NPS activities and Internally Generated Funds.
- c. All Receipts on account of fees/subscription and refund of unspent grants are accounted on receipts basis.

2. Grants-in-Aid

Grants are recognized on receipt basis & taken to credit of Income & Expenditure account except to the extent of expenditure of capital nature incurred (which amount is credited directly to the capital fund).

3. Fixed assets and Depreciations

- a. Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition less depreciation. Fixed assets received as Gifts by the National Bal Bhavan has been merged with the Fixed Assets of the Society. Books received as Gifts are valued at selling price.
- b. Receipts, if any, on the sale of obsolete/unserviceable assets is taken as income under the head 'Misc Receipts'.

4. Depreciation

- 4.1 During this year depreciation has been charged on Straight line method at the prescribed rate as provided in new format for standardization of accounts issued by MHRD.
- 4.2 In respect of additions to fixed assets during the year, depreciation is provided for full year and in respect of deductions from the fixed assets, no depreciation is charged.

5. Specific Expenses/ Payments

a. Printing & Stationery

The amount spent for printing & stationery, is treated as expenditure as and when incurred. No adjustments are made in accounts for the closing stocks, as the value is not determinable.

b. Telephone Deposit

Deposit for telephone and allied facilities is written off during the year of installation/commissioning and charges/ expenditure bills are accounted for at the net value.

6. Interest on All Deposits / Investments is accounted for on accrual basis.

7. Employees Salaries / Benefits

- a. Central Government Employees service rules are by and large, made applicable to the employees of the National Bal Bhavan.
- b. Retirement benefits are accounted for on the basis of Actuarial Valuation done by approved valuer as per Accounting Standard 15.
- c. The NBB maintains a separate Notified Provident Fund account for its employees.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

- 1. Grant received from Government, based on budget approved by the Parliament, constitute main source of receipts of the NBB. Though the grants received (after the adjustment of expenditure of capital nature) are taken to income and expenditure account, the effective income of the NBB is nil in the light of restrictions that without sanction of Government, the unspent balance of Grants cannot be carried over from one financial year to another. Thus this does not attract any Income tax liability.
- 2. Expenditure on Establishment, Printing and Stationery and Telephone deposits have been given the accounting treatment as per accounting policy.
- 3. An amount of Rs 56.40 lakhs has been shown as Assistance to State in Schedule-8 (Loans, Advances & Deposits) which were outstanding as on 31.03.2020 due to Non receipt of Utilization Certificates from the State Bal Bhavans.
- 4. An advance of Rs. 1.60 lakhs has been shown as recoverable from DTC (previous year Rs 1.60 lakhs). Out of total advance of Rs 40.80 Lakhs given to DTC, an amount of Rs 39.20 Lakhs has already been settled with them in the previous years. As informed to us, the balance amount of Rs 1.60 Lakhs is not recoverable, so we suggest that the same should be written off in the Books of Accounts.
- 5. An advance of Rs 415.82 lakhs has been paid to CPWD as per Schedule-8 (Loans, Advances & Deposits) upto 31.03.2021 (previous year Rs 528.52 lakhs).
- 6. During the current year, Prior period Income of Rs 4,344 & Prior Period expenses of Rs 133,03,358/- has been booked.
- 7. NBB has received funds from MSJE in previous years for special project. Unspent balance amounting to Rs 48,85,761/- (Previous Year is Rs 47,42,231/-) along with interest up to 31.03.2021 is lying with NBB's Canara Bank Account for this Project. Provision has been made in the books for amount payable to MSJE (Including Interest).
- 8. An amount of Rs 8,759 is shown as balance lying with Jammu & Kashmir Bank since long. As informed to us, the Bank Branch was in Kashmir & now it is not traceable. It is suggested to write off the same.
- 9. Sundry Debtors of Rs 3,76,575/- (Schedule-7) remained unrealized and since the balances are outstanding for more than 5 years, it is suggested to write off the balance, in case the same are not recoverable.

- 10. Advances made and shown as recoverable are adjusted to final head of account/recovered on receipt of final bill/receipt from the concerned party/department.
- 11. In the opinion of the Management of NBB, Current Assets Loans and Advances shall have a value on realization in ordinary course of business, at least equal to the amount at which they are stated in the Balance Sheet. Provision has been made for all known liabilities.
- 12. Opening Balances have been verified by the Management and relied on by us.
- 13. Previous year figures have been regrouped wherever considered necessary.
- 14. Figures in the final accounts have been rounded to the nearest rupee.

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of National Bal Bhavan for the year ended 31st March 2021

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of National Bal Bhavan (NBB) as at 31st March, 2021 and Income & Expenditure Account/Receipts & Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 20(1) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971. The audit has been entrusted for the period up to 2022-23. These financial statements are the responsibility of the National Bal Bhavan Management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

- 2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Report/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4. Based on our audit, we report that:
 - (i) We have obtained all the information and explanation, except as stated in the report, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
 - (ii) The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account/Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format prescribed by the Government of India, Ministry of Education, subject to audit comment at Para B.1.
 - (iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the National Bal Bhavan, except as stated in the report, in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
 - (iv) We further report that:
 - A. Balance Sheet
 - A.1 Assets
 - A.1.1 Fixed Assets (Schedule 4) Rs. 6.33 crore

Land and Building should be depicted in the Balance Sheet/Schedule as two separate heads of account. This is being pointed out by audit since 2012-13 but rectification has not been done. This has resulted in incorrect charging of depreciation on land with consequent understatement of Fixed Assets and Capital Fund (Amount not quantifiable).

The Assets register should also show the area of each parcel of land separately as freehold and lease hold.

A.1.2 Loans, Advances & Deposits (Schedule 8) - Rs. 5.15 crore

The above includes advances of Rs. 4.16 crore given to CPWD for various works during the period March 2008 to January 2020. Out of these, works for which advances of Rs. 1.52 crore were given during 2013-14 and 2014-15 had been completed and completion certificate has been received but the adjustment has not been.

For the remaining advances of Rs. 2.64 crore also the work has been completed but the adjustment has not been done for want of completion certificate/account statement.

This has resulted in overstatement of Loans, Advances & Deposits and understatement of Fixed Assets/ Expenditure by Rs. 4.16 crore. This is being pointed out since 2017-18 but no remedial action has been taken.

B. Internal Receipt Account

B.1 Capital Fund (Rs. 451.12 lakh), Current Liabilities (Rs. 0.12 lakh), Fixed Assets (Rs. 33.08 lakh) and Current Assets (Rs. 418.16 lakh including Rs. 239.24 lakh as Bank Balances in saving bank account No. 0158101118475 of Canara Bank and investment of Rs. 160.47 lakh) have been kept outside the main account of National Bal Bhavan. This had been shown separately as accounts of Internally Generated Funds.

The Accounts of internally generated funds (Internal Receipt Accounts) are an integral part of the Accounts of NBB and a consolidated account should be prepared as a whole for the organization to give a complete, true and fair picture of the financial position of NBB. This is also contravention of Format of Accounts prescribed by Ministry of Education which does not provide for any separate account in respect of internally generated funds.

This is being pointed out since 2015-16 but no remedial action has been taken.

C. General

C.1 An investment of Rs. 2.13 lakh was made in Government Securities out of GPF accounts pertaining to the period 1980-83. However, related records were not made available to audit. Similarly, the records of Rs. 16,759 lying at GPO, New Delhi were not furnished to audit. This is being repeatedly pointed out since 2011-12.

NBB replied that the investment was kept in the safe custody of bank. The matter was taken up with the bank and the bank informed that they have not traced the record of this investment & as per instructions of RBI, bank cannot keep records of more than 10 years in their branch. NBB needs to take a decision in this matter and communicate to audit.

- **C.2** NBB Notes to the Account (Schedule 24) indicates that the following amounts are required to be written off:
- An amount of Rs. 1.60 lakh not recoverable from DTC;
- An amount of Rs. 8,759 as balance lying with J&K bank not traceable and
- Sundry Debtors of Rs. 3.76 lakh (Schedule 7) remained unrealized. Adequate Provision for bad and doubtful debts should be made in this regard.

However, NBB has not written off the above amount from the accounts. This is being pointed out since 2017-18 but action has not been taken.

D. Grants-in-aid

National BalBhavan received grant-in-aid of Rs. 1548.23 lakh under recurring grant from Ministry of Education during 2020-21. It had unspent balance of previous year

amounting to Rs. 194.56 lakh (Grant for creation of Capital Assets: Rs. 67.50 lakh and Recurring Grant: Rs. 127.06 lakh). Out of the total funds of Rs.1742.79 lakh, National Bal Bhavan utilized Rs. 1502.58 lakh (Grant for creation of Capital Assets: Rs. 1.72 lakh and Recurring Grant: Rs. 1500.86lakh) leaving a balance of Rs. 240.21 lakh (Grant for creation of Capital Assets: Rs. 65.78 lakh and Recurring Grant: Rs 174.43 lakh) as on 31 March 2021.

E. Management Letter:

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of Director, National Bal Bhavan through a Management Letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

- v Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- vi In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanation given to us, because of the effects of the observations discussed above in the preceding paragraphs, the financial statements, read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report, do not give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India:
 - a. in so far as they relate to the Balance Sheet of the state of affairs of the National Bal Bhavan, Delhi as at 31 March 2021; and
 - b in so far as they relate to the Income and Expenditure Account of the deficit for the year ended on that date.

1. Adequacy of Internal Audit System

• The NBB has no internal audit section/Department of its own. It has also no audit manual. However, all the files related to payments are pre-audited.

2. Adequacy of Internal Control System.

- The internal control of National Bal Bhavan is inadequate due to :
- Non obtaining of utilisation certificates from State Bal Bhavans/Bal Kendras in respect of advances given to them.
- Non adjustment of advances given to CPWD since 2007-08.
- 52 external audit paras were outstanding as on 31.3.2021.
- Non maintenance of accounting manual.
- Non-confirmation of debtors/loans & advances.

3. System of physical verification of Fixed Assets.

 Physical verification of Fixed Assets including Books & Publication was conducted upto March 2021.

4. System of physical verification of inventory.

Physical verification of inventory like stationery and other consumable items was conducted upto March 2021.

5. Regularity in payment of dues.

• As per Accounts, no payment over six months in respect of statutory dues was outstanding as on 31.03.2021.
